At the 2023 Rotary International Convention in Melbourne, I asked all Rotary members to become champions in our effort to illuminate mental health needs near and far. This includes helping one another feel more supported, advocating for mental health services, and building bridges with experts in the field to expand access to treatment.

It's an important task and a big ask. But it's also something that should feel familiar to every Rotary member — because everything we do is in the spirit of caring, giving, friendship, and compassion, and has been from the beginning of our organization.

We've grown into an amazing global network of 1.4 million interconnected community leaders — leaders who share a deep commitment to doing good in the world. But what makes Rotary powerful isn't just what we do for the communities we serve. We also support and empower each other, by creating a safe space for our members to bring their whole, authentic selves. We show each other comfort and care.

These connections are deeply meaningful. The U.S. surgeon general recently declared loneliness a public health epidemic. Dr. Vivek Murthy said, "We must prioritize building social connection the same way we have prioritized other critical public health issues such as tobacco, obesity, and substance use disorders." I am proud of what Rotary has done across generations to build those kinds of social connections — and this magazine focused on loneliness and what Rotary can do about it in its January 2023 issue.

Our worldwide community and our foundational value prioritizing Service Above Self makes Rotary a powerful global advocate for mental health.

A recently published study by Ohio State University found performing acts of kindness was the only one of three mental health interventions tested that helped people feel more connected to others. Study co-author David Cregg said, "Performing acts of kindness seems to be one of the best ways to promote those connections."

This research suggests what we've known all along — that doing good helps transform not just the communities we serve, but it also transforms us. As we put a greater focus on mental health, let's not think of this effort as something new to Rotary, but rather as something we can do better and as a result have a greater impact on ourselves and the people we serve.

We are not starting this effort from scratch. The Rotary Action Group on Mental Health Initiatives has been focused on these kinds of issues for several years — and we will be looking to members of that group for leadership as we continue to build awareness.

Mental health care fits comfortably within several of our areas of focus. As of May, there are 41 global grant-supported projects with a mental health focus. Many of them have tremendous promise, and we will be highlighting them in the months ahead.

So let's work together to erase the stigma associated with emotional well-being, raise awareness of mental health needs, and improve access to preventive and interventional mental health services.

Together, we will *Create Hope in the World*.

Presidential Theme for **Rotary Year 2023-2024**



"The goal is to restore hope — to help the world heal from destructive conflicts and, in turn, to help us achieve lasting change for ourselves."



On the theme logo:

1. How does this logo represent "Create Hope in the World"?

The "sweep" of each element, from "tail" to "head" represents creation — starting from a point and growing through the shape.

2. What do the shapes represent?

Land, Sea and Sky.

3. Why are the shapes interacting this way?

Nurturing, protecting, "hugging", creating a whole.

4. What do the colours mean?

Blue for the sea, red-orange for land, yellow-orange for sky.

5. Why did I use gradients?

To illustrate growth.

Rotary International President-elect R. Gordon R. McNally called for members to capture the world's attention and lead the way toward possibilities far beyond our current expectations.

McNally, a member of the Rotary Club of South Queensferry, West Lothian, Scotland, revealed the 2023-2024 Presidential Theme, Create Hope in the World, during the Rotary International Assembly in Orlando, Florida, USA, on 9 January 2023. He urged members to promote peace in troubled nations, help those affected by conflict, and maintain the momentum of initiatives begun by past leaders.

On a personal note, RIPE Gordon gave a **detailed explanation** of the theme:

On the RI Presidential Theme 2023-24, I was inspired by the colours of Scotland: the purple of heather (a plant which grows prolifically in the wild in Scotland), the blue of the ocean, the orange/yellow of the setting sun.

I was keen to identify with a modern Scotland, moving beyond the stereotypes of tartan, bagpipes etc. John Lowrie Morrison (Jolomo) is one of Scotland's greatest living artists and, as such, represents the contemporary, modern, vibrant, and colourful Scotland I sought. The colours within the logo were drawn from one of Jolomo's paintings; "Scarisdale Point, Isle of Mull" which I brought from Scotland to hang on my office wall in Evanston. (The Isle of Mull is off the west coast of Scotland)

I was further inspired by the Tsunami survivor in Thailand whom referenced in my theme speech. She told me that, having lost everything in that disaster, Rotary had given her hope.

DISTRICT GOALS FOR RY 2023-2024

based on the Rotary's Four Strategic Priorities

I. INCREASE OUR IMPACT

A. Eradicate polio and leverage the legacy

Club contributes a minimum of \$200 or \$10 per member to the PolioPlus program whichever is higher.

Campaign for New Polio Plus Society Member with at least (1) one member commits to contribute \$100 to the PolioPlus Fund every year.

B. Focus our Programs and Offerings

Achieve the \$100 per capita club contributions to the Annual Program Fund (APF) and Every Rotarian Every Year (EREY).

Achieve having at least one (1) NEW Major Donor or Major Gift Giving.

Achieve having at least one (1) NEW TRF Benefactor by contributing \$1,000 to the Endowment Fund (District or Club).

Achieve having at least one (1) NEW Paul Harris Society Member with a contribution of at least \$1,000 to Annual Fund or PolioPlus fund or combined (PHS Members commit to contribute \$1,000 every year).

Achieve that Club President and TRF Chair become a Paul Harris Fellow (PHF) or next level PHF.

Participate in Rotary Foundation Programs by availing of the Grant Program of the Rotary Foundation (District Grant or Global Grant). The District Grant Project must be sustainable.

Achieve the RI challenge of *Count Down To End Polio* Initiative recognizing clubs with a contribution of \$1,500 or more to the PolioPlus Fund (Individual giving or Club's total giving).

Special Citation/Recognition for establishing a **new endowment fund**, Individual or Club (minimum of \$25,000).

C. Improve our ability to achieve and measure impact

Undertake at least one (1) project in each of the Seven Areas of Focus.

Require at least a minimum of five (5) members participate in a service project.

Establish a partnership with a Rotary Club, government or non-government organization/s participating in a service project.

Participate in the Rotary New Year with Children: **Today's Children, Rotary's Future** on July 1, 2023 covering varied Areas of Focus.

Participate in the Bloodletting: **Dugo Mo, Buhay Ko** on July 15, 2023 covering the Disease Prevention and Treatment Area of Focus.

Participate in the School Clean-up: **Brigada Eskwela** on July 22, 2023 covering the Disease Prevention and Treatment Area of Focus.

Participate in the Mangrove Planting, Coastal Clean-up, Tree Growing, Artificial Reef Deployment: **Caring and Protecting Mother Earth** on September 17, 2023 and June 2024 covering the Protecting the Environment Area of Focus.

Participate in the Breast Cancer Awareness: **Pink October** on October, 6 and 7, 2023 covering the Maternal and Child Health Care Area of Focus.

Participate in the **Patak Polio** on October 24, 2023 or as maybe appropriate covering the Disease Prevention and Treatment Area of Focus.

Participate in the Four-leg Triathlon for the Seven Areas of Focus: **Bike/Walk/Run to End Polio** on September 18, 2023 to November 20, 2023.

Participate in the Job Fair: **Constructing your Future** on February 19-25, 2024 covering the Peace Building and Conflict Resolution and Economic and Community Development Areas of Focus.

Participate in the Empowering Girls: **Empowering Girls Today, Empowered Women Tomorrow** on February 5-10, 2024 covering the Peace Building and Conflict Resolution Area of Focus.





III. ENHANCE PARTICIPANT ENGAGEMENT

A. Support clubs to better engage their members

Ensure that all members create and register in My Rotary account in rotary.org by July 31, 2023;

Appoint at least two (2) new members (1 or 2 years old in Rotary) as part of a committee or as chairperson of a project;

Establish a Membership Committee composed of at least three (3) members, which shall conduct at least one (1) membership attraction project and one (1) membership orientation;

Establish a TRF Committee composed of at least three (3) members, which shall conduct at least one (1) TRF Donation Drive; and,

Establish a Public Image Committee composed of at least three (3) members, which shall conduct at least one (1) Public Image Information Drive.

B. Develop a participant-centered approach to deliver value

Conduct at least two (2) Membership Health Check in the club level;

Appoint at least one (1) Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Officer (DEIO) and implement at least one (1) project or information drive for Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion advocacy and/or at least one (1) Digital Transformation Officer (DTO); and,

C. Offer new opportunities for personal and professional connection

Rotary Zone Institute in Kaohsiung, Taiwan on December 8-10, 2023 – at least 1 Rotarian, spouse or partner.

RI Convention in Singapore on May 25-29, 2024 – at least 1 Rotarian, spouse or partner.

D. Provide leadership development and skills training

Develop members' leadership skills by attending mandated training: (mandatory for Presidents and Secretaries):

a. PETS and SETS on February 17-18, 2023 in Butuan City;

b. DTA on April 21-22, 2023 in Panglao, Bohol – at least eight (8) Club Officers including Chairs, Directors and submitted requirements for Club Listing;

c. Vibrant Club Workshop, including the Grant Management Seminar on June 29, 2023 in Davao City – at least five (5) Club officers including President-Nominee, Committee Chairs of TRF, Public Image, Membership, co-chairs, other Rotarians;

d. DISCON 2024 on May 3-4, 2024 in Davao City – at least ten (10) members and submitted requirements for Club Listing;

Appoint at least one (1) director for New Generation Service and partner with Rotaractors and Interactors in at least five (5) service projects and/or club activities;

Sponsor at least two (2) participant to both, the Interact Bootcamp and Rotary Youth leadership Awards (RYLA);

Ensure that at least one club member mentor a Rotaractor or Interactor;

Involve Rotaractors and Interactors in service projects and club activities; and,

Support Rotaractors to their:

a. RDLT on April 30 to May 1, 2023 in Butuan City – President and Secretary

b. DISCON 2024 on June 21-22, 2024 in Siargao, Surigao del Norte – 2 Rotaractors

c. PROCON on February 16-17, 2024 in Cebu City – 2 Rotaractors





Participate in the Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH): **WASH, a Key Component to Health** on March 2, 2024.

Participate in the Mental Health Awareness Campaign: **Break the Stigma** on July 1, 2023 and May 4, 2024 covering the Disease Prevention and Treatment Area of Focus.

Pursue your club's "Passion Project" or signature project by partnering with your club's RI-registered RCC or with one or more organizations, corporations, government entities and NGO

II. EXPAND OUR REACH

A. Grow and diversify our membership and participation

Achieve a net increase of two (2) in membership based on July 1, 2023 starting figure (Attain a 100% Retention Rate from July 1, 2023 to December 31 and attain a membership growth of 2 members from January 1, 2024 to July 15, 2024); and,

Induct two (2) new members below the age of 40.

Maintain a minimum number of 15 active club members;

Top ten (10) Clubs attaining a net membership gain of five (5) new members.

B. Create new channels into Rotary

At least one (1) member to participate in an RI-recognized Rotarian Action Group (RAG) or Fellowship.

C. Increase Rotary's openness and appeal

Accept new membership types in the club (eg., associate, corporate, family) or organize new clubs: satellite club, traditional, innovative, or cause-based clubs;

Maintain or organize a new Rotaract Club, Interact club, or Rotary Community Corps (RCC).

D. Build awareness of our impact and brand

Follow the Rotary branding, Voice, and identity guidelines in the Rotary Brand Center. (The District will have a one design shirt to be used in one District Project or activity)

Utilize the People of Action materials and other public image resources;

Submit e-copies of your club bulletin to the District 3860 website every 15th of the month;

C. Review governance to foster more diverse perspectives in decision-making

Report the Club President, Secretary and Treasurer for Rotary Year 2024-2025 in the Rotary.org and to the District on or before January 10, 2024.

President and/or Secretary must attend minimum of six (6) of the Area or Cluster Coordination Meeting (ACOM).

The History of Rotary Club of Cebu Port Centre

In the beginning were five men and one vision...

In a historic series of preparative meetings in May 1985, Felipe Casing, Antonio Elumir, Manny Granada, Jacinto Jamero and Rey Sanggalang envisioned the Port Center of Cebu as a vantage ground from where a band of noble men shall rise by the name of Rotary, in a game of service to humanity.

What followed was a marathon dash in establishing a Rotary Club in the Cebu Port District to obtain a charter from then District 3860 Governor Jose "Joe" Lardizabal whose term was to conclude very soon. On the forefront was Pepe Casing, a Cebu Fuente Rotarian.

It was in the special day of June 6, 1985 when a charter was granted to a club that was christened a most befitting name: The "ROTARY CLUB OF CEBU PORT CENTER".

The newfound organization that was once a nucleus of five visionaries became a club of 34 gentlemen who convened charter members in the middle of June 1985 to bear witness to the first set of officers. Antonio "Jun" Elumir, who was then the Phil. Ports Authority Officer, was the Charter President. With him at the helm was Manuel "Manny" Granada, the charter vice-president, Jacinto "Boy" Jamero and "Rey" Sanggalang were the charter secretary and charter treasurer, respectively. These gentlemen who were the prime movers for the organization of our club were equally accorded those distinct and rare positions which can only happen once in a history of a club.

Pepe Casing was honored with the venerable title of "Godfather".
