Today in the history of Cebu, "On **October 12, 1870**, Birth in Cebu, of Leoncio Avila (1870- 1911), editor of Ang Suga, composer and playwright."- Dr. Resil Mojares

Welcome everyone to our weekly meeting. In Rotary, **October is Economic and Community Development Month.** Rotary supports investments in people to create measurable and enduring economic improvement in their lives and communities. The Rotary Foundation enables Rotarians to invest in people by creating sustainable, measurable and long-term economic improvements in their communities and livelihoods by:

Beatisula, currently pursuing his Doctor og Science in Civil Engineering Major in Geothechnical Engineering at the Atlantic International University, Honolulu, Hawaii, USA, obtained his Master of Science in Civil Engineering Major in Structural Engineering at the University of the Philippines, Diliman (1997), and his Bachelor's degree in Civil Engineering at the Ateneo de Davao University, Davao city (1992).

He is the President of C.H. BEATISULA, INC. a Soil Testing Company with Specialty Services in Structural Engineering and Geotechnical Engineering based in Davao City. He started the Company in 1998 and elevated the Company to be

"A Premier Soil Testing Company in the Philippines." At Present, it has the Largest Fleet of Drilling Rigs and Logistics operating in Mindanao. The range of services of the Company is Subsurface Soil Exploration, Soil Testing, Geotechnical Evaluation, Structural Analysis, Structural Design, and Preparation of Structural Plans.

As an **Engineer**, he has more than 21 years of active practice in the field of structural Engineering and Geotechnical Engineering. He is the Accredited Specialist to both Specializations by the Philippines Institute of Civil Engineers Specialty Division.

He is a **Fellow** of the Philippine Institute of Civil Engineers (PICE) and elected as one of the 2017 National Directors and 2017 President of the PICE Davao City Chapter. He is a regular member of the Association of Structural Engineers of the Philippines (ASEP), American Society of Civil Engineers (ACSE), Geodetic Engineers of the Philippines (GEP), and a founding member of the Structural Engineers Association of Davao (SEAD).

He is a former Professor of Civil Engineering at the School of Engineering and Architecture of the Ateneo De Davao University from 1995 to 2015 and a Chairman of the Department of Civil engineering from 1998 to 2000







# **RCCPC Brief History**

In the beginning were five men and one vision...

In a historic series of preparative meetings in May 1985, Felipe Casing, Antonio Elumir, Manny Granada, Jacinto Jamero and Rey Sanggalang envisioned the Port Center of Cebu as a vantage ground from where a band of noble men shall rise by the name of Rotary, in a game of service to humanity.

What followed was a marathon dash in establishing a Rotary Club in the Cebu Port District to obtain a charter from then District 3860 Governor Jose "Joe" Lardizabal whose term was to conclude very soon. On the forefront was Pepe Casing, a Cebu Fuente Rotarian.

It was in the special day of June 6, 1985 when a charter was granted to a club that was christened a most befitting name: The "ROTARY CLUB OF CEBU PORT CENTER".

The newfound organization that was once a nucleus of five visionaries became a club of 34 gentlemen who convened charter members in the middle of June 1985 to bear witness to the first set of officers. Antonio "Jun" Elumir, who was then the Phil. Ports Authority Officer, was the Charter President. With him at the helm was Manuel "Manny" Granada, the charter vice-president, Jacinto "Boy" Jamero and "Rey" Sanggalang were the charter secretary and charter treasurer, respectively. These gentlemen who were the prime movers for the organization of our club were equally accorded those distinct and rare positions which can only happen once in a history of a club. Pepe Casing was honored with the venerable title of "Godfather".

#### **RECENT UPDATES ON COVID-19**

As of October 10, 2020

- DOH recorded 54,594 active cases with the majority of the patients exhibiting mild symptoms (46,845; 85.8%) while 1,581 patients are in critical condition (2.9%).
- DOH recorded 10,178 health care workers positive for COVID-19. Of these, 9,562 (93.9%) have recovered, 63 (0.6%) have died and 553 (5.4%) were active cases. Of these active cases, 350 (63.3%) were mild cases, 170 (30.7%) were asymptomatic, 22 (4.0%) in severe condition and 11 in critical condition (2.0%).
- A total of 433,265 Returning Overseas Filipinos (ROFs) have arrived in the country (Land-based: 240,773; Sea-based: 190,906; and Transferees from Sabah 1,586). Of these, 429,225 were released from facility quarantine (Land-based: 238,299; Sea-based: 189,340; and Sabah: 1,586). Among the ROFs, 9,038 were confirmed COVID-19 patients (Land-based: 4,770; Sea-based: 4,268). Among these, 701 are currently admitted, 8,319 have already recovered; and 5 have died.
- A total of 314 donations to the Department of Health were facilitated by the Donations Team from both foreign and local donors. There were 215 transactions, representing 68.47%, which have already been completed. The team is currently facilitating 73 foreign donations and 26 local donations, while no transaction is on hold.

#### TREATMENT

For case management of COVID-19 patients, healthcare providers are advised to adhere to the existing <u>PSMID Guidelines</u>.

#### **POLICY IN-FOCUS**

The Department of Health (DOH) has issued Department Memorandum (DM) Number 2020-0429<sup>1</sup>, "Guidance on Ventilation for COVID-19 Mitigation" in order to address possible administrative and engineering controls that can be utilized in enclosed, indoor spaces to improve ventilation and lessen transmission of pathogens.

This interim document was developed to update the current non-pharmaceutical interventions against the disease and discuss ventilation, administrative and engineering controls, and their role in reducing viral transmission in this pandemic.

#### **BEHAVIORAL MESSAGES**

- Even during the transition to the New Normal era, relevant health concerns should also be prioritized. In light of the National Mental Health Week celebration (October 11-17, 2020), people are encouraged to stay mentally and physically healthy by engaging in healthy activities that you enjoy and find relaxing. If one must stay home or in isolation, maintaining a healthy lifestyle, which includes a daily routine, exercise, eating healthy food, getting enough rest and good sleep, praying or finding quiet time for yourself, and enjoying moments with family and loved ones, can help maintain positive mental health during this time.
- It is okay not to feel okay. In situations of extreme stress, one
  can expect not to feel okay. Talking or venting feelings to
  somebody you trust is helpful in overcoming negative feelings due
  to stress. Talking with a mental health professional is also okay –
  people should not be afraid of feeling judged and stigmatized for
  doing so.
- Healthcare workers may be subjected to stigma due to the nature of their work at this time, notwithstanding their possible exposure to the virus itself. They may experience stigma from different sectors of society – even among their own families, close friends, co-workers and law enforcers. This will make an already challenging and stressful situation worse and can interfere with their ability to serve. We must care for them as we would any member of our society.

#### HOW DO YOU REMAIN SAFE AND HEALTHY AMIDST THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC?
