

Fellow Life-changing Rotarians, Welcome to our 5th General Membership meeting for October. This month's theme is Economic and Community Development.

As Rotarians and businessmen, we are directly involved in both Economic and Community Development. Fellow Rotarians, we know we are not getting any younger. As we age, we undeniably encounter the need to adapt to change in technology and innovations. Presently, the Millennials start to lead and join companies/organizations. With this, we have invited a special guest speaker, Mr. JB Bongo, who will talk about the topic, "Managing Millennials". This topic is just timely because we need to find productive ways to work across the generation gap. He will explain to us more the relevance and impact of the young millennial generations in our community and how we can work together in harmony. Our guest speaker will be formally introduced later.

Two years ago, on October 16 and 29, 2019, a strong earthquake struck Magsaysay, Davao Del Sur. Hundreds of residents fled their homes and sought refuge on safer grounds. Having been traumatized by almost hourly shaking, they stayed for temporary shelter in an open gymnasium in Barangay San Miguel Magsaysay. There were 63 families or 240 persons, composed of Indigenous People or Lumads. Recognizing the need for a dignified home of the Magsaysay residents, Rotary International District 3860 led by then DG Philip Tan worked in partnership with the local government of Magsaysay, to provide the 63 families shelter that they can call home and rebuild their lives. They called this project, "The Rotary Village" in Magsaysay, Davao Del Sur. District 3860 is making the Rotary Village since last year (2020) and there are now many houses built for the DISASTER VICTIMS. This project continues the leadership of now DG Anna Luisa Bumagat. In support of the district and of our advocacy to Economic and Community Development, our club pledged two houses to the District Rotary Village Disaster project in Magsaysay, Davao Del Sur.

I would like to thank the following Rotarians who supported this club's fundraising activity. In just three (3) days we were able to meet our target amount of Php 240,000 for two Rotary Houses.

R.I. President's Report (Oct 2021)

A quarter of the Rotary year is now behind us. I am sure you are helping Rotary to *grow more and do more*. And I hope you have already done your part for the Each One, Bring One initiative by introducing one person to Rotary.

Do you ever think about your earliest days as a Rotarian? I often do — because those first moments of discovering the power of service shaped who I am today. When I joined my Rotary club, our efforts focused on India's rural communities, where people were living without toilets, getting their drinking water from the same pond they bathed in, and sending their children to outdoor classrooms set up under a tree. The nearest health care provider often was miles away — and the services were inadequate. But after Rotary clubs carried out some service projects, the villages had toilets, clean drinking water, a classroom for early learning, and a nearby health care center.

The spark that Rotary kindled within me forced me to look beyond myself and embrace humanity. It made service a way of life and led me to a guiding principle I still stand by: Service is the rent I pay for the space I occupy on Earth.

If you feel the need to reignite the spark of service in yourself or your club, October — Community Economic Development Month — is a great time to do so. When we work to improve the lives of people in underserved communities — through, for example, projects that provide vocational training and access to financial resources — we help build and sustain local economic growth.

The need is great. According to the United Nations, 9 percent of the world's population — that's 700 million people, a majority of them in sub-Saharan Africa — live on less than \$1.90 a day. By supporting strong community development as well as entrepreneurs, we can help improve conditions for people in that region and others.

Your club can also promote economic development in your own community by expanding vocational training opportunities through local schools and community colleges, partnering with lenders to improve access to financial services, or working with a nonprofit that provides resources to entrepreneurs and connects them with the business community.

Of course, developing strong communities is impossible without strong public health. On 24 October, World Polio Day, we'll celebrate our tremendous progress in the effort to eradicate polio. But we also know the fight is not over. We still need your help raising funds and awareness to ensure that all children are immunized against polio. Please don't forget to activate your clubs on that important day and encourage them to donate here: **endpolio.org/world-polio-day.**

Service has been rewarding for me throughout my life. I know the same is true for many of you. Join me this month in becoming a good tenant of our planet by helping others to better themselves and their communities. Together, we can *Serve to Change Lives*.





THE HISTORY OF ROTARY CLUB OF CEBU PORT CENTER

In the beginning were five men and one vision...
In a historic series of preparative meetings in May 1985, Felipe
Casing, Antonio Elumir, Manny Granada, Jacinto Jamero and Rey
Sanggalang envisioned the Port Center of Cebu as a vantage
ground from where a band of noble men shall rise by the name of
Rotary, in a game of service to humanity.

What followed was a marathon dash in establishing a Rotary Club in the Cebu Port District to obtain a charter from then District 3860 Governor Jose "Joe" Lardizabal whose term was to conclude very soon. On the forefront was Pepe Casing, a Cebu Fuente Rotarian. It was in the special day of June 6, 1985 when a charter was granted to a club that was christened a most befitting name: The "ROTARY CLUB OF CEBU PORT CENTER".

The newfound organization that was once a nucleus of five visionaries became a club of 34 gentlemen who convened charter members in the middle of June 1985 to bear witness to the first set of officers. Antonio "Jun" Elumir, who was then the Phil. Ports Authority Officer, was the Charter President. With him at the helm was Manuel "Manny" Granada, the charter vice-president, Jacinto "Boy" Jamero and "Rey" Sanggalang were the charter secretary and charter treasurer, respectively. These gentlemen who were the prime movers for the organization of our club were equally accorded those distinct and rare positions which can only happen once in a history of a club.

Pepe Casing was honored with the venerable title of "Godfather".
