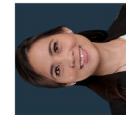

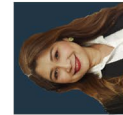

# PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

## Dear Fellow Rotarians and Friends of Rotary

Greetings in Rotary Service! October is a busy month for Rotarians all over as we tackle many advocacies that truly Serve to Change Lives. As for our club, October is extra special month. We had double celebrations - It's our club 25<sup>th</sup> Charter Anniversary, Handover & Induction Ceremonies and Launching of our sponsored Interact Club of Banilad Metro- Science High Cebu too.

One of the major concerns of every successful organization is succession, to ensure continuity in its ongoing projects and affairs in the near and distant future. On this note, October has been an important month in our Club, the Rotary Club of Banilad Metro ("RCBM"). It marks our Club's Silver Jubilee (i.e., 25<sup>th</sup> Charter Anniversary) and the formal Handover and Induction Ceremonies of our Club's new members and officers.

The Ceremony was celebrated not only with pomp and formality, but more importantly with a sense of joy and pride for our Club's history of excellent and dynamic service.

With gratefulness and gladness, the said Ceremony was well-attended by district officers, past presidents, and families and friends of Rotary both personally and digitally (i.e., through Zoom) to accommodate those who could not attend due to restrictions associated with the COVID-19 pandemic.

During the said Ceremony, we honored our past presidents with Rotary commemorative pins for their relentless community service and stewardship in RCBM for the past 25 years. They willingly continue to develop other leaders and share their respective recipes of success.

This, and their selfless dedication and hard work continues to motivate and inspire us.

I and my fellow Rotarians in the Club will make sure that we will discharge the duties and obligations incumbent upon us and become the worthy successors they envision us to be.

Focusing back to our Club, RCBM has organized several activities in October. We conducted the seminar "Anxiety, Depression & Suicide Identification & Interventions", where we invited Dr. Rhiegel "Jay" Tan, a multi-awarded U.S.-based Cebuano professor from University of Nevada Las Vegas, as our resource speaker. Our Club felt that there is a need to highlight the importance of mental health in the public arena in response to the prolonged state of the COVID-19 pandemic with seemingly endless lockdowns and business reverses, and as people continue to adapt and embrace into the new normal. We recognize that this transition to what they call as the "new normal" has been causing a lot of stress, and continues to adversely a person's marriage and relationships both within the family and even in the workplace, a student's learning ability and, in totality, the community as a whole in one way or another. These unprecedented times has strained even our mental health and has driven some of us in the brink of depression, anxiety, and suicide, and embarking steps on how to cope with them is crucial to mental illness prevention and well-being.

On the same date, I was the emcee of the virtual Area 1 4<sup>th</sup> Area Coordination Meeting or ACOM. We wore funny and extravagant headdress to compete for the two sets of 100 USD PolioPlus Contribution prize.

Our Club also continues to train the youth with leadership and camaraderie potential, who will someday succeed us in Rotary. For this purpose, our Club sponsored the Interact Club of Banilad Metro – Science High Cebu, where we mold them as Interactors and imbue on them the spirit of community service and the values of Rotary. We formally inducted last October 14, 2021 one hundred five (105) promising young leaders, which is quite a huge number for a first-time participation. On the other hand, twenty one (21) of them participated in the Interact Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) Boot Camp.

We are proud that our Interactors can already spearhead and manage community service initiatives, the latest being their Think Pink ToGetHer seminar, an information drive and awareness campaign in partnership with RCBM on breast cancer and prevention.

We invited Dr. Ma. Noemi Alsay Uy, a well-known Hematology – Oncology Unit Head in Cebu's four (4) prestigious hospitals, as our resource speaker. The seminar was well-attended, with one hundred fifty five (155) participants. We are truly very proud of our Interactors for their desire to learn and serve to change lives.

During our 8<sup>th</sup> General Membership Meeting, we invited District Grants Subcommittee Chair, Past Assistant Governor Stephen Chian as our guest speaker who spoke on the The Rotary Foundation and entertained a lot of the inquiries of our members.

October 24 is also the WORLD POLIO DAY. We supported the District Area 1C-initiated "Rotary Day of Service" in our relentless combat to end polio. Wearing with a sense of mission our Polio shirts, we participated in the turnover of medicines to Subangdaku, Mandaue City through the leadership of Assistant Governor Jensen Racho for Area 1C Rotary Day of Service to show that we are actively ending polio and we are very close to finally getting rid of this horrible disease.

As this message comes to a close, and as we celebrate RCBM's Silver Jubilee, I'd like us to toast for RCBM's next 25 years to propel forward, and for our Club to continue making an impressive impact as we embrace our mantra –

*"Stronger At 25: Sharing Love and Touching Lives".*

I believe the years of our Club's history are a treasure mine of learnings and successes, treasures that we use to enrich our present and future achievements. Our Club stands on a wealth of legacy, and it is the duty of the incumbent members and officers of the Club to make RCBM flourish further with our time, talent, and treasure. I've had the opportunity to lead multiple organizations across different countries and I've seen, first-hand, the power of service as a great differentiator. We implemented work-from-home and split operations arrangements, as appropriate, and extended loan relief for our customers, even before the Bayanihan Law was implemented. We also funded COVID-19 initiatives through plasma treatments, laboratory testing, and ambulance transport.

With our #GetBetter CSR campaign, we moved to support medical institutions, local businesses, students, and families. We partnered with organizations like Sprout Solutions to help manage the payroll of various companies and GoNegosyo to help SMEs restart their operations.

We remain committed to our educational advocacy by partnering with e-learning platforms 88Tuition and Edukasyon.ph which provide

alternative learning services. We built 24 more classrooms in 2020 as part of our "Build a School, Build a Nation: The Classrooms Project". As of December, last year, we constructed and turned over a total of 545 classrooms across 102 schools in 55 cities and municipalities across the country.

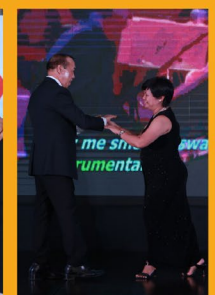

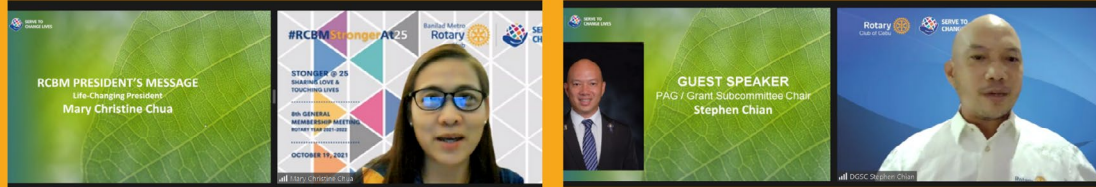

# COMPARING LIVES

*They say 'comparison is the thief of joy'.*

It is true. When we compare ourselves to what others have, or simply how they are, we are **essentially making ourselves feel downright inadequate** and deflated. It is especially true on social media where seeing the blessings of others magnify the things that we are lacking in life.

## HOW IS DISCONTENT DEFINED?

## HOW DO WE CURE DISCONTENT?

Apostle Paul has the best advice in the bible about how to fight discontent.

**PHILIPPIANS 4:11-13** "Not that I speak from want, for I have learned to be content in whatever circumstance I am. I know how to get along with humble means, and I also know how to live in prosperity; in any and every circumstance I have learned the secret of being filled and going hungry, both of having abundance and suffering need. I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me"

What Paul was basically saying was, "the secret of being content is having the ability to be flexible in adapting to both abundance and poverty. The secret of being able to do that is having Christ in our life, who in all circumstances can give us the strength to endure all the challenges that go with any situation.

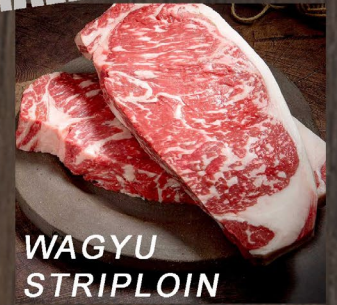
