It is timely and relevant since they need more new PPEs as the number of Covid positive patients are rising in Cebu City. I already purchased the PPEs last Friday, July 10, 2020, from our previous supplier of PPEs. My Special thanks goes to PP George Hong and Spouse Jojo Hong for this initiative. July 2020

This does not seem like a time for great optimism, but it has to be. Long before Rotary was founded, the world dealt with great crises that tested humankind's ability to progress and endure. In the age of Rotary, the world has faced many more catastrophes; however, we have survived, and every step of the way, Rotary has helped the world heal.

Every great challenge is an opportunity for renewal and growth. I revealed the theme of Rotary Opens Opportunities at the International Assembly in San Diego just as the COVID-19 crisis was beginning, but these are words that I have

believed for many years.

Rotary is not just a club that you join; it is an invitation to endless opportunities. We believe in creating opportunities for others and for ourselves. We believe that our acts of service, large and small, generate opportunities for people who need our help, and that Rotary opens opportunities for us to live a richer, more meaningful life, with friends around the world, based on our core values.

Governments and institutions are gaining a greater appreciation for the types of public health partnerships that are critical to our work. People stuck at home, eager for greater connections and hungry to help their communities, are now embracing the values we have promoted since our beginning.

All of this is positive news, but just because there are greater opportunities than ever for Rotary to thrive does not guarantee that we will succeed. The world is changing rapidly — and was doing so even before this crisis. People were starting to move away from regular lunch meetings and toward online gatherings. Friendships were being cultivated and revived in social media relationships even before most of our meetings moved to Zoom and Skype. Younger generations have a strong desire to serve — but have questioned whether they could play a meaningful role in organizations like Rotary or whether they might make a bigger impact forming different types of connections. Now is the time to put everything on the table, test new approaches, and prepare Rotary for the future.

The COVID-19 crisis has forced all of us to adapt. This is good, and our new Action Plan specifically calls on us to improve our ability to adapt. But adaptation is not enough. We need to change, and change dramatically, if we are to face the challenges of this new age and provide the Rotary the world so desperately needs.

This is our great challenge, not just in the next year but into the foreseeable future. It is up to us to remake Rotary for these new times — to wholeheartedly embrace the ideas, energy, and commitment of young people eager to find an outlet for idealism. We must become an organization fully enmeshed in the digital age, not one that simply looks for online ways to keep doing what we have always done.


The world needs Rotary now more than ever. It is up to us to make sure that *Rotary Opens Opportunities* for generations to come.

RCCPC Brief History

In the beginning were five men and one vision... In a historic series of preparative meetings in May 1985, Felipe Casing, Antonio Elumir, Manny Granada, Jacinto Jamero and Rey Sanggalang envisioned the Port Center of Cebu as a vantage ground from where a band of noble men shall rise by the name of Rotary, in a game of service to humanity.

What followed was a marathon dash in establishing a Rotary Club in the Cebu Port District to obtain a charter from then District 3860 Governor Jose "Joe" Lardizabal whose term was to conclude very soon. On the forefront was Pepe Casing, a Cebu Fuente Rotarian. It was in the special day of June 6, 1985 when a charter was granted to a club that was christened a most befitting name: The "ROTARY CLUB OF CEBU PORT CENTER".

The newfound organization that was once a nucleus of five visionaries became a club of 34 gentlemen who convened charter members in the middle of June 1985 to bear witness to the first set of officers. Antonio "Jun" Elumir, who was then the Phil. Ports Authority Officer, was the Charter President. With him at the helm was Manuel "Manny" Granada, the charter vice-president, Jacinto "Boy" Jamero and "Rey" Sanggalang were the charter secretary and charter treasurer, respectively. These gentlemen who were the prime movers for the organization of our club were equally accorded those distinct and rare positions which can only happen once in a history of a club.

Pepe Casing was honored with the venerable title of "Godfather".

HIGHLIGHTS AND RECENT UPDATES ON COVID-19

As of July 9, 2020

- DOH recorded 37,492 active cases with the majority of the patients exhibiting mild symptoms (34,654; 92.4%) while 100 patients are in critical condition (0.3%).
- A total of 118,995 Returning Overseas Filipino arrived (Land-based: 52,678; Sea-based: 66,317). Of these, 112,463 were released from facility quarantine (Land-based: 48,194; Sea-based: 64,269). Among the Returning Overseas Filipino, 2,924 were confirmed COVID-19 (Land-based:1,556; Sea-based: 1,368). Among the confirmed COVID-19 ROF, 718 are currently admitted (Land-based: 459; Sea-based: 259); 2171 recovered; and 1 has died.
- A total of 291 donations to the Department of Health were facilitated by the Donations Team from both foreign and local donors. One hundred ninety-nine (199) transactions, representing 67.94%, have already been completed, of which no donation was delivered today. The team is currently facilitating 68 foreign donations and 24 local donations, while no transaction is on hold.
- The DOH has deployed 334 post-residency physicians and redeployed 1,295 NDP nurses in DOH and LGU hospitals handling COVID-19 cases. In addition, there are 7,349 NDP nurses deployed in their respective communities who are involved in contact tracing and specimen collection (swabbing) and 3,471 public health associates who play active roles in contact tracing and surveillance. Other HRH who are in their assigned areas continue to provide essential health services in primary care and are also engaged in COVID-19 response, with focus on prevention of spread and surveillance in communities.





CONFIRMED DEATHS BY DATE OF DEATH (NATIONWIDE)







2. The cases from the "NCR" graph have been separated from cases of the "Luzon" graph.






