#### **NOVEMBER 2025**

"This November, as we celebrate The Rotary Foundation, I invite you to consider not only what we give but why we give. **The Foundation is more than a fund for projects. It is the beating heart of our promise that service, rooted in trust and friendship, can create lasting change.** 

Our Action Plan calls us to increase our impact, and the Foundation is how we make this vision real. **Since 1988, Rotary and our partners have immunized nearly 3 billion children against polio.** We have committed more than \$2.6 billion to this cause, and last year alone we directed \$146 million toward the final push for eradication. These numbers are significant, but the true impact is not in statistics — it is in the lives of children who will never again fear polio. It is in the hope restored to families and the peace built in communities once defined by disease.

But polio is only one story among many. Each year, **Rotary Peace Centers** train new generations of leaders who will transform conflict into dialogue and division into understanding. In 2023-24, nearly 100 new fellows began their studies, continuing a legacy of more than 1,800 peacebuilders from over 140 countries. When we invest in them, we are planting seeds of peace that will bear fruit for decades to come.

The Foundation also touches lives through **district and global grants**, supporting projects large and small. A clean water well for a rural community, scholarships for young professionals, medical care in the wake of disaster — these are not temporary gestures, but steps toward dignity, resilience, and opportunity. This is how Rotary service becomes lasting impact. And when natural disasters strike, our Foundation allows Rotary to act quickly with disaster response grants.

Our Foundation is not about what we can do alone but what we can do together. Each contribution, no matter its size, joins with others to create a collective act of faith in humanity and in the future.

The last mile of any great journey is always the hardest. We see this in our final steps toward ending polio, in our work for peace, and in every project that seeks to lift people out of despair. Yet every time we give, we declare that our work will continue regardless of the challenge.

This November, let us give with gratitude, with joy, and with hope. **Through our Foundation**, we *Unite for Good*, and in doing so, we leave behind not only projects but a legacy of peace, trust. and Service Above Self.

# **DISTRICT 3860 UPDATES/NEWS**

My fellow Rotarians,

I sat down and conducted this RAGG Analysis of our entire District 3860 membership. I wanted to see, with full clarity, where we stand today — and where the greatest opportunities for growth and impact

This pyramid tells a powerful story.

At the top, we see 3 Gold clubs — only 3% of our district — clubs with 60 or more members, strong, vibrant, and deeply engaged. They remind us what is possible when a club's heart, leadership, and purpose are fully aligned.



Just below them are 12 Green clubs, representing 11.8% of D3860, with 41-59 members. These clubs are steady and robust. With just a bit more momentum, many of them can step into Gold territory. Then we arrive at the center of the pyramid: 34 Amber clubs, or 33.6% of our clubs — those with 25–40 members. These are not warning lights. They are opportunity zones. Clubs with the energy and structure to level up quickly with the right support and engagement. And finally, we come to the base — and the heart of our mission: 49 Red clubs, making up 48.5% of the district. Almost half of our clubs have 24 members or fewer.

But this does not discourage me. If anything, this fuels me. Because this is where the greatest transformation can happen. This is where growth will multiply. This is where leadership and collaboration will make the biggest difference. Let me share the deeper insight behind the numbers:

Gold shows us the destination.

Green shows us the momentum.

Amber shows us the opportunity

Red shows us the mission.

If even half of our Red clubs move up to Amber... If half of our Amber move up to Green... If even a few Green reach Gold... ...then District 3860 will not only break the records of last year — We will redefine what is possible for Rotary in the Philippines. This RAGG pyramid is not merely a chart. It is our map. It is our challenge. It is our commitment. It tells us where we are today. And it points us toward where we will go — together. This Rotary Year, my promise is this: We will uplift every club. We will support every President. We will mobilize every Area Team. And we will ensure that no club is left behind. Because membership is not just a number. Membership is impact. Impact is service. And service is who we are. And when we grow together, We truly Unite for Good.

And so, my fellow Rotarians, let us claim the next level together. If you are a Gold club, adopt and mentor a club in Red. If you are in Green, push yourself toward Gold. If you are Amber, focus on engagement — this is your moment to rise. And if you are in Red, know this: You are not alone, and you are not behind. You are the center of our mission. This is our year. Let's grow. Let's rise. Let's Unite for Good.
