

# RI PRESIDENT'S

## REPORT-JAN. 2021

January is finally here. As we look forward to 2021, our thinking doesn't have to stop at the end of these 365 days. Are you thinking ahead about what you will be doing in 2022, 2023, and beyond?

We cannot foresee the future, but we can steer ourselves where we want to go. I think it is important that every Rotary club hold a strategic meeting at least once a year. Past RI Director Greg Yank, who has a lot of experience working with clubs on their plans, shares his viewpoint.

A famous aphorism states, "By failing to prepare, you are preparing to fail." Planning is essential to achieving success in all areas of life, including Rotary, and we're getting better at it every year. Strategic planning for Rotary clubs works. I have helped many clubs find that pathway by working with them to build what I call a blueprint, a multiyear plan that answers the fundamental question: "What is our vision for our club?" The best plans I have seen are those that are focused, when a club concentrates its resources on the best opportunities it has. Your Rotary club cannot be all things to its members and to the community it serves; it has limited human, financial, and time resources. A successful plan factors in assets and limitations to chart the desired pathway for your members.

Begin building a multiyear strategic plan by brainstorming with your club, asking, "What are our initiatives and priorities for the next two to three years?" Document your answers using action-oriented language that is specific, concrete, and measurable about the goals you want to achieve.

Next, narrow down your initiatives to a core set of three to five priorities. Your club will then develop specific objectives for each initiative, outlining who will be involved, key milestones of achievement, how progress will be tracked, and a timeline for completion. Keep your plan short and simple.

Then go out and do it. Review the progress you make toward accomplishing the initiatives, and revise as needed at least once a year. Rotary has a solid template to assist clubs in their planning, which you can find at my.rotary.org/en/document/strategic-planning-guide.





Can be kept in a standard refrigerator for up to 5 days 2 doses, 3 weeks apart



## Moderna

94.1% efficacy mRNA-based

Can be kept in a standard refrigerator for up to 30 days 2 doses, 4 weeks apart



## Astrazeneca

70% efficacy Adenovirus vector

Can be kept in a standard refrigerator for at least 6 months 2 doses, 4 weeks apart



## SinoVac

50 to 90% efficacy Inactivated virus Refrigerated at 2C to 8C. Lifespan unknown. 2 doses, 2 weeks apart



# COUID UPDATE

## Covid-19 vaccine: your questions answered

Information from US CDC

Can the vaccine make me sick with Covid-19?

#### NO

→ None of the authorised/ recommended vaccines in US (\*Pfizer/BioNTech and Moderna) contain the live virus that causes COVID-19

After vaccination, will I test positive for Covid-19 on a viral test?

#### NO

→ None of the authorised/ recommended vaccines\* can cause positive viral tests, used to detect current infections



Will the vaccine alter my DNA?

→ The Covid-19 messenger RNA vaccines do not change or interact with the DNA in any way

→ mRNA vaccines teach cells to make proteins that trigger an immune response, but never enter the cell nucleus. where the DNA is kept

Does the vaccine protect me from getting sick with Covid-19?

#### YES \*\*


- → The vaccine teaches the immune system to recognise/fight the virus that causes Covid-19
- → \*\*Vaccines currently available have effectiveness range from 60 to 95%. Experts are still collecting data on the effects of the vaccines

If I recovered from Covid-19, do I still need a vaccine?

#### YES

→ There are severe health risks associated with Covid-19. and reinfection is possible

## VACCINATION -



→ May cause symptoms (like fever), a normal sign that the body is building protection against the Covid-19 virus

→ It is possible a person can be infected with the virus just before or just after vaccination and still get sick

→ This is because vaccine has not had enough time to provide protection





## **RCCPC Brief History**

In the beginning were five men and one vision...
In a historic series of preparative meetings in May 1985, Felipe Casing, Antonio Elumir, Manny Granada, Jacinto Jamero and Rey Sanggalang envisioned the Port Center of Cebu as a vantage ground from where a band of noble men shall rise by the name of Rotary, in a game of service to humanity.

What followed was a marathon dash in establishing a Rotary Club in the Cebu Port District to obtain a charter from then District 3860 Governor Jose "Joe" Lardizabal whose term was to conclude very soon. On the forefront was Pepe Casing, a Cebu Fuente Rotarian.

It was in the special day of June 6, 1985 when a charter was granted to a club that was christened a most befitting name:

The "ROTARY CLUB OF CEBU PORT CENTER".

The newfound organization that was once a nucleus of five visionaries became a club of 34 gentlemen who convened charter members in the middle of June 1985 to bear witness to the first set of officers. Antonio "Jun" Elumir, who was then the Phil. Ports Authority Officer, was the Charter President. With him at the helm was Manuel "Manny" Granada, the charter vice-president, Jacinto "Boy" Jamero and "Rey" Sanggalang were the charter secretary and charter treasurer, respectively. These gentlemen who were the prime movers for the organization of our club were equally accorded those distinct and rare positions
