



Good evening, fellow RCCPC Rotarians! Welcome to the 2nd Monday of the Month and tonight, I would

like to extend my thanks and appreciation to all Rotarians who attended the last Club Meeting. As a gentle reminder to all Club Members, to those who attended other club's meeting as make-up or those who joined other Rotary activities - physical or online, please report it to us so that we can increase our attendance percentage.

It was announced last Club Meeting that the Rotary Theme for 2020-2021 is Rotary Opens Opportunities. As I am still out of the country and believing about Rotary Connects the World, allow me to share with you about Tanzania, Africa.



The United Republic of Tanzania is located in eastern Africa on the Indian Ocean between Mozambique and Kenya and includes the island of Zanzibar. Its largest city, Dar es Salaam, is located along the eastern coast on the Indian Ocean. The capital Dodoma lies west of Dares-Salaam.



Tanzania covers an area roughly twice the size of California. The terrain includes coastal plains, a central plateau, and highlands in the north and south. It is home to Mt. Kilimanjaro (the highest point in Africa), Lake Victoria (the second largest lake in the world), and the Great Rift Valley. The climate varies from tropical along the coast to temperate in the highlands. Natural resources include hydropower, tin, phosphates, iron ore, coal, diamonds, gemstones, gold, natural gas, and nickel.

Population. Around 55 million people live in Tanzania. Kiswahili or Swahili (Kiunguju in Zanzibar) and English are the official languages; Arabic and numerous other local languages are spoken as well. The population is overwhelmingly native African (99%), most of whom are Bantu (95%). Religious practices on the mainland include: Christian (30%), Muslim (35%), and indigenous beliefs (35%).

Tanzania is one of the earth's oldest known continuously inhabited areas. There are fossil remains of humans and hominids that date back more than 2 million years. Tanzania is believed to have been populated by Cushitic and Khoisan speaking people. Bantu speakers arrived approximately 2,000 years ago. Niloltic pastoralists arrived later and continued to do so up to the 18th century.

Our Club activities & Upcoming Projects will be discussed later by our Club President Jun Falcon. Our assigned Rotarian of the Evening for March 16, 2020 is Rtn. Kit Daleon, a Civil/Structural Engineer and Master Plumber.

It is not quite so good to start a day with news like our country President declaring COVID-19 State of Public Health Emergency and, to contain the said virus, Northern Italy quarantines 16 million people. It is challenge to everyone – of all of us – human beings. We are vulnerable and worried since chain of things can somehow create change & disruption to our business, work, community and family.

As a being with intellect, freedom and freewill, we only have two choices – fight or flight. And, as a good Rotarian, we are inclined to choose the former and lead to wage war thru proper information sharing and education campaign, not to mention that we complemented it with our prayers and complete faith of our God.

Area Coordination Meeting

An Area Coordination Meeting (or ACOM) was held last Saturday, 7th March 2020, at 11AM to 2PM at Casino Espanol. Host of the meeting is Area 1B where our Club belong. My appreciation to Dir. Jeffrey Tan and PDG Ted Locson for joining me to the said ACOM.

Agenda discussed, among others, include: 1.) Rotary Invoices and District Obligataions, 2.) Rotary Club Central and Balanced Score Card, DisCon 2020 and Club Listing, DISTAS 2020 with Club Host RC Panglao Island, RYLA with host RC Cebu Gloria Maris, and RI 2020 Convention in Honolulu.

For Rotary Invoices and District financial obligations including monthly reporting of our Balance Score Card, our Club is ably complied with all the requirements and paid the complete financial obligations. Thanks to our energetic and very pro-active PE and SE, Club Secretary Jensen Racho and Club Treasurer John Sulay!

For DisCon 2020 and Club Listing, the District is still pushing for more Souvenir Ads solicitations for the Inside-Page Advertisement. Whole page cost is just Php8,0000 while



Half-page is Php5,000. For the % sharing stipulated (with District Conference Committee @ 60% to cover cost of 800 souvenir coffee table-book and 30% share with the solicitor's Club , it was disclosed by our Assistant Governor that he will share his 10% to the club. Thus, with this scenario, it is now 60%/40% where the latter is completely shared to the Club. We should not forget that the DisCon Committee thru the Office of the District Governor will process and email personalized Solicitation Letter of each prospective advertiser to the soliciting Club President with corresponding control number, electronic signature of the DG and blank spare with the President's name for him/her to sign before giving it to the prospective advertiser.

For our club members to have an opportunity of promoting their companies to DisCon Inside-Page Advertisement, I recommend to our Club Secretary to finalize our list of prospective advertisers to include all RCCPC's member companies and email it to our District Governor.

For DisCon2020, it was reiterated that there's no more 'early bird' and the regular cost is final. However, replacement of participants is allowed before the DisCon day. Golf and Bowling tournaments are officially declared on May 12, i.e. a day before the DisCon.

A week after our DisCon2020 in Cebu, District Training Assembly or DISTAS at Panglao Island will follow on May 22-23, 2020 and it will be held at Henann Convention Center at Tawala, Panglao, Bohol. Host is RC Panglao Island. We are encouraging everyone especially our 2020-2021 officers and board to attend and experience DISTAS at Bohol island. Registration is Php4,000, inclusive of foods and training materials (hotel costs excluded).

We are being asked by our District Governor to support Rotary Youth Leadership Awards or RYLA. Each year, thousands of young people participate in this program. Young ages 13-30 are sponsored by Rotary Clubs to attend the event run by our District Committee. Host for this year is RC Gloria Maris and RCCPC will send a delegate for this activity.

Rotary International Convention 2020 is already scheduled despite the coronavirus challenge we have today. The date is June 6-10, 2020 at Honolulu, Hawaii. To those who are interested, you may get your ticket and hotel reservations while it's still on the low side. Further and specific details will be announced soon.

Before leaving from said ACOM, our District Governor strongly recommend Club presidents to convince all Rotarians how "Every Rotarian Every Year" or EREY works and its rationale. Every member of each club personally contributes at least \$25 to the Rotary Foundation's Annual Fund. TRF Funds, aside from 2.5Billion children immunized against



polio, are utilized for our Rotary "Causes" like Promoting Peace, Fighting Disease, Providing Clean Water, Saving Mothers & Children , and Saving Mothers & Children.

Situation Reports/Update: Novel Coronavirus

As previously mentioned in our last Portside Bulletin issue, we need to be updated as Rotarian and share correct information to our colleagues and countrymen.

Data reported as of 7 March 2020, W.H.O. highlights are as follows:

- 5 new countries/territories/areas (Colombia, Holy See, Peru, Serbia, and Togo) have reported cases of COVID-19 in the past 24 hours.
- The global number of reported cases of COVID-19 has surpassed 100,000.
- OpenWHO has reached 161, 000 learners in COVID-19 courses. The introductory course on COVID-19 has been partially or fully translated into 17 national languages. For more information, and to enroll in these free courses, please visit OpenWHO's COVID-19 channel https://openWHO's

Rotary can automatically verify many of your club's achievements as long as you keep your club and member information up-to-date in My Rotary. To be eligible for the Rotary Citation, clubs need to begin the year as active clubs that are in good standing and remain so throughout the year. Achievements will be compared with membership figures from 1 July 2019 and will be recognized after the 1 July 2020 numbers are final, on 15 August 2020.

UNITE PEOPLE

Achieve at least 5 of the following goals:

- Appoint an active club membership committee comprised of no less than five members and report the chair to Rotary International
- Achieve a net gain in membership
- Maintain or improve your club's retention of current and new members:

THE BRIEF HISTORY OF ROTARY CLUB OF CEBU PORT CENTER



In the beginning were five men and one vision... In a historic series of preparative meetings in May 1985, Felipe Casing, Antonio Elumir, Manny Granada, Jacinto Jamero and Rey Sanggalang envisioned the Port Center of Cebu as a vantage ground from where a band of noble men shall rise by the name of Rotary, in a game of service to humanity.

What followed was a marathon dash in establishing a Rotary Club in the Cebu Port District to obtain a charter from then District 3860 Governor Jose "Joe" Lardizabal whose term was to conclude very soon. On the forefront was Pepe Casing, a Cebu Fuente Rotarian.

It was in the special day of June 6, 1985 when a charter was granted to a club that was christened a most befitting name: The "ROTARY CLUB OF CEBU PORT CENTER".

The newfound organization that was once a nucleus of five visionaries became a club of 34 gentlemen who convened charter members in the middle of June 1985 to bear witness to the first set of officers. Antonio "Jun" Elumir, who was then the Phil. Ports Authority Officer, was the Charter President. With him at the helm was Manuel "Manny" Granada, the charter vice-president, Jacinto "Boy" Jamero and "Rey" Sanggalang were the charter secretary and charter treasurer, respectively. These gentlemen who were the prime movers for the organization of our club were equally accorded those distinct and rare positions which can only happen once in a history of a club.

Pepe Casing was honored with the venerable title of "Godfather". The pioneering charter members, most of who are still with the RCCPC, instilled the club's love for sports – golf, bowling and tennis – in that order of popularity among its members. An incessant talk about these sports keeps alive the fellowship that follows its weekly meeting every Monday evening. Do not be surprised if you hear other people mistakenly refer to RCCPC as the Rotary Club of Cebu "Sports Center".
