5. The arrival of the Rotaplast Team to Cebu is on Sept. 24, 2019 at 12 Noon.

Our Welcoming Committee is headed by no less than PDG Ted Locson & PP Jack Jamero. Their luggage will go straight to the Summit Hotel and the equipment and supplies will go straight to the Adventist Hospital Cebu. Our Transporation Committee is headed by PAG Tony Ynoc & VP Boboy Tan.

The Welcome Dinner is scheduled on Sept. 28, 2019 (Saturday) c/o Cebu Province while Appreciation Dinner is scheduled on Oct. 4, 2019 (Friday) c/o Cebu City Government.

Last Friday, August 16, 2019, we had the coordination meeting with the Adventist Hospital Cebu officials and department heads. It was discussed that the committee on physical arrangement will bring in the 60 pcs- cots (Teheras) on Sept. 23, 2019 (Monday) at the 4th floor of the Adventist Hospital. They need at least 18 Nurses for the entire mission. As of now, there are 76 pre-registered patients from Abounding in Love Foundation. A maximum of 30 patients per day for the Pre-Lab tests such as CBC, UA, Bleeding/Clotting time and Blood typing. During the Pre-Clinic, It is expected to have at least 150 patients for screening and the holding area is at the 5th floor of the Hospital. Additional guard was suggested and we need to provide table & chairs at the entrance of the Hospital. The sound system will be provided by the AHC.

During the 1st operation day, it is expected to operate 15 patients and 1st admission of 20 patients before this day. AHC requested for a standby blood during the operation. It was suggested that the RCCPC will contact Philippine Red Cross for the standby blood. We requested for a housekeeper during a Saturday at the 5th floor.

First and foremost, a sincerest thanks to those who were able to make it and joined our last August 5 meeting. Your presence really contributed more meaning to our regular Rotary gathering! To those who attended other Club's meeting as Make up or joined other Rotary activities, please report it to us so that we can increase our attendance percentage. And, to those who were not around, we again wish you well and hope you're in good shape and health.

Updates for our incoming 2019 Rotaplast Mission. <u>ROTAPLAST COMMITTEE MEETING.</u> Last August 14 at 4 o'clock in the afternoon, there was a Rotaplast Committee Meeting at Cebu Country Club and participated by the following individuals: 1.) yours truly, 2.) PDG Anton Florendo, 3.) PP Ed Go; 4.) PP Marcy Koike; 5.) PP Sam Tiu; 6.) PP Toby Florendo; 7.) Sec. Jensen Racho; 8.) Dir. Ludwig Amandoron; 9.) Dir. Nestor Toledo; 10.) VP Boboy Tan; 11.) Fe Escano; and 12.) Star Espino (on behalf of IPP Rodien Paca). Agenda discussed, among others, focused more on our financial preparation to the flagship project. 2019 Rotaplast Mission (17th Year) will officially start this September 24, the arrival day of our foreign volunteers & partners from Rotary Club of San Francisco, District 7930 and it will end October 5, the departure day. There is a free day for volunteers on the 28th, a Saturday, as Adventist Hospital does not have work on Saturdays. Reminders to the Officers of the Day, which schedule of visit per member is posted in our Portside. Please calendar and note your respective "call of duty."

As solicitation letters were already sent out to all members, there was a suggestion raised to the Committee that each RCCPC member have to pledge Php10K (the hospital expense cost of at least one patient for this year) and, since minimum amount per solicitation is Php5K, a member will just look for two (2) sponsors/benefactors. The suggestion is likewise endorsed PP Edward Go, being him the yearly top-notcher for solicitations.

Though, this is still subject to our Club membership's further deliberation and agreement. For our 2019 Rotaplast Mission, we have around eighty (80) pre-listed patients from Abounding In Love Foundation but we still expect walk-in patients. Last year, we had 116 screened patients but only around 95 was successfully operated (an average target of 30 patients per day). It was also announced on that meeting that Dr. Alain Senerpida of RC Fuente and the daughter doctor of our Doctor/Rotarian Asoy are now officially among the



medical volunteers of Rotaplast International. Congratulations! The last but not the least, we personally received donation to Rotaplast project given by PP Marcy Koike amounting to Php50K. Thank you very much, PP Marcy! ありがとう、小池さん!

ROTAPLAST COORDINATION MEETING. A Coordination Meeting with the Adventist Hospital executives was held last August 16, 2019 at the Office of the President, Adventist Hospital (formerly Miller Hospital). From RCCPC side, it was participated by yours truly, Sec. Jensen Racho, Treas. John Sulay, Star Espino (on behalf of IPP Rodien Paca) and Fe Escano. Important agenda discussed, among others, include the physical preparations & set-up of area, the need for eighteen (18) nurses, and one back-up local anesthesiologist (as requested by Adventist Hospital). As confirmed during that meeting, parking area available is now front and back portions of the hospital. After the formal meeting, the group inspected the 4th and 5th floors and observed that all elevators are now fully functioning and important spaces like Operating Room, Holding and Pre-Screening areas are now ready. Details of these updates will be discussed further in our "Other Matters" portion of the program.

Another appeal to our Club members who are unable to attend regular Rotary meeting. There is now an easier way of having Make-up, which I already tried doing it online thru Rotary E-Club of the West –website address at: https://www.rotaryeclubwest.org/make-up/. In doing "Make-Up" online, it is just as simple as browsing 30 minutes or more - by; 1.) viewing, reading or watching some materials (the content of your choice provided by the e-Club website); 2.) filling out the "Make Up" Submission Form; and 3.) receive an email confirmation within seconds which you can forward to our Club Secretary. Guidelines during the

Official District Governor's Club Visit

Rotary International mandates the District Governor, to at least once during his term within his/her Rotary Year, to visit the Clubs and meet up with the members. The purpose to which is to CONNECT Rotary International and the Clubs through the District any mutual concerns that would strengthen Rotary in achieving its goals in humanitarian service and membership growth. The following should make such visit fruitful with the cooperation between the District Secretary, Assistant Governor, and the concerned Club President:

- 1. The **District Secretary** informs the respective **Area Assistant Governor (AG)** of the planned visit of the Clubs within the assigned dates;
- 2. Upon confirmation of **Club Presidents**, the **District Secretary advises the Area Assistant Governor** of the **arrival itinerary** and hotel accommodation of the Governor;
- 3. The **Assistant Governor meets up with the District Governor prior to the visits** to individually know each Club's history, culture and challenges.
- 4. The **District Governor**, together with the **Assistant Governor**, will have a **caucus** or **Executive Session** with the **Club President**, **Club Secretary**, the different chairs of the **Committee on Membership**, **The Rotary Foundation (TRF)**, **Public Image**, and the **Club Service Director (Areas of Focus)**;
 - a. The meeting has to be **conducted at least one hour before the Club General Membership Meeting**, preferably held in the same venue;
 - b. **Basic courtesy** by way of **introduction** by the Club Secretary is necessary **amongst those present**, but no protocol required during this time.
 - c. During the Official meeting with the Club Officers, the Governor prefers a short, simple, and down to earth discussion, presided by the Club President but actively participated with discussions coming more from the Committee Chairs and Club Secretary;
 - No PowerPoint presentation / printed materials required, sharing your challenges
 is more important specially on how the District can be of service and help
 overcome the different issues;
 - Club discussions/presentation by President, the different Chairs & Club Secretary: within 15 minutes
 - Response by the District Governor & Assistant Governor: 15 minutes
 - Open forum and free wheeling discussion on Club's plans within the Rotary Year 2019-20: 30 minutes
 - The **Club Secretary** take notes on the highlights and the **minutes** of the Discussions and **emails** this information to the **Assistant Governor** and the **District Secretary**.
 - The Governor adjourns the meeting
- 5. The **District Governor** is the "<u>only</u>" **Guest of Honor of the Club**, representing the Rotary International **President Mark Maloney**, with the Club President presiding the Club General Membership Meeting;
 - a. Basic protocol is encourage like the **Flag positioning** (if there is any), and the **order of seating** arrangement where the Guest (DG) and Assistant Governor will be seated;
 - b. During part of the program, the **Club Secretary presents** to the Club General Membership the **MINUTES** of meeting between Club Officers and the District Governor, and **any agreement(s) RATIFIED** by the **majority** of its members.
 - c. The District Governor will be given enough time to speak during the meeting.
 - d. The Club President adjourns the meeting.

All **formalities** of the District Governor's visit must be made **simple** and **completed within THREE hours, on or before 9:30 pm**, with **fellowship to start only after adjournment**. As much as possible, **avoid intermissions during the program prope**r, which can done before or after the Club formalities.

THE BRIEF HISTORY OF ROTARY CLUB OF CEBU PORT CENTER



In the beginning were five men and one vision...

In a historic series of preparative meetings in May 1985, Felipe Casing, Antonio Elumir, Manny Granada, Jacinto Jamero and Rey Sanggalang envisioned the Port Center of Cebu as a vantage ground from where a band of noble men shall rise by the name of Rotary, in a game of service to humanity.

What followed was a marathon dash in establishing a Rotary Club in the Cebu Port District to obtain a charter from then District 3860 Governor Jose "Joe" Lardizabal whose term was to conclude very soon. On the forefront was Pepe Casing, a Cebu Fuente Rotarian.

It was in the special day of June 6, 1985 when a charter was granted to a club that was christened a most befitting name: The "ROTARY CLUB OF CEBU PORT CENTER".

The newfound organization that was once a nucleus of five visionaries became a club of 34 gentlemen who convened charter members in the middle of June 1985 to bear witness to the first set of officers. Antonio "Jun" Elumir, who was then the Phil. Ports Authority Officer, was the Charter President. With him at the helm was Manuel "Manny" Granada, the charter vice-president, Jacinto "Boy" Jamero and "Rey" Sanggalang were the charter secretary and charter treasurer, respectively. These gentlemen who were the prime movers for the organization of our club were equally accorded those distinct and rare positions which can only happen once in a history of a club.

Pepe Casing was honored with the venerable title of "Godfather". The pioneering charter members, most of who are still with the RCCPC, instilled the club's love for sports – golf, bowling and tennis – in that order of popularity among its members. An incessant talk about these sports keeps alive the fellowship that follows its weekly meeting every Monday evening. Do not be surprised if you hear other people mistakenly refer to RCCPC as the Rotary Club of Cebu "Sports Center".
