RCC MANGUINOO ONLINE ORIENTATION

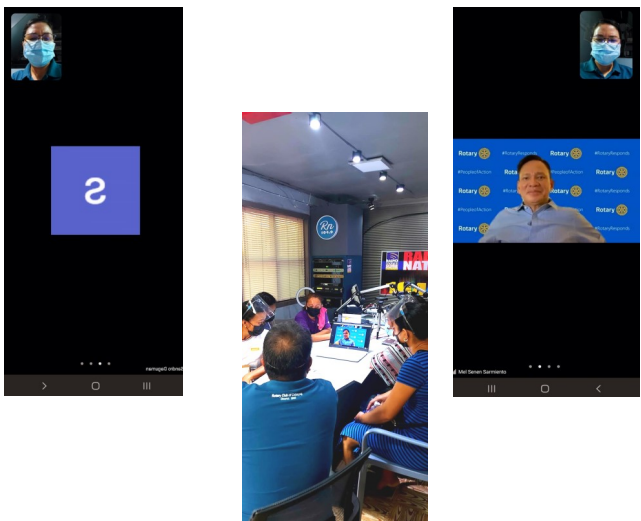


Officers of the Rotary Community Corps of Manguinoo attended an Online Orientation via Zoom last May 13, 2021.
