# **R.I. PRESIDENT'S**

As someone who knows firsthand the great leadership potential of Rotaractors, I always look forward to World Rotaract Week, which we are celebrating from 8 to 14 March. Rotaractors are the focus of all three of my presidential conferences this year, and I was proud when, two years ago, the Council on Legislation voted to elevate Rotaract by including Rotaract clubs as members of Rotary International. Before that, the Council had already made dual membership possible, and shortly after, the Board of Directors decided to do away with Rotaract's age limits.

But we are only just embarking on our journey together. Partnering effectively doesn't happen by itself. It requires both sides to be open and to understand the value of cross-generational alliances. Louie De Real, a dual member of Rotaract and Rotary, explains.

Joint virtual meetings have helped Rotaractors introduce Rotarians to new ideas and tools, pioneering unique ways for clubs to collaborate. In the case of pandemic and disaster response, Rotaract clubs used social media to coordinate efforts, drive information, and fundraise, while Rotary clubs used their networks and resources to amplify support, provide logistics, and bring the goods and services to communities.

Rotaractors' innovative virtual engagement and professional development activities inspired Rotarians to support and follow suit. The pandemic made Rotaract clubs realize that we can immediately connect and partner with Rotary clubs through virtual platforms. With constant collaboration, we realize that Rotary and Rotaract indeed complement each other --- that we are part of a single organization with shared goals.

Both sides add value. Rotarians can be mentors and service partners to Rotaractors, while Rotaractors can demonstrate to Rotarians that difficult jobs can be simplified and limitations can be surpassed through digital approaches. This synergy motivates Rotaractors to become future Rotarians: I joined Rotary because Rotarians gave me memorable membership experiences through inspirational moments of collaboration. I needed to be a Rotarian to inspire Rotaractors the same way, now and in the future.







#### Covid-19 vaccine: your questions answered

Information from US CDC

Can the vaccine make me sick with Covid-19?

#### NO

→ None of the authorised/ recommended vaccines in US (\*Pfizer/BioNTech and Moderna) contain the live virus that causes COVID-19

After vaccination, will I test positive for Covid-19 on a viral test?

#### NO

→ None of the authorised/ recommended vaccines\* can cause positive viral tests, used to detect current infections

#### Will the vaccine alter my DNA?

→ The Covid-19 messenger RNA vaccines do not change or interact with the DNA in any way → mRNA vaccines teach cells to make proteins that trigger an immune response, but never enter the cell nucleus, where the DNA is kept Does the vaccine protect me from getting sick with Covid-19?

#### YES \*\*

→ The vaccine teaches the immune system to recognise/fight the virus that causes Covid-19

→ \*\*Vaccines currently available have effectiveness range from 60 to 95%. Experts are still collecting data on the effects of the vaccines

If I recovered from Covid-19, do I still need a vaccine?

#### YES

→ There are severe health risks associated with Covid-19, and reinfection is possible

VACCINATION

→ After vaccination, the body takes a few weeks to build immunity → May cause symptoms (like fever), a normal sign that the body is building protection against the Covid-19 virus → It is possible a person can be infected with the virus just before or just after vaccination and still get sick

# Club of Cebu Port Centre Rotary Opens Opportunities RCCPC Brief History

Rotary (

In the beginning were five men and one vision... In a historic series of preparative meetings in May 1985, Felipe Casing, Antonio Elumir, Manny Granada, Jacinto Jamero and Rey Sanggalang envisioned the Port Center of Cebu as a vantage ground from where a band of noble men shall rise by the name of Rotary, in a game of service to humanity.

What followed was a marathon dash in establishing a Rotary Club in the Cebu Port District to obtain a charter from then District 3860 Governor Jose "Joe" Lardizabal whose term was to conclude very soon. On the forefront was Pepe Casing, a Cebu Fuente Rotarian.
It was in the special day of June 6, 1985 when a charter was granted to a club that was christened a most befitting name: The "ROTARY CLUB OF CEBU PORT CENTER".

The newfound organization that was once a nucleus of five visionaries became a club of 34 gentlemen who convened charter members in the middle of June 1985 to bear witness to the first set of officers. Antonio "Jun" Elumir, who was then the Phil. Ports Authority Officer, was the Charter President. With him at the helm was Manuel "Manny" Granada, the charter vice-president, Jacinto "Boy" Jamero and "Rey" Sanggalang were the charter secretary and charter treasurer, respectively. These gentlemen who were the prime movers for the organization of our club were equally accorded those distinct and rare positions which can only happen once in a history of a club.

Pepe Casing was honored with the venerable title of "Godfather".
