Before our Rotary GMM ended last Monday, there was useful conversation between remaining rotarians where the light discussion focused on our Rotary Videoke set inside our room at Cebu Country Club. Since we were not able to use the said equipment that night, everyone commented that it's already in the state of antiquity, beyond repair and seemingly needs replacement. While the light-heartedly talked was ongoing, PP Marcy – with much willingness and delight – offered to replace it with a new one. He even jokingly said that music inside the new Videoke set must be Japanese songs. As closing response, PP George requested Hansel of Cebu Country Club to scout for its market quotations. Our sincerest thanks to PP Marcy for his generous act! It is now reassured that we can still continue our fellowship singing!

Last Saturday, July 13 2019, the Board had its Strategic Planning at Lowaii Cebu Marine Beach Resort, Cordova, and it was proficiently conducted by our District Secretary Barbette Lominoque. The good view and venue offered by Treas. John complemented the intellectual discussion and learnings on that day. It was a nice avenue where everyone savoured and learned about Rotary, the rationale on this year's theme "Rotary Connects The World", and responding to the challenge of RI President, Mark Daniel Maloney, and I quote:

"As a new decade begins, we are shaping Rotary's future. In 2019-2020, Rotary will implement its new strategic plan, respond to the innovation of the

Council on Legislation, and serve in our revitalized areas of focus. But the real work of shaping Rotary's future lies in our clubs, where our organization must do the most to adapt to today's changing realities.

While the club remains the core of the Rotary experience, we are now far more creative and flexible in deciding what a club can be, how it can meet, and even what can be considered a Rotary meeting. We need to be organized, strategic, and innovative in how we approach membership, forging wider and deeper connections to our communities and forming new club models to attract and engage more — and more diverse — members.

From that session, DS Barbette was also able to demonstrate what are strategic priorities of RI Club Citation (where it focuses **Unite People** and **Take Action**) and the District's Key Performance Indicators (KPI) through an Excel file Self-Assessment Balance Scorecard (with key result areas for scoring) for our club to complete before the Governor's Visit. This Balance Scorecard has five (5) items: 1. Club Administration, 2. Membership Development and Retention, 3. The Rotary Foundation, and 4. Public Image & Service Projects. Guidelines during the Official District Governor's Club Visit, for DG Philip Tan, is posted here in our Portside Bulletin.

After DS Barbette's time, there was a presentation from our RCCPC Treasury Team headed by Treas. John Sulay where Asst. Treas. Aldrin Bantilan showed a very good Excel financial macro-program that can monitor – in real time – Club's important financial figures like Club bank balances, receipts, disbursements, payments, etc. I salute Asst. Treasurer's Aldrin prowess in making such complicated Excel macro-programs. Thank you, Partner! Our Treasury Team also competently demonstrated what represents Annual Club Due per member and the need for us to revisit it for an increase. Accordingly, we are one of the few clubs with considerable low annual due in our Area.

And, lastly, I would like to make an appeal to our Club members who are unable to attend regular meetings. There is now a way for you to have make-ups – whether personal/physical/actual attendance or online Club. While you can find a page here in our Portside on 'where to make-up' (list of Rotary Clubs within Cebu and nearer cities), online now is considered the easiest way if you missed a meeting. There are a number of legitimate e-Rotary clubs that you can complete your makeup and recover absences. Two best examples are Rotary e-Club of the West (<https://www.rotaryclubwest.org/>) and Rotary e-Club One

(<https://www.rotaryclubone.org/>). Making up a Rotary meeting online is just as simple as your browsing/reading your Facebook or watching Youtube channel. You can explore by simply spending 30 minutes or more viewing the content (write-up programs/articles or videos) of your choice provided on its website. Then, you fill out completely and click the “Make Up” submission form. By which, you can receive an email confirmation within seconds which you can forward it to our Club Secretary.

Remember, **Rotary Connects The World** is our 2019-2020 RI Theme and everyone must get connected – even on the Web. To conserve environment and bondpaper printing costs, members can now opt to receive and read our Portside Bulletin via electronic file. This way, our Club can save extra funds for our Club’s priority projects.

Official District Governor's Club Visit

Rotary International **mandates the District Governor**, to at least once during his term within his/her Rotary Year, to **visit the Clubs** and **meet up with the members**. The purpose to which is to **CONNECT Rotary International** and the **Clubs** through the **District** any mutual concerns that would strengthen Rotary in achieving its goals in humanitarian service and membership growth. The following should make such visit fruitful with the **cooperation** between the **District Secretary, Assistant Governor**, and the concerned **Club President**:

1. The **District Secretary** informs the respective **Area Assistant Governor (AG)** of the planned visit of the Clubs within the assigned dates;
2. Upon confirmation of **Club Presidents**, the **District Secretary advises the Area Assistant Governor** of the **arrival itinerary** and hotel accommodation of the Governor;
3. The **Assistant Governor meets up with the District Governor prior to the visits** to individually know each Club's history, culture and challenges.
4. The **District Governor**, together with the **Assistant Governor**, will have a **caucus** or **Executive Session** with the **Club President, Club Secretary**, the different chairs of the **Committee on Membership, The Rotary Foundation (TRF), Public Image**, and the **Club Service Director (Areas of Focus)**;
 - a. The meeting has to be **conducted at least one hour before the Club General Membership Meeting**, preferably held in the same venue;
 - b. **Basic courtesy** by way of **introduction** by the Club Secretary is necessary **amongst those present**, but no protocol required during this time.
 - c. During the Official meeting with the Club Officers, the Governor prefers a **short, simple, and down to earth discussion**, presided by the Club President but **actively participated** with **discussions** coming more from the **Committee Chairs and Club Secretary**;
 - No PowerPoint presentation / printed materials required, **sharing your challenges** is more important specially on **how the District can be of service and help overcome** the different issues;
 - **Club discussions/presentation** by President, the different Chairs & Club Secretary: within **15 minutes**
 - **Response** by the **District Governor & Assistant Governor: 15 minutes**
 - Open forum and free wheeling discussion on Club's plans within the Rotary Year 2019-20: **30 minutes**
 - The **Club Secretary** take notes on the highlights and the **minutes** of the Discussions and **emails** this information to the **Assistant Governor** and the **District Secretary**.
 - The Governor adjourns the meeting
5. The **District Governor** is the **"only" Guest of Honor of the Club**, representing the Rotary International **President Mark Maloney**, with the Club President presiding the Club General Membership Meeting;
 - a. Basic protocol is encourage like the **Flag positioning** (if there is any), and the **order of seating** arrangement where the Guest (DG) and Assistant Governor will be seated;
 - b. During part of the program, the **Club Secretary presents** to the Club General Membership the **MINUTES** of meeting between Club Officers and the District Governor, and **any agreement(s) RATIFIED** by the **majority** of its members.
 - c. The District Governor will be given enough time to speak during the meeting.
 - d. The **Club President adjourns** the meeting.

All **formalities** of the District Governor's visit must be made **simple** and **completed within THREE hours, on or before 9:30 pm**, with **fellowship to start only after adjournment**. As much as possible, **avoid intermissions during the program proper**, which can done before or after the Club formalities.

2019-2020 ROTARY CITATION FOR ROTARY CLUBS

The **Rotary Citation** recognizes Rotary clubs that support our strategic priorities by completing certain activities. Clubs have the entire Rotary year to achieve the citation's goals.

Rotary can automatically verify many of your club's achievements as long as you keep your club and member information up-to-date in My Rotary. To be eligible for the Rotary Citation, clubs need to begin the year as active clubs that are in good standing and remain so throughout the year. Achievements will be compared with membership figures from 1 July 2019 and will be recognized after the 1 July 2020 numbers are final, on 15 August 2020.

UNITE PEOPLE

Achieve at least 5 of the following goals:

- Appoint an active club membership committee comprised of no less than five members and report the chair to Rotary International
- Achieve a net gain in membership
- Maintain or improve your club's retention of current and new members:
 - Improve your club's retention rate by 1 percentage point **or**
 - If your club's retention rate was 90 percent or more in 2018-2019, maintain it
- Achieve a net gain in female members or members under the age of 40
- Conduct a study of your members' occupations, and work to align your membership with the mix of businesses and professions in your community
- Sponsor or co-sponsor a new Rotary club or Rotary Community Corps
- Sponsor or co-sponsor an Interact or Rotaract club
- Host an event for Rotary alumni, and highlight Rotary's networking opportunities
- Sponsor a Youth Exchange student or RYLA participant

TAKE ACTION

Achieve at least 5 of the following goals:

- Appoint an active club Foundation committee comprised of no less than five members and report the chair to Rotary International
- Increase the number of members involved in service projects
- Contribute at least \$100 per capita to the Annual Fund of The Rotary Foundation
- Hold an event to raise funds for, or to increase awareness of, Rotary's work toward polio eradication
- Conduct a significant local or international service project in one of Rotary's six areas of focus
- Post successful club projects, with details about activities, volunteer hours, and funds raised, on Rotary.org
- Continue or establish a partnership with a corporate, governmental, or nongovernmental entity and work on a project together
- Use Rotary's brand guidelines, templates, People of Action campaign materials, and related resources
- Arrange for the club's members to talk with the media to tell your club's and Rotary's story

2019-2020 ROTARY CITATION FOR ROTARACT CLUBS

The **Rotary Citation for Rotaract Clubs** recognizes clubs that support our strategic priorities by completing certain activities. Clubs have the entire Rotary year to achieve the citation's goals.

To be eligible for the Rotary Citation, Rotaract clubs need to be certified by Rotary International and endorsed by the district governor before 1 July 2019. Clubs will report their achievements by submitting a nomination form by 15 August 2020.

UNITE PEOPLE

Achieve at least 3 of the following goals:

- Achieve a net gain of one member
- Have at least 50 percent of members add their skills and interests in their profiles on My Rotary
- Establish or maintain a twin club relationship
- Host an activity or event during World Rotaract Week (the anniversary of Rotaract); invite the media and tell your club's, and Rotary's, story
- Participate in a networking event or social activity with your sponsor Rotary club

TAKE ACTION

Achieve at least 3 of the following goals:

- Achieve an average minimum PolioPlus contribution of \$25 per member
- Hold an event to raise funds for, or to increase awareness of, Rotary's work toward polio eradication
- Partner with your sponsor Rotary club on a significant local or international service project in one of Rotary's six areas of focus
- Post successful club projects, with details about activities, volunteer hours, and funds raised, on Rotary.org
- Use Rotary's brand guidelines, templates, People of Action campaign materials, and related resources

2019-2020 ROTARY CITATION WITH PRESIDENTIAL DISTINCTION

This year, clubs can receive the **Rotary Citation with Presidential Distinction** when they achieve the Rotary Citation plus one to three additional goals.

THE BRIEF HISTORY OF ROTARY CLUB OF CEBU PORT CENTER



In the beginning were five men and one vision...

In a historic series of preparative meetings in May 1985, Felipe Casing, Antonio Elumir, Manny Granada, Jacinto Jamero and Rey Sanggalang envisioned the Port Center of Cebu as a vantage ground from where a band of noble men shall rise by the name of Rotary, in a game of service to humanity.

What followed was a marathon dash in establishing a Rotary Club in the Cebu Port District to obtain a charter from then District 3860 Governor Jose "Joe" Lardizabal whose term was to conclude very soon. On the forefront was Pepe Casing, a Cebu Fuente Rotarian.

It was in the special day of June 6, 1985 when a charter was granted to a club that was christened a most befitting name: The "ROTARY CLUB OF CEBU PORT CENTER".

The newfound organization that was once a nucleus of five visionaries became a club of 34 gentlemen who convened charter members in the middle of June 1985 to bear witness to the first set of officers. Antonio "Jun" Elumir, who was then the Phil. Ports Authority Officer, was the Charter President. With him at the helm was Manuel "Manny" Granada, the charter vice-president, Jacinto "Boy" Jamero and "Rey" Sanggalang were the charter secretary and charter treasurer, respectively. These gentlemen who were the prime movers for the organization of our club were equally accorded those distinct and rare positions which can only happen once in a history of a club.

Pepe Casing was honored with the venerable title of "Godfather".

The pioneering charter members, most of who are still with the RCCPC, instilled the club's love for sports – golf, bowling and tennis – in that order of popularity among its members. An incessant talk about these sports keeps alive the fellowship that follows its weekly meeting every Monday evening. Do not be surprised if you hear other people mistakenly refer to RCCPC as the Rotary Club of Cebu "Sports Center".
