




Virtual PETS-SETS 2021

Water and Sanitation by PADG Mel Sarmiento

While we celebrate Water and Sanitation Month, one cannot stop, but remember the passing of the Philippine Clean Water Act of 2004 (Republic Act No. 9275).

As a Local Chief Executive at the time, it was a bit difficult to implement the unfunded mandate of the National Government. Aside from its financial requirement, given that in the US a centralized and a mechanized system is expensive to build and maintain, Capacity Building was badly needed, as well on how to go about implementing it.

I had the good fortune to lead the team as Secretary-General of the League of Cities of the Philippines on our exposure trip under the Linaw (LOCAL INITIATIVES FOR AFFORDABLE. WASTEWATER TREATMENT) Program with USAID.

We examined numerous models of wastewater treatment systems. And upon our return, the team worked on a Waste Water Treatment System that used coconut peat, among others.

In our City of Calbayog, we first started with SOS Children's village, establishing a secondary treatment system. After passing the test as prescribed in the law, we constructed a communal septic tank (Anaerobic Baffled Reactor) for the 200 houses in a relocation socialized housing site with a Secondary Treatment System using coco peat.

The same system was also used in one of the city's healthcare centers. The Public Market used a similar modified system.

Rotarians may be able to help promote an affordable indigenous system within our residence or workplace. Perhaps we can do this in our District's Rotary Village in Davao, a double piping system included using rain harvesting in an elevated water tank for flushing which will save precious piped water for drinking, bathing and washing.
