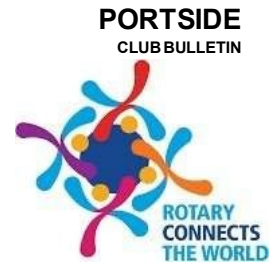
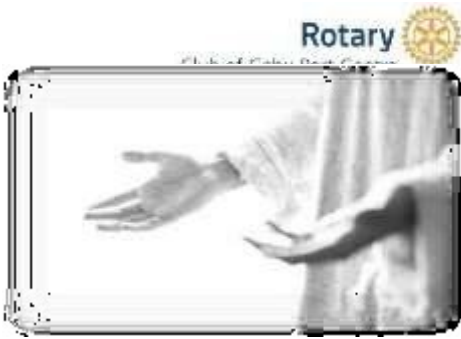

**Great day** to all RCCPC Rotarians & Spouses!

To gain a wise perspective, we have to face our fears. Fears can be healthy or exaggerated and sometimes paralyzing. It takes wisdom to admit that there are dangers around us that need to be properly, and fearfully respected, and it takes wisdom to see through the overstate and fear-mongering of those who use the pains of others for their benefit. The Covid-19 virus that plagues the world is factual. For many of us it is life-threatening today, and for all of us it is a life-threatening prospect. No matter the motives of those who may exaggerate, we are better off by planning for things to get worse than being caught spur-of-the-moment. We can always be thankful that the worst has been obviated, but we will be worse off if we haven't done our best to think through as many eventualities as possible, and thereby be prepared to face the risks.

All of us know that there are basic health practices we must seriously follow, not only for ourselves but on behalf of others. People who are not in high-risk groups should not only set a good example for others, but be willing to share the burdens that others feel. Apparently healthy people, those with no symptoms and no awareness of having the disease, can nonetheless carry it to others. We owe it to one another to pay attention to each other, to advise one another, to check on one another, and serve one another. It's what we believe and confess as Christians, and these days test us to live out our faith. There's also a legitimate financial fear that goes with this crisis. The NEDA Chief had already tendered his resignation last week. It's now the 25<sup>th</sup> day of Cebu City under ECQ and we are praying that everyone is safe and well at their respective areas.

For the most part of my message today, I would like to congratulate our RCCPC Spouse Viber group's initiative. The initial PPEs were already delivered last week to Cebu Medical Center by PE Jensen Racho and his spouse - Dr. Cathy together with PP Sam Tiu and Dir. Robert Barquilla. That was a decent donation of RCCPC to sustain and support the efforts of our front-liners against COV-19 at CCMC. As relayed from our last e-Portside, this was RCCPC spouses' initiative (spearheaded by PE Jensen's and PP Marcy's spouse – Sp. Cathy & Sp. Rosana) and was successfully responded by our RCCPC colleagues. With names already mentioned by PE/Sec Jensen on his Sec message, I am extending again my deepest appreciation and heartfelt gratitude to our donors and contributors!

With advent of digital technology, I was able to observe other country's RI Zone meeting thru Zoom and was grateful to see that Rotary still aggressively fighting globally against COVID-19. In fact, polio networks that Rotarians have helped to build is now being used to combat the new coronavirus. It is also said that, in Afghanistan, teams that watch for polio cases are now also working to detect any cases of COVID-19, and in Nigeria, medical staff who work on polio eradication are tracing the contacts of people who have COVID-19 and conducting research on the new disease. Similarly for RC Cebu, I was likewise able to view one of their Zoom meeting, and this mother Club already now at the level of providing simple meals for the poor communities in the city at this time of ECQ. This project was presented thru Zoom by PP Bobong Castillo entitled "Cebu Food Bank & Soup Kitchen." The project is on top of their various projects addressing the COVID-19 disease.

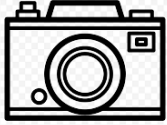

# COVID-19 PREPAREDNESS AND RESPONSE

*(Protect yourself and others)*

Protect yourself and others from getting sick

## Wash your hands

- after coughing or sneezing
- when caring for the sick
- before, during and after you prepare food
- before eating
- after toilet use
- when hands are visibly dirty
- after handling animals or animal waste



## Wash your hands

Wash your hands with soap and running water when hands are visibly dirty



If your hands are not visibly dirty, frequently clean them by using alcohol-based hand rub or soap and water



## Protect others from getting sick



Avoid close contact when you are experiencing cough and fever

Avoid spitting in public



If you have fever, cough and difficulty breathing seek medical care early and share previous travel history with your health care provider



## Protect others from getting sick

When coughing and sneezing cover mouth and nose with flexed elbow or tissue



Throw tissue into closed bin immediately after use

Clean hands with alcohol-based hand rub or soap and water after coughing or sneezing and when caring for the sick







# COVID-19 PREPAREDNESS AND RESPONSE (Working in wet markets)

### Working in wet markets in China and Southeast Asia? Stay healthy!

Frequently wash your hands with soap and water after touching animals and animal products

Disinfect equipment and working area at least once a day



### Working in wet markets in China and Southeast Asia? Stay healthy!

Wear protective gowns, gloves and facial protection while handling animals and animal products

Remove protective clothing after work, wash daily and leave at the work site

Avoid exposing family members to soiled work clothing and shoes



### Shopping in wet markets in China and Southeast Asia? Stay healthy!

Wash hands with soap and water after touching animals and animal products

Avoid touching eyes, nose and mouth

Avoid contact with sick animals and spoiled meat

Avoid contact with stray animals, waste and fluids in market





# COVID-19 PREPAREDNESS AND RESPONSE (Stay Healthy While Travelling)

## STAY HEALTHY WHILE TRAVELLING

**Avoid travel** if you have a fever and cough



If you have a fever, cough and difficulty breathing **seek medical care early** and share previous travel history with your health care provider



## STAY HEALTHY WHILE TRAVELLING

If you become sick while travelling, **inform crew and seek medical care early**



If you seek medical attention, **share travel history** with your health care provider



## STAY HEALTHY WHILE TRAVELLING

When coughing and sneezing **cover mouth and nose with flexed elbow or tissue** - throw tissue away immediately and wash hands



If you choose to wear a face mask, be sure to **cover mouth and nose** - avoid touching mask once it's on



**Immediately discard single-use mask** after each use and wash hands after removing masks



## STAY HEALTHY WHILE TRAVELLING

**Avoid close contact** with people suffering from a fever and cough



**Frequently clean hands** by using alcohol-based hand rub or soap and water



**Avoid touching eyes, nose or mouth**

# **COVID-19 PREPAREDNESS AND RESPONSE**

***(from the Office of the RI President)***



Dear Fellow Rotarian,

The COVID-19 coronavirus is affecting every aspect of our lives in real time, and this puts Rotarians in an unfamiliar place. As People of Action, we are most comfortable when we are fully engaged in the world – moving freely, meeting openly, and offering helping hands. These are very difficult times for people who, like us, are at our best when we are learning, growing, and serving—together.

We are also leaders in our communities, and these times call for leadership. In many ways, this also is our time. We have proven abilities to reach out and collaborate to offer immediate help to people in need at a rapid pace. These are precisely the skills needed all over the world today. The global effort against COVID-19 depends on actions taken in every country. Rotary has the unique ability to help improve those efforts in every community and every country.

Using all the technology we have at our disposal, we as Rotarians can continue to reach out and collaborate on big projects with Rotary clubs, Rotaractors, and Interactors. There are a number of examples where Rotary clubs are helping health authorities communicate best practices or provide needed equipment or support that have been shared with our leaders around the world.

As Rotary's president and president-elect, we have been thinking of these issues very seriously in regard to upcoming Rotary events. As you may be aware, we have made the difficult decision to cancel two Rotary Presidential Conferences honoring our relationship with the United Nations- one in Paris, another in Rome. In the near term, we recommend that Rotary districts and clubs cancel or postpone meetings or events following the advice of national and local health officials.

We know that clubs and districts are seizing the opportunity to become leaders in their communities and are making better use of technology in this time of need. For example, a Rotary e-club in Italy held a live online session about COVID-19 awareness, a Taiwan club worked with companies and a pharmacy association to donate 1,600 bottles of hand sanitizer to the city of Ji-Long, and Rotary clubs in Sri Lanka helped upgrade software and hardware for the health promotion bureau to assist its social messaging.

We cannot know quite yet what path this virus will take. We know we can play a role to help "flatten the curve," reducing the number of cases in the short term to allow our health systems to address this issue. If the collective global effort helps bring the situation under control, then we hope to re-embrace our core values at the 2020 Rotary Convention in Honolulu. Our time together will have greater meaning and purpose than ever.

Please know that we are taking a close, continuing look at our plans for the convention in June to make sure all attendees' safety will be protected. We are following the lead of the world's most trusted sources, including the World Health Organization (WHO) and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, for their guidance. We want you to be able to make decisions about what is best for you and your families in terms of attending this year's event.

In the meantime, this is an opportunity for us to demonstrate that Rotary Connects the World in innovative ways. We should be closely following the advice of the WHO and local health authorities. Again, this includes canceling Rotary club events and meetings in the short term to reduce unnecessary interactions that could cause infections. We can put a greater emphasis on the work we do in our communities by helping our less fortunate neighbors cope with the effects of isolation and fear, or by supporting our health authorities to address this situation.

This is an unprecedented challenge for nearly all of us. But it is also an opportunity for Rotarians to find new, meaningful ways to lead individuals and communities to connect and do good in the world.

We have never been prouder to be part of an organization that does so much to protect and strengthen our communities, at home and across the globe.

Achievements will be compared with membership figures from 1 July 2019 and will be recognized after the 1 July 2020 numbers are final, on 15 August 2020.

## THE BRIEF HISTORY OF ROTARY CLUB OF CEBU PORT CENTER



In the beginning were five men and one vision...

In a historic series of preparative meetings in May 1985, Felipe Casing, Antonio Elumir, Manny Granada, Jacinto Jamero and Rey Sanggalang envisioned the Port Center of Cebu as a vantage ground from where a band of noble men shall rise by the name of Rotary, in a game of service to humanity.

What followed was a marathon dash in establishing a Rotary Club in the Cebu Port District to obtain a charter from then District 3860 Governor Jose "Joe" Lardizabal whose term was to conclude very soon. On the forefront was Pepe Casing, a Cebu Fuente Rotarian.

It was in the special day of June 6, 1985 when a charter was granted to a club that was christened a most befitting name: The "ROTARY CLUB OF CEBU PORT CENTER".

The newfound organization that was once a nucleus of five visionaries became a club of 34 gentlemen who convened charter members in the middle of June 1985 to bear witness to the first set of officers. Antonio "Jun" Elumir, who was then the Phil. Ports Authority Officer, was the Charter President. With him at the helm was Manuel "Manny" Granada, the charter vice-president, Jacinto "Boy" Jamero and "Rey" Sanggalang were the charter secretary and charter treasurer, respectively. These gentlemen who were the prime movers for the organization of our club were equally accorded those distinct and rare positions which can only happen once in a history of a club.

Pepe Casing was honored with the venerable title of "Godfather".

The pioneering charter members, most of who are still with the RCCPC, instilled the club's love for sports – golf, bowling and tennis – in that order of popularity among its members. An incessant talk about these sports keeps alive the fellowship that follows its weekly meeting every Monday evening. Do not be surprised if you hear other people mistakenly refer to RCCPC as the Rotary Club of Cebu "Sports Center".

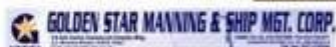
