Building A More Equitable World Through Education

Quality education and literacy are more than just a dream. It is an essential right of human life but to this day, a horrific number of the world's population does not have access to these fundamental needs for success in life. The United Nations put it that, unless the world takes urgent action to address the issue, 84 million children will have no education during their formative years in 2030 and nearly 300 million in primary schools will be taught in a language they don't understand, thus robbing them of an opportunity to gain basic literacy and numeracy skills they need for life. The overarching worldwide vision of a fair and just world for all children and adults, is one where everyone has access to good education and lifelong learning that provides them with the mechanisms they need to thrive in what is now an increasingly complex and competitive society.

Since its inception, the core strategy for Rotary regarding basic education and literacy has been closely matched with Goal 4 of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) adopted by the United Nations "Quality Education to be made available to all". This approach is informed by the critical need to provide basic numeracy and literacy skills for children while they are in school. Rotarians are incredibly passionate and dedicated about driving these important areas in their local communities. To achieve long-term, sustainable change, Rotary is committed to improving the way it functions by conducting evidence-based projects and focusing service efforts on critical teaching-learning moments rather than just providing educational items like books or desks

Arezzo's strong statement this year is "Unite for Good", it's about how we're stronger and more together. We are powerful when we unite our unique skills and access to resources. Difference makers who act, not just in the world, but where each of us calls home. However, we should not invest in education for only one year. Literacy efforts take time to heal and blossom. Arezzo fervently dares everyone to dream big and think outside of the box as they ponder new innovative club opportunities for how to engage educators, students, advocates in communities across the world in stimulating ways that make the social difference. The battle for literacy is not just about access, but about equity, and ensuring every child, regardless of race or income level has the opportunity to learn to read, and more important, to be equipped with the tools to succeed. Conditions like the ones described are why it is frustrating for Rotary international to be idealistically dreaming of a place where no man should suffer from adult illiteracy. It is through our work and our shared commitment to growing literacy in the long run that we will be able to make this vision a reality.







Over the next four years, Anna will continue her studies, benefit from skill-building programs, and receive full support to prepare for a brighter future.

This story reflects not only the mission of the Sisters to rescue and restore dignity but also the power of basic education and literacy in transforming lives. Education is the foundation of freedom, giving young survivors like Anna the tools to rebuild, dream, and contribute meaningfully to society.

A bright and caring young girl, Ma Fe loves reading, especially the Bible, and speaks English with impressive fluency. She often reminds others of her simple yet profound wisdom, once telling a mentor, "There is a difference between wants and needs." Her words reveal the maturity of someone who has learned to value what truly matters—family, faith, and resilience.

Currently, Ma Fe is bravely fighting lymphoma and is preparing for her 15th round of chemotherapy this December 2024. While her treatment brings physical and financial challenges, she continues to face each day with courage. She is deeply grateful for the support of Everlasting Hope, where she has found a safe and loving place to stay during her healing journey.

Her dreams do not stop at farming. She also wishes to serve her country one day as a soldier, though she worries about the scars on her neck from cancer treatment. Still, she holds on to faith that God has great plans for her and believes in never giving up hope.

Rotary's Legacy in Advancing Literacy and Education

Basic education and literacy have been at the heart of Rotary's mission since its early years. When Rotary International was founded in 1905, its initial purpose was to bring professionals together for service and fellowship. As the organization grew, members began to notice that education is one of the most powerful tools to lift communities out of poverty. By the mid-20th century, Rotary clubs around the world were already supporting schools, donating books, and building libraries.

The formal recognition of Basic Education and Literacy as one of Rotary's official Areas of Focus came later, as the organization aligned its programs with global development goals. Rotary understood that literacy is more than just reading and writing—it is a pathway to better opportunities, improved health, stronger economies, and empowered communities.

Today, Rotary's literacy work spans across continents, from remote villages to urban centers. Projects include teacher training, early childhood learning, reading programs, scholarship grants, and school infrastructure. Rotary also partners with global organizations to address barriers to education such as poverty, gender inequality, and lack of access to learning materials.

In many communities, Rotarians have played a key role in creating sustainable solutions that help both children and adults gain the education they need to thrive. This commitment reflects Rotary's belief that education is a fundamental human right and a foundation for peace and progress.

IN HONOR OF SANGKOO YUN, A VISIONARY ROTARIAN



In Honor Of SangKoo Yun, A Visionary Rotarian

The Rotary family is deeply grieved to lose such a dedicated leader and compassionate visionary as SangKoo Yun, who was to be president of Rotary International in 2026-27. Yun died on September 5, after a brave fight against pancreatic cancer. In announcing his resignation last August, he demonstrated his commitment to health and Rotary.

The tenacity, consistency and maintenance of SangKoo Yun's course of action was extraordinary! A humble servant, he was known for his honesty and fairness. A leader who always led by example. Past RI President Dong Kurn (DK) Lee knew Yun for many years and called him a brother, an innovator who opened up new paths, and all the seeds he sowed have been grown into trees of hope. This is then the very thought of a man that always saw possibility where others saw impossibility.

Yun, born in Seoul, Korea, has led his life in a different direction than his father, a past president. He followed his dreams of architecture and he graduated at Syracuse in the States. Returning to Korea, he had a successful business career, founding firms that prospered in the country's 1960s-1970s industrial upsurge. His professional achievements were just a launch pad, as his real vocation was service. Yun became a member of the Rotary Club of Sae Hanyang in 1987, and from the beginning he was attracted by its power as a center for community involvement. What started as a curiosity in professional networking, expeditiously transformed into a deep passion for international service and would go on to make him part of the man he is today. For eight years, he co-chaired the Keep Mongolia Green Project, an audacious effort that brought people together in ways no one could have predicted. Against popular belief that trees could never grow in the Gobi Desert, Yun's persistence led to plantation of windbreak forests which later became Mongolia's biggest green zone. This program has not only been awarded a Medal of Friendship from the Mongolian president but also influenced additional government responses to desertification.

His evangelization of service was universal. Yun has guided or been involved in over 30 Rotary Foundation grant projects on five continents: Africa, Asia, Australia, Europe, and South America and North America. His travels were evidence of his faith in Rotary's international influence. Yun was also a writer of deep cultural and historical sensitivities. He resided in a traditional 19th-century hanok that has had an illustrious history as his father's administrative headquarters and South Korea's pro-democracy movement sanctuary. This linking of the past and future grounded him. His view of his presidency was not that he would be a singular leader, but it really was about continuity and collective strength. "I, where I stand today, do not think of myself as what I was taught about F.B.I." rules," he said once; "I don't see myself as a one-person leader but part of one strong, unbroken chain." This quote sums up the essence of Rotary, dedicated individuals connecting in a worldwide organization to serve mankind.

A man who created a collection of trees, touched some lives, and made some friends. His relentless drive and belief in the value service will motivate Rotarians for years to come to take action to create positive change in communities around the world. In addition to his wife, the former Eunsun Yang Yun, he is survived by two children and grandchildren. The Rotary family mourns and celebrates a life well lived and so richly given.

MEDICAL MISSION 2026: BRINGING HEALING, BUILDING HOPE

A new partnership and collaboration is taking shape as Rotary International San Diego joins hands with the Local Government Unit and Rural Health Unit of Badian, Cebu and the Rotary Club of Cebu Fort San Pedro. This alliance marks the beginning of a shared commitment to bring quality healthcare to underserved communities.


