We are praying that the lifting of ECQ by May 15 is smoother as we downgrade towards the next category called General Community Quarantine or GCQ. 

To my beloved Rotarians of **District 3860**,

Just this morning, at 9:00 am, I was able to connect myself via ZOOM with our **R.I. President MARK MALONEY** for an hour, with other DG's in the Philippines, and Rotary Officers in Parramatta headed by Andrew Best, on the direction of Rotary in the midst of the Covit 19 pandemic that has affected most if not all the lives of Rotarians.

The following are the salient points shared to us:

- 1. **MEETINGS** Clubs are encouraged to stay connected using technology, such as ZOOM, Facebook, messenger, to sustain the burning desire to do service and fellowship. The future of Rotary will be using digital apps and social media platforms.
- 2. **CLUB R. I. DUES** Clubs who may have difficulty collecting and paying dues because the E.C.Q. restriction must seek request relief from Paramatta on a case-to-case basis.
  - a. There will be no reduction of R.I. dues for Rotary 2020-21, as of this moment pending approval of the incoming RY 2020-21 Board for consideration.
- 3. **MEMBERSHIP** Rotary, through the District Governors, will prioritize more on RETENTION, expecting that with this pandemic, some 5% or less may not continue.
- 4. **GRANTS** Pending applications specifically for Covit 19 projects by some Districts like ours, may have to wait till some DDF savings of other Districts may have been pooled together.
  - a. As to the Global Grants, the 30% foreign sister-club requirement has been waived momentarily on Covit 19 related projects. Applications has been prioritized by TRF and approved within days, as experienced by some Districts in the Philippines. Coordinate with your DRFC Chair and Grants Co-Chair.

In behalf of our **R.I. President Mark Maloney**, I extend my heartfelt appreciation and gratitude to Clubs, such as the **RC Cebu**, for leading our District in using technology in their on-going regular weekly meetings and stayed connected in raising funds for Covit 19 projects. We, the Champion Rotarians, will be best remembered most for making a significance in saving many lives during this once-in-a-lifetime Crisis for our act of kindness.

God will bless us by being SAFE and healthy with our respective families.

- 1- Every tradegy brings a silver lining & we just have to work on making Rotary work better in this difficult situation.
- 2- Rotary International is operationally & financially sound. We're expecting drop in membership but it should be not more than 5% (our lowest during the 1930 depression).
- 3- We work on retention. Keep clubs going. Don't let clubs "languish" (i.e. no meetings, activities, communication). Engage new Rotarians (2 y/o & below).
- 4-No blanket relief from RI Dues but RI will work with clubs having financial difficulties (extend payment terms/ sched- case-to-case basis).
- 5- RI HQ is working harder than before & needs our (financial) support.
- 6-We have opportunity to create new culture & step up in this new environment. Clubs can now be more flexible & innovative. It's up to us leaders to help clubs find ways do their service activities in the new situation.
- 7-"Never waste a good crisis" (Winston Churchill) there are great opportunities in this current crisis & we will emerge as a better organization after this.

### THE BRIEF HISTORY OF ROTARY CLUB OF CEBU PORT CENTER



In the beginning were five men and one vision...

In a historic series of preparative meetings in May 1985, Felipe Casing, Antonio Elumir, Manny Granada, Jacinto Jamero and Rey Sanggalang envisioned the Port Center of Cebu as a vantage ground from where a band of noble men shall rise by the name of Rotary, in a game of service to humanity.

What followed was a marathon dash in establishing a Rotary Club in the Cebu Port District to obtain a charter from then District 3860 Governor Jose "Joe" Lardizabal whose term was to conclude very soon. On the forefront was Pepe Casing, a Cebu Fuente Rotarian.

It was in the special day of June 6, 1985 when a charter was granted to a club that was christened a most befitting name: The "ROTARY CLUB OF CEBU PORT CENTER".

The newfound organization that was once a nucleus of five visionaries became a club of 34 gentlemen who convened charter members in the middle of June 1985 to bear witness to the first set of officers. Antonio "Jun" Elumir, who was then the Phil. Ports Authority Officer, was the Charter President. With him at the helm was Manuel "Manny" Granada, the charter vice-president, Jacinto "Boy" Jamero and "Rey" Sanggalang were the charter secretary and charter treasurer, respectively. These gentlemen who were the prime movers for the organization of our club were equally accorded those distinct and rare positions which can only happen once in a history of a club.

Pepe Casing was honored with the venerable title of "Godfather". The pioneering charter members, most of who are still with the RCCPC, instilled the club's love for sports – golf, bowling and tennis – in that order of popularity among its members. An incessant talk about these sports keeps alive the fellowship that follows its weekly meeting every Monday evening. Do not be surprised if you hear other people mistakenly refer to RCCPC as the Rotary Club of Cebu "Sports Center".
