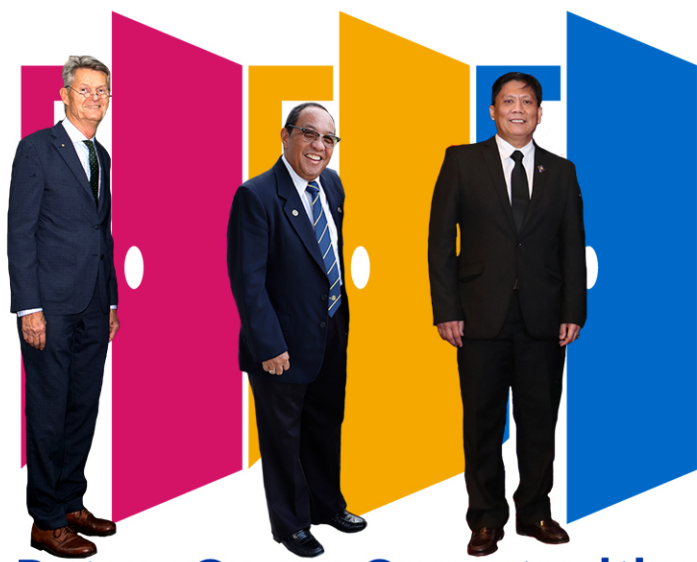

DURING A RECENT Zoom meeting with Rotarians and Rotaractors, I looked at the smiling faces on my screen and realized how much our organization has changed in a short period. It is clear that there is no going back to the “old normal” in Rotary — and I see that as an exciting opportunity!

Innovation and change are happening at so many levels as we rethink and remake Rotary. Rotary's new flexibility is blending with digital culture to drive change in ways that many of us have never seen before. We can learn a lot from Rotarians like Rebecca Fry — who, at age 31, already has 15 years of Rotary experience.

I see Rotary as a phenomenal platform to change the world. I believe I can have the greatest influence by empowering others to create the change they wish to see in the world. I've gained leadership insights through my experiences in RYLA and Rotaract, and now as charter president of the Rotary Social Impact Network, a new e-club.

Engaging Rotary program alumni is key in forming new clubs. Our club is proof that Rotaractors and other alumni want to join Rotary — but sometimes they can't find the Rotary club that's right for them. Our club has 31 members, all between the ages of 23 and 41, and almost all of them are alumni of Rotary programs.

We need to be able to integrate and align Rotary with the other personal and professional goals we're pursuing. In chartering this club, we set out to design a personalized model of Rotary that is focused on added value for our members. We have also sought to leverage connections — through Rotary Fellowships, Rotary Action Groups, and other international partnerships — in order to elevate our members' experiences beyond the club.

Our club meets and manages most of its projects online, using Microsoft Teams to engage 24/7 in topics that interest our members. This also means our club is not geographically bound to any one location: Although many of us are in Australia, we also have members in Germany, Italy, Mexico, Tanzania, and the United States.

Also key for our club is measuring the impact of our projects. For Plastic Free July this year, we created an awareness campaign promoting ways that individuals could reduce their use of plastics, and we reached more than 6,000 people. It's a project with a tangible impact that anyone can take part in wherever they are. I'm proud that, through our club, we are bringing people together for a new type of Rotary experience. I am excited for our future.

All Rotary clubs have the opportunity to be innovative clubs, just like Bec's club. Let's trust those clubs, learn from them, and lend them our support. Change in Rotary happens at the grassroots level, as clubs lead the charge, defining what this new Rotary can be.

Change is constant, and we have more work to do in many areas. It is important that we celebrate the contributions of people of all backgrounds and promote people from underrepresented groups so that they have greater opportunities to participate as members and leaders in Rotary.

The tools to make Rotary more inclusive, more relevant, and more fun for everyone are at our fingertips. Let's use them now, and we will see how *Rotary Opens Opportunities* for ourselves and for those yet to discover us.

TRUSTEE CHAIR'S MESSAGE

Celebrate World Polio Day with a donation

In the early 1990s, polio was still a concern in my country. As the Sri Lanka PolioPlus Committee chair, I was part of a task force of Rotarians, government officials, and UNICEF representatives that drove all polio eradication efforts, including National Immunization Days (NIDs).

But those were difficult days; civil war was raging in Sri Lanka. The government said NIDs could happen only outside conflict zones. This meant one-third of the country's children would not be vaccinated — an unacceptable proposition.

Rotary stepped in with UNICEF to engineer a cease-fire. Establishing contact with one of the world's most feared and elusive rebel leaders was not easy, and we were careful to maintain Rotary's good name during negotiations.

A few weeks later, my secretary delivered a letter to my office, her hands shaking. Signed by the rebel leader himself, it read: "Dear Mr. Ravindran: If you can persuade your government to stop the war for two days, then we are willing to lay down our guns for two days too, for our war is not with children."

Soon the NID was on, and vehicles bearing the Rotary emblem traveled to the vaccination booths in the areas occupied by insurgents, receiving the same respect and courtesy as the Red Cross.

Obstacles can seem insurmountable until we overcome them.

In March 2020, the polio program made the tough decision to temporarily suspend polio immunizations while the polio infrastructure that Rotary members had helped build was used for COVID-19 response. But with the wild poliovirus now banished from the African region and circulating in just two remaining countries, we continue to move forward. Our history shows that we can overcome even the most difficult situations. But we can't do it without your help.

World Polio Day is 24 October, and it's the greatest opportunity we have to raise funds and awareness for Rotary's polio eradication efforts. Visit endpolio.org/worldpolioday to get tools for planning virtual events and fundraisers, and to register your club's event.

Please consider making a donation to End Polio Now, to be matched 2-to-1 by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. In the face of a pandemic, there is a serious risk of further spread of polio. Your support is more important than ever, and it will ensure that together we can tackle the remaining obstacles and achieve a polio-free world.

In 1982, the Rotary Club of Cebu West (RCCW) under the stewardship of President Ted Flores passed a resolution for the creation of the Rotary Club of Cebu Fuente (RCCF) then the DG was Dr. Quintin Dormal and the RI President was Himojo Mukasa of Japan.

The Rotary Club of Cebu Fuente (RCCF) was chartered on October 29, 1982 with the Rotary Club of Cebu West (RCCW) past President Cesar "Sar" Estalilla as its charter president. The 11th Rotary Club in Cebu was born.

"Fuente" which means Fountain in English, is the symbol for The Rotary Club of Cebu Fuente (RCCF) Fountain of service from the A, B, C, D, E's of its programs related to Rotary's areas of Focus.

Talk of the town

Aminu Muhammad describes what polio immunizers take into the field

THE MEGAPHONE: In Nigeria, we have town criers. If someone has a baby, they announce the name. If there is a community meeting, they announce that. We engage the town criers to let people know when vaccination teams are coming to places that radio and TV don't reach.

THE VACCINES: Injectable vaccines such as those for measles and yellow fever are only given at health facilities or at temporary vaccination stations.

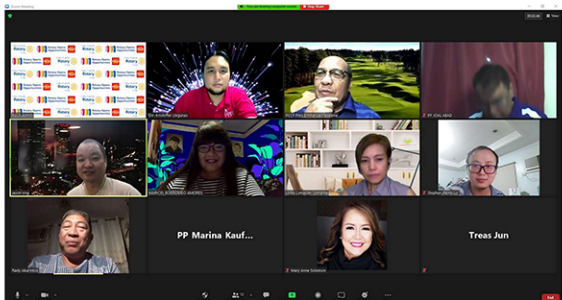
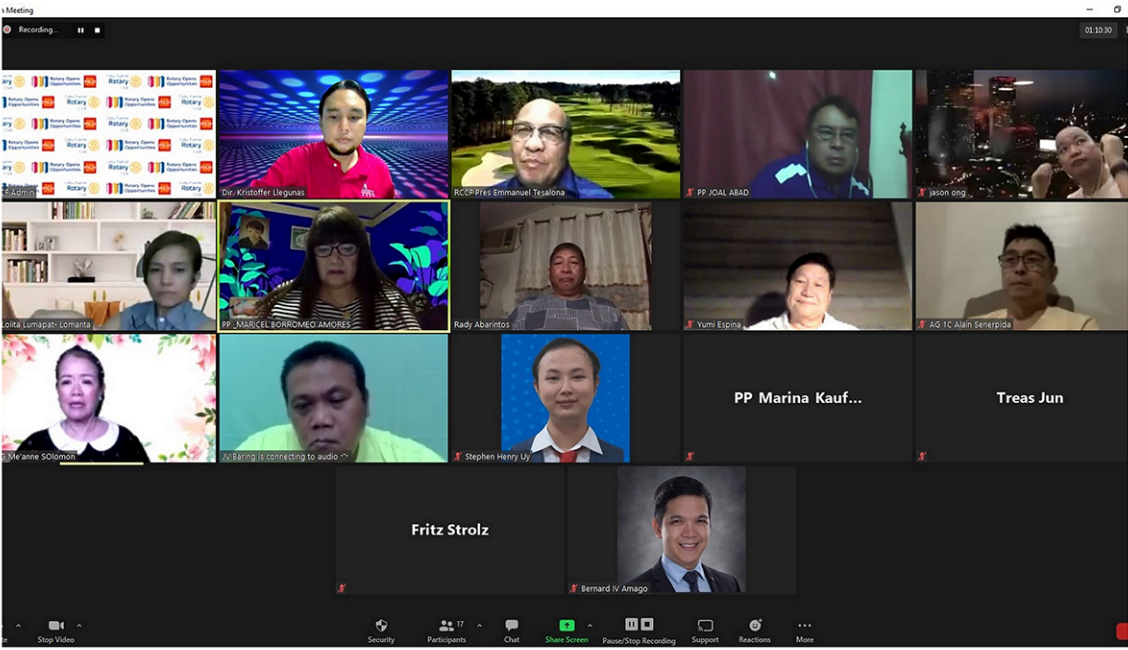
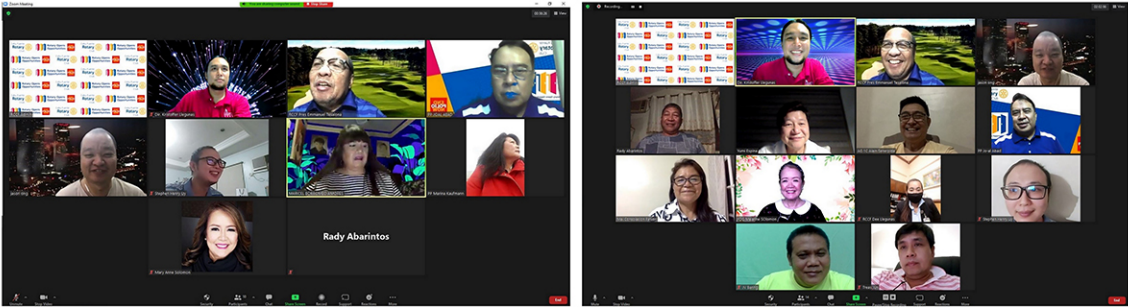
When we run supplementary immunization activities, the teams go door to door give children the oral polio vaccine and tell mothers where to take their children to receive these other vaccines.

THE VACCINE CARRIER: The oral polio vaccine must be kept between 35 and 46 degrees Fahrenheit. Carriers like this one are used to transport vaccines from health facilities, where they are kept in refrigerators,

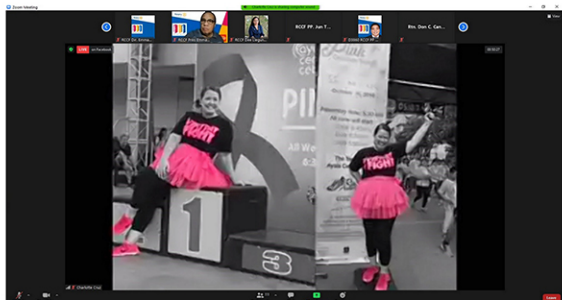
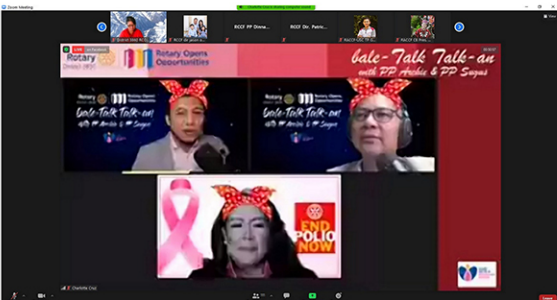
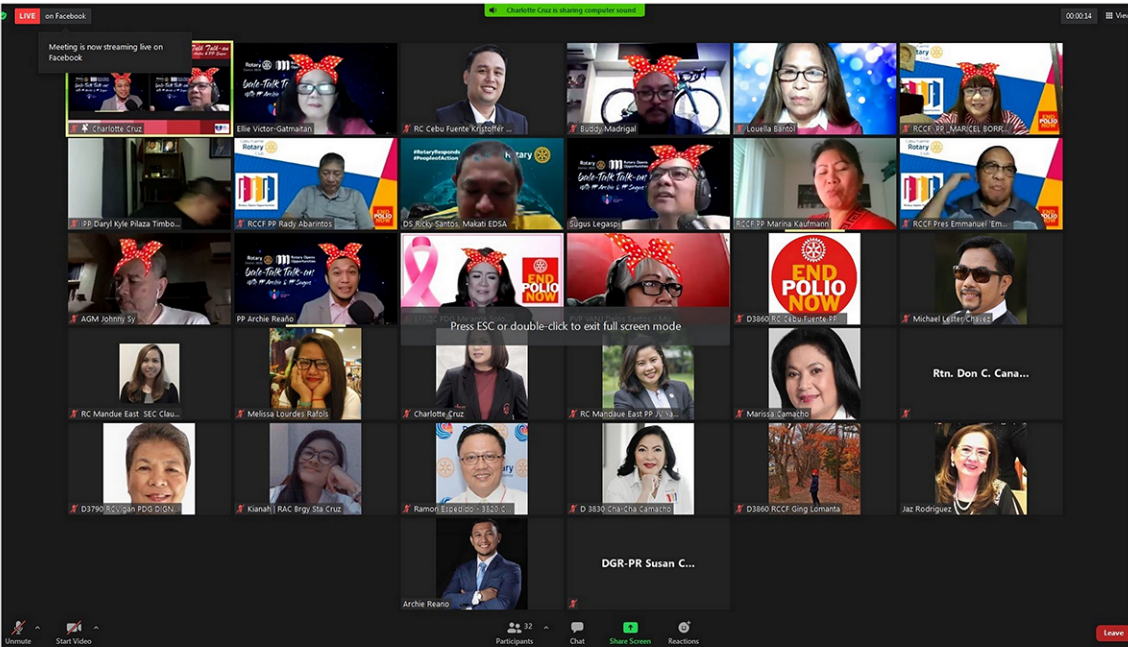
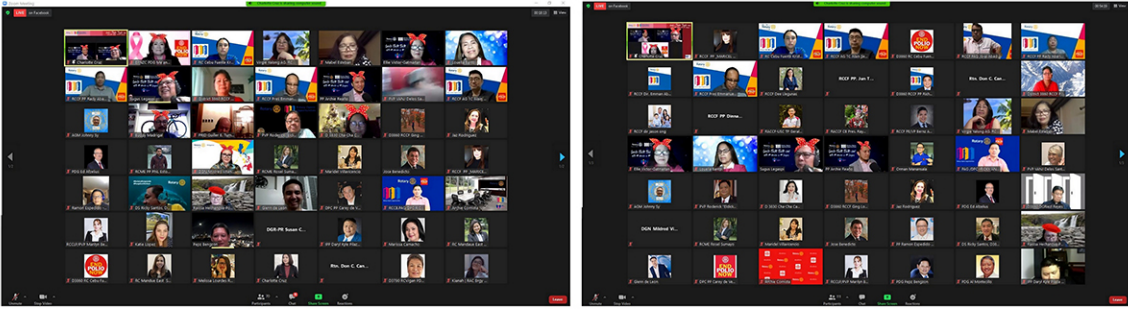
to health camps or vaccination stations in remote communities. Each vaccine carrier holds four ice packs, one on each side, and you place the vaccine in the middle. When teams go house to house, they carry the vaccines in smaller bags that hold two ice packs.

THE MASK: Because of COVID-19, we carry masks and hand sanitizer. The gloves are part of our normal PPE [personal protective equipment].

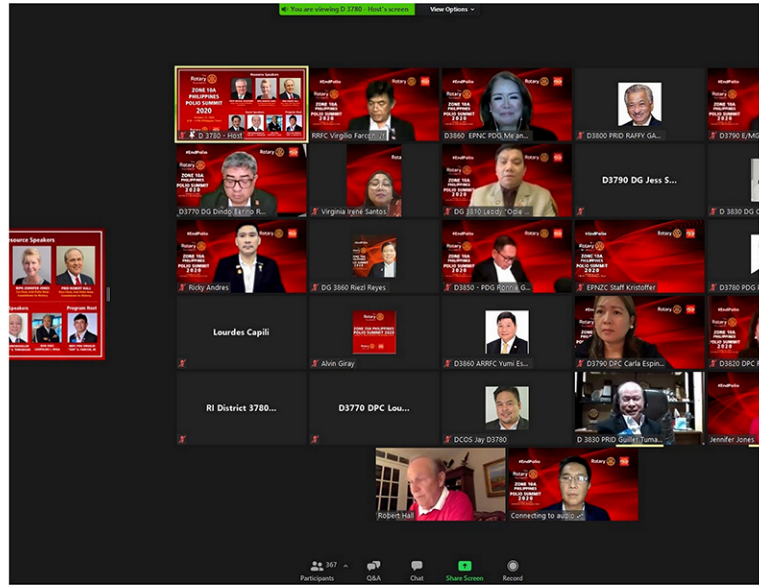
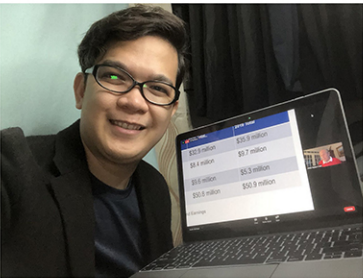
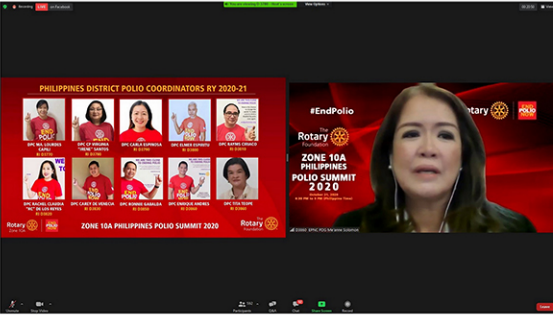
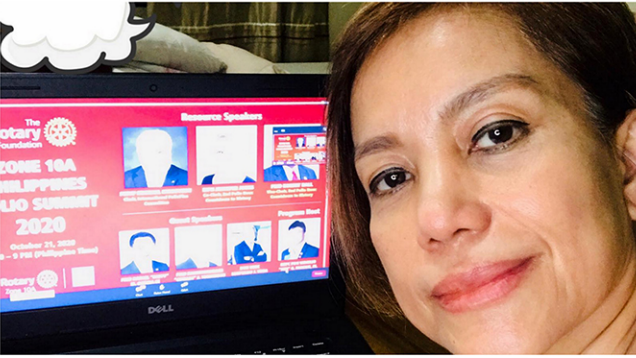

Rotarians connect at virtual convention

Rotary's first virtual convention, held 20-26 June, attracted more than 60,000 registrants and 175,000 viewers. The robust participation demonstrated Rotary members' eagerness to connect with one another amid the COVID-19 pandemic, which had forced the cancellation of the annual in-person convention planned for Honolulu, Hawaii.

During the first general session, 2019-20 RI President Mark Daniel Maloney said he was inspired by how members worldwide had stayed connected, adapted to their changing circumstances, and helped those in need during the crisis.

Maloney acknowledged that the pandemic had challenged Rotary to find new ways to adapt and grow. He pointed out that "increase our ability to adapt" is

one of the goals of Rotary's Action Plan.

"We are putting that plan into action out of necessity," Maloney said. "We all have a better understanding of growing Rotary by extending our reach beyond regular meetings. Now we are experiencing in real time how important it is to create new club experiences."

At the second general session, 2020-21 RI President Holger Knaack echoed these sentiments.

"Let us seize this moment and value it for what it is: an opportunity for Rotary to build on what we've learned, to embrace this new reality, to embrace new faces, to find new and better ways to shine, and to have a continuing impact on the world," Knaack said.

A number of world leaders and representatives from partner organizations spoke about the need to help one another through the pandemic. In a video address, United Nations Secretary-General António Guterres said that the people of the world must work together to find solutions to the problems that are weakening our societies.

"Your [Rotary's] efforts have made a significant difference — in eradicating polio, in strengthening communities around the globe, in alleviating the suffering of



vulnerable populations, and in building a safer, healthier, and more peaceful world," Guterres said.

A panel of global health experts discussed how the polio eradication infrastructure has helped communities tackle the needs that have emerged from the COVID-19 crisis. (Read the conversation on page 44.)

Virtual breakout sessions covered topics such as engaging with members online, planning environmentally friendly events, and using digital trends to attract millennials to Rotary. Nearly 40 additional breakout sessions were held throughout July.

Despite the change in format, the convention did not lack for entertainment. Participants enjoyed performances by Australian pop-opera quartet ARIA and Hawaiian ukulele virtuoso Jake Shimabukuro.

The environment becomes new Rotary area of focus

In June, The Rotary Foundation Trustees and the Rotary International Board of Directors unanimously approved the addition of a new area of focus for our organization: the environment.

More than \$18 million in global grant funding has been allocated to environment-related projects in other areas of focus over the past five years. The creation of a distinct area of focus to support the environment will give Rotary members even more ways to increase the organization's impact and bring about positive change.

Mark Daniel Maloney, 2019-20 RI president, said that during his Rotary travels, he met many Rotarians and Rotaractors who advocated for the environment as an area of focus. "I believe strongly that our Rotary Foundation programs now have a valuable added dimension to our efforts," Maloney said.

As the global population approaches 8 billion, protecting the environment is increasingly important, said 2019-20 Foundation Trustee Chair Gary C.K. Huang. "It is time for us to use our collective resources to invest in a smart and efficient way to protect our environment," he said. "We are qualified to take on this initiative because we are a global group of problem solvers with diversified talents."

In 1990-91, RI President Paulo V.C. Costa made the environment one of his primary causes, creating the Preserve Planet Earth Committee, which looked at opportunities for clubs and members to conduct environmental projects. "We have finally caught up to [the vision of]

Costa," said 2017-18 RI President Ian H.S. Riseley, chair of the Environmental Issues Task Force, which championed the new area of focus.

"As a lifelong environmentalist, I'm delighted that our great organization has recognized that the environment is a worthy and appropriate destination for our project activity," Riseley said. "This is an exciting moment in Rotary history."

The environment is Rotary's seventh area of focus and the first one to be added since the global grant model launched in 2013. It joins peacebuilding and conflict prevention; disease prevention and treatment; water, sanitation, and hygiene; maternal and child health; basic education and literacy; and community economic development.

Global grant applications for projects in the new area of focus will be accepted beginning 1 July 2021. Gifts and commitments from Rotarians and others are being sought to provide funding for this new area.
