RI PRESIDENT'S REPORT-JAN. 2021

January is finally here. As we look forward to 2021, our thinking doesn't have to stop at the end of these 365 days. Are you thinking ahead about what you will be doing in 2022, 2023, and beyond?

We cannot foresee the future, but we can steer ourselves where we want to go. I think it is important that every Rotary club hold a strategic meeting at least once a year. Past RI Director Greg Yank, who has a lot of experience working with clubs on their plans, shares his viewpoint.

A famous aphorism states, "By failing to prepare, you are preparing to fail." Planning is essential to achieving success in all areas of life, including Rotary, and we're getting better at it every year. Strategic planning for Rotary clubs works. I have helped many clubs find that pathway by working with them to build what I call a blueprint, a multiyear plan that answers the fundamental question: "What is our vision for our club?" The best plans I have seen are those that are focused, when a club concentrates its resources on the best opportunities it has. Your Rotary club cannot be all things to its members and to the community it serves; it has limited human, financial, and time resources. A successful plan factors in assets and limitations to chart the desired pathway for your members.

Begin building a multiyear strategic plan by brainstorming with your club, asking, "What are our initiatives and priorities for the next two to three years?" Document your answers using action-oriented language that is specific, concrete, and measurable about the goals you want to achieve.

Next, narrow down your initiatives to a core set of three to five priorities. Your club will then develop specific objectives for each initiative, outlining who will be involved, key milestones of achievement, how progress will be tracked, and a timeline for completion. Keep your plan short and simple.

Then go out and do it. Review the progress you make toward accomplishing the initiatives, and revise as needed at least once a year. Rotary has a solid template to assist clubs in their planning, which you can find at my.rotary.org/en/document/strategic-planning-guide.

We want to enrich and enliven our clubs with new discussions and ideas. But how do we attract the diverse professionals, from different backgrounds, ages, and experiences, who are all driven by as strong a sense of integrity as we are?

When we do that — as we engage members in vibrant and active clubs that not only have fun but also serve their communities with projects that have real and lasting impact — our clubs grow stronger. And when we discover what makes our own clubs unique and build upon those core values in all our efforts, *Rotary Opens Opportunities* to enrich the lives of everyone.

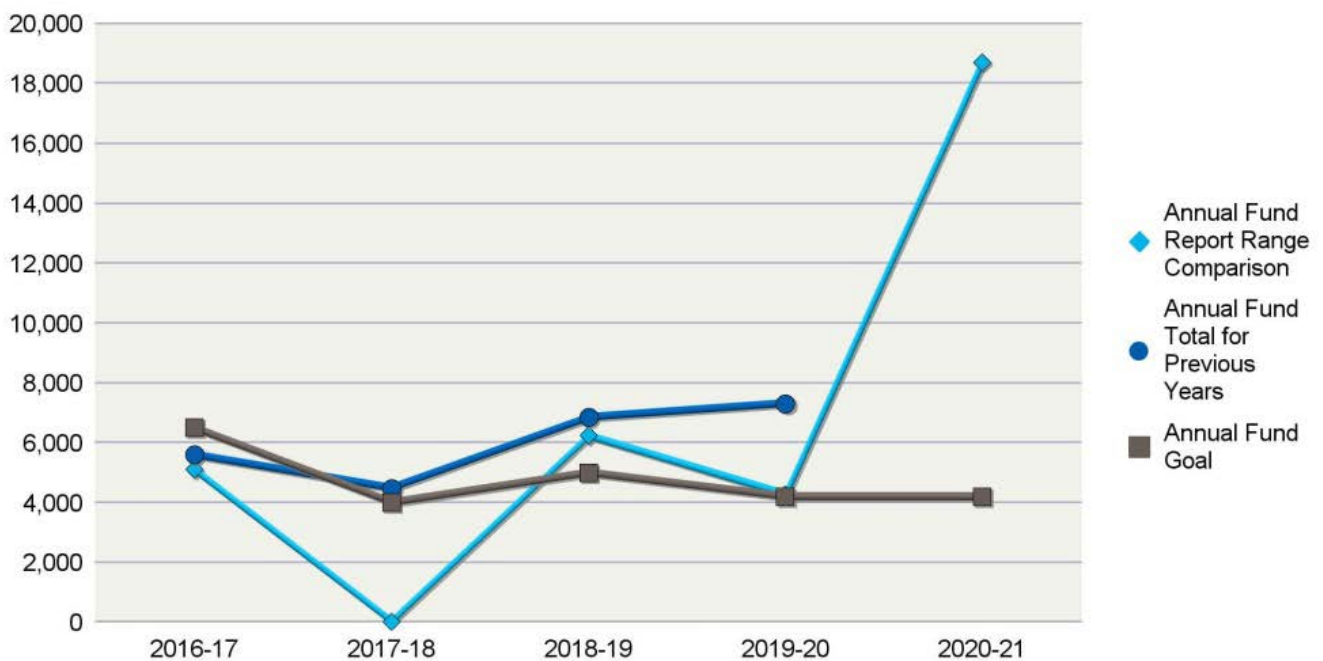

RCCPC Brief History

In the beginning were five men and one vision...

In a historic series of preparative meetings in May 1985, Felipe Casing, Antonio Elumir, Manny Granada, Jacinto Jamero and Rey Sanggalang envisioned the Port Center of Cebu as a vantage ground from where a band of noble men shall rise by the name of Rotary, in a game of service to humanity.

What followed was a marathon dash in establishing a Rotary Club in the Cebu Port District to obtain a charter from then District 3860 Governor Jose "Joe" Lardizabal whose term was to conclude very soon. On the forefront was Pepe Casing, a Cebu Fuente Rotarian.

It was in the special day of June 6, 1985 when a charter was granted to a club that was christened a most befitting name: The "ROTARY CLUB OF CEBU PORT CENTER".

The newfound organization that was once a nucleus of five visionaries became a club of 34 gentlemen who convened charter members in the middle of June 1985 to bear witness to the first set of officers. Antonio "Jun" Elumir, who was then the Phil. Ports Authority Officer, was the Charter President. With him at the helm was Manuel "Manny" Granada, the charter vice-president, Jacinto "Boy" Jamero and "Rey" Sanggalang were the charter secretary and charter treasurer, respectively. These gentlemen who were the prime movers for the organization of our club were equally accorded those distinct and rare positions which can only happen once in a history of a club.

Pepe Casing was honored with the venerable title of "Godfather".

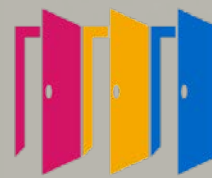

RECENT UPDATES ON COVID-19

As of November 7, 2020

- DOH recorded **36,260 active cases** with the majority of the patients exhibiting **mild symptoms** (30,362; 83.7%) while **1,456 patients** are in **critical condition** (4.0%).
- DOH recorded **11,438 health care workers** positive for COVID-19. Of these, **11,058** (96.7%) have recovered, 71 (0.6%) have died and 309 (2.7%) were active cases. Of these active cases, 149 (48.2%) were mild cases, 129 (41.7%) were asymptomatic, 20 (6.5%) in severe condition and 11 in critical condition (3.6%).
- A total of **564,248 Returning Overseas Filipinos (ROFs)** have arrived in the country (Land-based: 318,992; Sea-based: 243,670; and Transferees from Sabah 1,586). Of these, **560,352 were released from facility quarantine** (Land-based: 316,839; Sea-based: 241,927; and Sabah: 1,586). Among the ROFs, **9,874 were confirmed COVID-19 patients** (Land-based: 6,197; Sea-based: 3,677). Among these, 368 are currently admitted, 9,390 have already recovered; and 5 have died.
- A total of **315 donations** to the Department of Health were facilitated by the Donations Team from both foreign and local donors. There were 216 transactions, representing 63.9%, which have already been completed. The team is currently facilitating 73 foreign donations and 26 local donations, while no transaction is on hold.

POLICY IN-FOCUS

The Department of Health has issued Department Memorandum (DM) No. 2020 – 0186-A¹, Amendment to the Department Memorandum No. 2020-0186 entitled “Interim Guidelines on the Operations of Converted Public and Private Spaces into Temporary Treatment and Monitoring Facilities (TTMFs) for COVID-19”, to provide guidance on the operations of all TTMEF's established as a strategy to manage the surge of COVID-19 Cases and enhance the response for COVID-19 care.

This interim guideline was issued to include the recent updates on the clinical practice guidelines for the management of COVID19 cases in different contexts, and align the current guidelines in terms of the day to day operations of TTMFs.

BEHAVIORAL MESSAGES

- Household members should educate themselves about COVID-19 symptoms and preventing the spread of COVID-19 in homes. Practice routine cleaning of frequently touched surfaces like tables, doorknobs, light switches, handles, desks, toilets, faucets, sinks, coins, cellphones, etc., with household cleaners that are appropriate for the surface.
- Adults of any age with certain underlying medical conditions like hypertension and diabetes are at increased risk for severe illness from the virus that causes COVID-19. Severe illness from COVID-19 is defined as hospitalization, admission to the ICU, intubation or mechanical ventilation, or death. The best way to protect yourself and to help reduce the spread of the virus that causes COVID-19 is to limit your interactions with other people as much as possible. Take precautions to prevent getting COVID-19 when you do interact with others. Remember the importance of staying physically active and practicing healthy habits to cope with stress.
- Minimum health standards are essential to keep everyone healthy and safe, with more public transportation will already be available. Commuters are advised to maintain physical distancing inside the vehicle and report overcrowding to the Department of Transportation. Travelers should wear face masks at all times, practice hand hygiene and proper coughing manners. Those who have illnesses are discouraged from commuting to avoid possible spread of disease. Call DOH have telemedicine hotlines: 02-894-COVID (02-894-26843) and 1555, if you need medical advice. Licensed and certified doctors will provide telemedicine consultations.



HOW DO YOU REMAIN SAFE AND HEALTHY AMIDST THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC?

ALWAYS remember and practice the following:



Wash hands with soap and water for 20 seconds or more (Try singing the chorus of your favorite song while washing).



Use a hand sanitizer with 70% alcohol if you can't wash your hands for 20 seconds or more.



Avoid touching your face, especially your mouth, eyes, nose.



Make sure you keep 1 meter distance from other people.



Avoid touching things that many people touch like door handles, tables, chairs, etc.



Wear a mask while outside.



Frequently clean surfaces in your house, work or business. This includes tables, doorknobs, light switches, countertops, handles, desks, phones, keys, keyboards, toilets, faucets, and sinks.



Disinfect using a bleach solution (7 tablespoons [100 mL] bleach for 1 liter of clean water).



Disinfect your most used things (like phone, keys, eyeglasses, keyboard, etc.) with 70% alcohol solution.

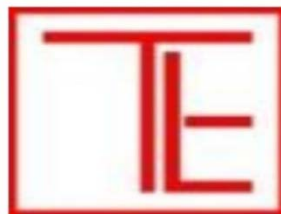
