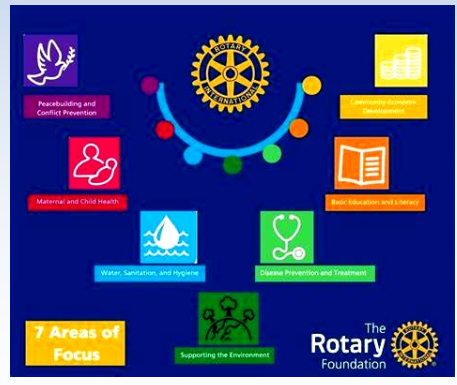



July, 2022 Message

As an accountant, I look at the world through the lens of inputs and outputs. We can plan with precision today for success tomorrow. My profession also taught me that numbers — those inputs and outputs — can sometimes tell great stories.

One of those stories is The Rotary Foundation: What it has given the world, starting from a modest input of \$26.50, is nothing short of remarkable.

In 1918, that amount — the surplus from that year's Rotary Convention in Kansas City, Missouri — was applied, at the suggestion of 1916-17 Rotary President Arch Klumph, to a fund with the purpose of doing good in the world. The fund grew modestly until 1947, when Rotary founder Paul Harris died and donations poured in as a tribute to him. That year, the Foundation supported scholarships for 18 students — the first indication of the greatness to come.

Later the Foundation expanded, providing programs, like Group Study Exchange, and humanitarian grants, which impacted the lives of members and communities around the world. In 1979, a major grant helped immunize 6.3 million children in the Philippines against polio, which led to the establishment of PolioPlus in 1985.

Rotary's work with polio eradication — helping reduce wild polio from an estimated 1,000 cases daily in 1988 to just six total cases in 2021 — has been one of the most ambitious humanitarian projects ever undertaken by a nongovernmental body. That success story alone shows the significance and widespread impact of Rotary and its Foundation.

Perhaps what is even more remarkable is that polio eradication is but one part of the Foundation's efforts. Today, the Foundation has grown into a multimillion-dollar charity. Our robust funding model allows districts the flexibility to choose which Rotary aspects they would like to support — polio eradication, scholarships, district grants, global grants, and more. Today's Foundation impacts the world through disaster relief, disease prevention, peace education, and other areas.


Everyone in Rotary is part of this great legacy; it is our responsibility to keep it going. This year, the trustees have set the goal of raising \$430 million. I know the expectations are high. But I also know just how much our members can achieve.

To get there, we will work together as we always do, with each club and individual giving what they can. In this way, we will ensure that we meet our ambitious but achievable goal and move our Foundation forward.

Jennifer Jones

Jones is founder and president of Media Street Productions Inc., an award-winning media company in Windsor. She was chair of the board of governors of the University of Windsor and chair of the Windsor-Essex Regional Chamber of Commerce. She has been recognized for her service with the YMCA Peace Medallion, the Queen's Diamond Jubilee Medal, and Wayne State University's Peacemaker of the Year Award, a first for a Canadian. Jones holds a Doctor of Laws (LL.D.).

As the first woman to be elected president, Jones understands how important it is to follow through on Rotary's Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) Statement. "I believe that diversity, equity, and inclusion ... begins at the top and for us to realize growth in female membership and members under the age of forty — these demographics need to see their own reflection in leadership," Jones said. "I will champion double-digit growth in both categories while never losing sight of our entire family."

Jones has been a Rotary member since 1997 and has served Rotary as RI vice president, director, training leader, committee chair, moderator, and district governor. She played a lead role in Rotary's rebranding effort by serving as chair of the Strengthening Rotary Advisory Group. She is the co-chair of the End Polio Now Countdown to History Campaign Committee, which aims to raise \$150 million for polio eradication efforts. She also led the successful #RotaryResponds telethon in 2020, which raised critical funds for COVID-19 relief and was viewed by more than 65,000 people.

Jones has also received Rotary International's Service Above Self Award and The Rotary Foundation Citation for Meritorious Service. She and her husband, Nick Krayacich, are members of The Rotary Foundation's Arch Klumph Society, Paul Harris Society, and the Bequest Society.

Lilo is an educator, entrepreneur, and chamber advocate.

She has been teaching at her alma mater, St. Theresa's College of Cebu since 1983. She became the planning and marketing consultant of STC in 2011-2016. Lilo is currently a board member of the STC Cebu Foundation.

Lilo's professional career as marketing communications specialist started in 1981 in Approach Advertising of the Norkis Group. She became an entrepreneur in 1984 when she opened her start-up advertising company, Creation Ads, Inc. In 2002, her company was bought by Bigfoot Global Solutions where she became the Manager for Creatives and Production, with 30 people under her wing. She established Lilo Advertising and Marketing Solutions in 2009 as Managing Director.

Lilo has been serving the Cebu Chamber of Commerce and Industry as Chair for Publicity and Promotions for Cebu Business Month (CBM) for 6 years; as CBM Chair in 2019, as Vice-President for External Affairs in 2020, and currently as Trustee. She is active in the Cebu International Film Festival (Past President/Board Member), Philippine Marketing Association-Cebu Chapter (Past President), Philippine Retailers Association-Cebu Chapter as convener for the Outstanding Filipino Retailer-Cebu, and Cebu Information & Business Process Management (CIB.O) as member of the Strategic Committee.

DG Lilo's enduring passion is service work in Rotary. She joined the Rotary Club of Cebu Gloria Mairs in 2004 and became president in RY2009-2009 where she received the Most Outstanding President award. She has served District 3680 in different capacities: District Public Image Chair, DGR-PRM, GMI, Editor-in-Chief, District Trainer, District Secretary, Rotary Global Rewards Chair, DDO for Programs, DTTS & PETS-SETS Chair, Awards Committee Chair, and DRFC Chair (2019-2022). She also served as Assistant Public Image Coordinator (ARPIC) in Zone 7A for Philippines and Indonesia in RY2013-2015 that brought her to train on PR in different districts in the Philippines and in Bali and Bandung, Indonesia.

Lilo's family is her touchstone. She is married to businessman Fabian "Dongle". They have two children, Marie Genevieve, a nurse who is married to Alvin Baring, the couple live in Australia; Marie Noelle, a teacher at the Cebu International School.

He does not set out to be a leader, but becomes one by the equality of his/her actions and the integrity of his/her intent."

Data showed that the conduct of anti-schistosomal mass treatment in Calbayog city, resulted in far lower participation than desired. Although we find it interesting and plausible that individual and community factors were related to higher participation, Hence the Rotary Club of Calbayog fully support this endeavor to improve the intensity, content and targeting of community- and individual-level information, education and incentives around mass treatment.

The control of schistosomiasis is based on large-scale treatment of at-risk population groups, access to safe water, improved sanitation, hygiene education, and snail control. Together with the LGU City health office a mass treatment of praziquantel was done at Barangay Cacaransan, Calbayog City last July 29, 2022. Rotary Club of Calbayog donated weighing scales that are needed to measure the weight of each client prior to drug administration.
