

Welcome everyone to our Regular Meeting tonight! RCCPC celebrated its Pre-Valentine's Day last Monday

(February 10, 2020 at Cebu Country Club) and was participated by its six (6) Japanese visitors/guests, a sister club, from RC Oita Minami, Japan. It was fun and - I'm sure – everyone enjoyed the night with love, joy, singing and dancing, not to mention that we likewise acknowledged our January, February and March Birthday and Anniversary celebrators!

Our District Governor Philip Tan also joined us and enjoyed the fun. He likewise announced important updates regarding the upcoming District Conference 2020 here in Cebu City and we will know the details in a short while.

Career Orientation (Awareness) Project

Last Thursday, 13th of February 2020, RCCPC visited University of San Jose – Recolletos (USJ-R), Basak Campus, and joined the Career Awareness Day of the school in cooperation with its Guidance Counselling program. The project was aimed to give Senior High Students opportunities to learn about certain professional careers and what option they can take towards getting a College Degree.

The activity was participated by IPP Rodien Paca (a Ship Captain & entrepreneur talking to students about Maritime), Sec. Jensen Racho (an Architect talking to students about Architecture), Dir. Jeffrey Tan (a Software Engineer talking to students about computer/software engineering), Dir. Kit Daleon (a Civil Engineer talking to students about Civil Engineering), PP/PAG Boy Unabia (a Doctor of Medicine talking to students about his career) PP/PAGR Rey Sabay (a Mathematician who missed his talk due to time constraints), and yours truly who talked about RCCPC and the Rotary International.

For this event, I am thanking to the aforementioned Rotarian participants who were there to share their knowledge, expertise from their respective professional careers.

Situation Reports/Update: Novel Coronavirus

As previously mentioned in our last Portside Bulletin issue, we need to be updated as Rotarian and share correct information to our colleagues and countrymen.



World Health Organization (W.H.O.) update as of 14 February 2020, the **2019-nCov** Coronavirus disease should now be known as **COVID-19**.

As of 14 Feb. 2020, no new countries reported cases of COVID-19 in the past 24 hours. The second death has been reported outside China, in Japan. This individual did not have known travel history to China. In China, health care workers account for 1716 confirmed cases of COVID-19 including six deaths.

Globally there are already 49,053 confirmed (2,056 new). China – 48,548 confirmed (1,998 new), 1,381 deaths (121 new). Outside of China – 505 confirmed (58 new), 24 countries, 2 deaths (1 new).

W.H.O. RECOMMENDATIONS AND ADVICE FOR THE PUBLIC:

During previous outbreaks due to other coronavirus (Middle-East Respiratory Syndrome (MERS) and Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome (SARS), human-to-human transmission occurred through droplets, contact and fomites, suggesting that the transmission mode of the COVID-19 can be similar. The basic principles to reduce the general risk of transmission of acute respiratory infections include the following:

- Avoiding close contact with people suffering from acute respiratory infections.
- Frequent hand-washing, especially after direct contact with ill people or their environment.
- Avoiding unprotected contact with farm or wild animals.
- People with symptoms of acute respiratory infection should practice cough etiquette (maintain distance, cover coughs and sneezes with disposable tissues or clothing, and wash hands).
- Within health care facilities, enhance standard infection prevention and control practices in hospitals, especially in emergency departments.

Countries, territories or areas with reported confirmed cases of COVID-19, as of 8 February 2020 are found at the bottom of this article/message.

District Conference 2020

District Governor Philip Tan visited our Club last Monday where, aside from joining our Pre-Valentines Celebration, talked about District Conference (DisCon 2020) updates. On that evening, he announced that, due to the recent issue on COVID-19, it will be moved from March 5, 6 & 7, 2020 (Thu-Sat) to May 13, 14 & 15, 2020 (Wed-Fri). As relayed, "DisCon 2020 Organizing Committee and host clubs of Rotary International 3860 District Conference 2020 have decided to heed the advice of the Department of Health and postpone the event." This is "in consideration of the health and safety of everyone concerned." Venue is still at Cebu Grand Convention Center, Banilad, Cebu City.



As clarified by Governor Philip, there is no longer "promo" cost or early bird discount despite the postponement, which was already ended last January 31, 2020. Registration now is back to its regular rate at Php6,000.00. You may deposit your payment to BPI Account No. 9121-0074-84 (Robinsons Galleria), RC CEBU WEST ROTARIANS INC. So, this is a showdown between Visayas against Mindanao Rotarian bowlers. The Bowling Committee (c/o PP Sam Tiu and PP Rey Sabay) will give more updates on this especially the guidelines and mechanics of the tournament.



2019-2020 ROTARY CITATION FOR ROTARY CLUBS

The **Rotary Citation** recognizes Rotary clubs that support our strategic priorities by completing certain activities. Clubs have the entire Rotary year to achieve the citation's goals.

Rotary can automatically verify many of your club's achievements as long as you keep your club and member information up-to-date in My Rotary. To be eligible for the Rotary Citation, clubs need to begin the year as active clubs that are in good standing and remain so throughout the year. Achievements will be compared with membership figures from 1 July 2019 and will be recognized after the 1 July 2020 numbers are final, on 15 August 2020.

UNITE PEOPLE

Achieve at least 5 of the following goals:

- Appoint an active club membership committee comprised of no less than five members and report the chair to Rotary International
- Achieve a net gain in membership
- Maintain or improve your club's retention of current and new members:
 - O Improve your club's retention rate by 1 percentage point or
 - If your club's retention rate was 90 percent or more in 2018-2019, maintain it
- Achieve a net gain in female members or members under the age of 40
- Conduct a study of your members' occupations, and work to align your membership with the mix of businesses and professions in your community
- Sponsor or co-sponsor a new Rotary club or Rotary Community Corps
- Sponsor or co-sponsor an Interact or Rotaract club
- Host an event for Rotary alumni, and highlight Rotary's networking opportunities
- Sponsor a Youth Exchange student or RYLA participant

TAKE ACTION

Achieve at least 5 of the following goals:

The **Rotary Citation for Rotaract Clubs** recognizes clubs that support our strategic priorities by completing certain activities. Clubs have the entire Rotary year to achieve the citation's goals.

To be eligible for the Rotary Citation, Rotaract clubs need to be certified by Rotary International and endorsed by the district governor before 1 July 2019. Clubs will report their achievements by submitting a nomination form by 15 August 2020.

THE BRIEF HISTORY OF ROTARY CLUB OF CEBU PORT CENTER



In the beginning were five men and one vision...

In a historic series of preparative meetings in May 1985, Felipe Casing, Antonio Elumir, Manny Granada, Jacinto Jamero and Rey Sanggalang envisioned the Port Center of Cebu as a vantage ground from where a band of noble men shall rise by the name of Rotary, in a game of service to humanity.

What followed was a marathon dash in establishing a Rotary Club in the Cebu Port District to obtain a charter from then District 3860 Governor Jose "Joe" Lardizabal whose term was to conclude very soon. On the forefront was Pepe Casing, a Cebu Fuente Rotarian.

It was in the special day of June 6, 1985 when a charter was granted to a club that was christened a most befitting name: The "ROTARY CLUB OF CEBU PORT CENTER".

The newfound organization that was once a nucleus of five visionaries became a club of 34 gentlemen who convened charter members in the middle of June 1985 to bear witness to the first set of officers. Antonio "Jun" Elumir, who was then the Phil. Ports Authority Officer, was the Charter President. With him at the helm was Manuel "Manny" Granada, the charter vice-president, Jacinto "Boy" Jamero and "Rey" Sanggalang were the charter secretary and charter treasurer, respectively. These gentlemen who were the prime movers for the organization of our club were equally accorded those distinct and rare positions which can only happen once in a history of a club.

Pepe Casing was honored with the venerable title of "Godfather". The pioneering charter members, most of who are still with the RCCPC, instilled the club's love for sports – golf, bowling and tennis – in that order of popularity among its members. An incessant talk about these sports keeps alive the fellowship that follows its weekly meeting every Monday evening. Do not be surprised if you hear other people mistakenly refer to RCCPC as the Rotary Club of Cebu "Sports Center".
