THE 4-WAY TEST

One of the most widely printed and quoted statements of business ethics in the world is the Rotary 4-way test. It was created by Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor in 1932 where he was asked to take charge of a company that was facing bankruptcy Taylor looked for a way to save the struggling company mired in depressioncaused financial difficulties. He drew up a 24-word code of ethics for all employees to follow their business and professional lives. The 4-Way Test became the guide for sales, production, advertising and all relations with dealers and customers, and the survival of the company is credited to this simple philosophy.

LILU: Cebu's Advertising Guru

Lilu's ability to easily connect with the market and develop effective strategies to get the message across has etched her name in the advertising industry. Effortlessly, she became Cebu's advertising "guru".

CEBU, Philippines — She is a teacher by heart, and she continues to be even after she found her place in the advertising business.

In Cebu, Lilo "Lilu" Itaas - Aliño is an authority when it comes to advertising, brand building, and marketing. Her company, Lilu Advertising and Marketing Solutions Inc., played a huge part in the success of many local and international brands here.

Not only that this power woman made her name in the advertising industry, she also shares herself in many social and civic organizations, including the chairmanship of Cebu's biggest business event the Cebu Business Month (CBM) and the Rotary International District 3860.

A learner

A graduate of Bachelor of Arts in Mass Communication at St. Theresa's College (STC), Lilu credited her success in advertising largely to a person she dearly looked up to as a fresh graduate and up until now.

Inspiration

As an employee, Lilu desired to become like her boss. She said Mr. Quisumbing inspired her to put up her own business in advertising.

"NQ [Norberto Quisumbing] inspired me to get into business. He is loaded with sharp ideas. He mentored me. He pushed me up and motivated me to stand tall in everything that I do," the teacher-entrepreneur shared the effect of her former boss to life's journey.

"I was young, here is this accomplished a very successful man who believed in me. It was empowering and inspiring," she continued.

Instead of convincing her to stay with his company much longer, Lilu said NQ encouraged her to go and start her own.

In 1984, Lilu established her company she named "Creatron Ads" and her former boss' company was one of her firsts and major clients.

Inspired by the examples of NQ, Lilu's ad agency gained attention of a multinational ad agency—Leo Burnett. The strategic partnership ushered Lilu's company a lot of opportunities. From there, she learned the science of research and brand activation.

At the height of Lilu's role in leading the advertising industry in Cebu, which in the 80s is still in its infancy stage, she squeezed her busy schedule to join the teaching circle at her own alma matter—STC.

Married to Favian "Dongie" Aliño, Lilu considered her husband as her "knight in shining armor" as he not only helped her in the domestic front, but he is Lilu's refuge when things get tougher—in business and in teaching.

"My husband is a great positive thinker. He always stay on the positive side," she is proud of her salesman husband.

Over the years, Lilu has been a mother to her students, more than a teacher.

Her nurturing heart, generous hands, are just a few of the subtle powers she is gifted with.

Ask the Club Secretary, Membership Chair or attendance chair to give you a heads-up about people who missed several meetings in the prior month or those whose attendance/engagement has fallen in general. You can then contact them and invite them back to meetings. Work to get them involved in your club's activities.

If your club gives scholarships, hold a ceremony to award the scholarships before the students leave for college or community college. (Good opportunity for press coverage!).

African region declared free of wild poliovirus

The World Health Organization (WHO) on 25 August announced that transmission of the wild poliovirus has officially been stopped in all 47 countries of its African region. This is a historic and vital step toward global eradication of polio, which is Rotary's top priority.

After decades of hard won gains in the region, Rotary and its partners in the <u>Global Polio Eradication Initiative</u> (GPEI) — WHO, U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, UNICEF, the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, and Gavi, the vaccine alliance — are proclaiming the milestone an achievement in public health. They offer it as proof that strong commitment, coordination, and perseverance can rid the world of polio.

We, as people of action, are making the world a better place — through our connections within clubs and transformative power of The Rotary Foundation.

Rotary implements projects that will help communities long after we're all gone. Clubs in one country pool funds with those from another to make communities healthier, more prosperous and better educated. We partner with global health leaders to bring the scourge of polio to its knees. And we can proudly note that much of the good that Rotary does now and will do in the future is because of the Foundation and its promise to transform gifts into projects that change lives.

At publication time, we had approved 1,078 global grant applications with total funding of \$76.5 million.

Last July, we launched the community assessment component as a requirement for all global grant or vocational training team applications as part of our commitment to sustainability. That approach also informs why we established the Rotary Disaster Response Fund and Grant this year, which allows distribution of grants up to \$25,000 for worldwide Rotarian disaster response.

We are committed to strengthening and growing the Foundation for the future. As we look forward to a new Rotary year and opportunities to make an even greater impact in communities worldwide, we thank our Chair, Brenda M Cressey, for her leadership during the past two months. How District 3860 Evolved

DISTRICT 3860

Fourteen years after the first Rotary club was organized by Paul P. Harris in Chicago, the Rotary movement reached the shores of the Philippines when the Rotary Club of Manila, the first Rotary club in Asia, was chartered in June 1919.

Thirteen years later, RC Manila sponsored the birth of the first Rotary club outside Manila and the second in the country – Rotary Club of Cebu – on November 26, 1932 with 26 charter members. This was followed in 1933 by the organization of the Rotary Club of Iloilo.

In the beginning, the Rotary Club Cebu South was just the proverbial "gleam-in-the-eye" of RC Cebu West resident Joe Cavan, and former District Governor Marianing Ilano. The year was 1968, and a feasibility study showed that there were as many as 92 classifications that could be availed of in the southern portion of the sponsoring club's territory. The matter was not pursued, however, and it was not until the incumbency of President Tom Espina that the move to form the new club was revived by then District Governor Onor Lozano.

On January 8, 1972 the Rotary Club Cebu South was formally organized at a meeting held at Cavan's Resort in Guadalupe, Cebu City, and a Charter was applied for. On March 5, 1972, Rotary International gave its official sanction to the club and released its Charter as the Fourth Club in RI District 385. On May 27, 1972, Rotary Club Cebu South held its Charter Presentation and Induction at the Casino Espanol de Cebu, with first President Munding Crystal accepting the Club Charter from District Governor Onor Lozano. There were 28 Charter Members then.

Through the years, the club continues to create footprints and impact in the service of the rotary. Its passions for service were manifested by the countless awards and citations as it rises to prominence and importance. The club prided itself for having a new President every rotary. This is just among the qualities of its members who can be the leader of the Club that can continue its legacy and identity. Currently, the Club has 30 active members. Even with the swift passing of the time that some men of honor and dedication to Club's service have gone by, the Club's enthusiasm to serve the community and do better has earned in the Rotary Year 2016-2017 marvelous and exceptional awards, as follows:

DOH reports 621 recoveries in Cebu City as active cases drop to 626

CEBU CITY, Philippines — The Department of Health in Central Visayas (DOH-7) reported a drop of about half of the remaining active cases of the coronavirus disease infection here in a span of 24 hours.

In its August 26, 2020-bulletin, <u>DOH-7</u> reported 621 new recoveries in the city, making its active count plummet to 626, or about half of the 1,212 reported on Tuesday, August 25.

ROTARACT CORNER

ROTARACT HISTORY

Rotaract, Rotary International's service club program for young adults ages 18-30, was officially inaugurated during January 1968 under RI President Luther Hodges. On 13 March 1968, the Rotaract Club of the University of North Carolina, sponsored by the Rotary Club of North Charlotte, North Carolina, USA, was the first Rotaract club to receive its official charter. Although this club is recognized as the first Rotaract club, Rotarians have been sponsoring similar organizations for young adults since the early 1920s.

The earliest known predecessors to Rotaract, Twenty-Thirty clubs, were first sponsored by the Rotary Club of Sacramento, California, USA. The clubs were based on the principles and goals of their sponsoring Rotary clubs, and membership was open to young professionals and university students. The first meeting of a Twenty-Thirty club was held on 19 December 1922. At one point, the movement claimed as many as 125 clubs under the sponsorship of California Rotary clubs, and published a monthly magazine.

In 1927, Round Table clubs were founded in Great Britain and Ireland. Membership in Round Table clubs was open to young men ages 18 to 40, and by 1935, there more than 90 Round Table clubs existed. In November 1930, the first Apex club was formed in Geelong, Australia. Apex clubs grew rapidly, expanding to more than 20 clubs in just a few years. These clubs were sponsored by Rotary clubs, and were open to professionals and students between the ages of 18 and 35.

Similar Rotary club-sponsored groups continued to spring up simultaneously and independently around the globe. Unisserve clubs in India, Orbis clubs in South America, Rotors clubs in South Africa, Paul Harris Circles in Europe, and Quadrant clubs in the United States are some of the best-known examples. Eventually, these clubs would provide the base for the future growth of Rotaract as the clubs adopted new names under the Rotaract program.

Perhaps the greatest impetus for the creation of the Rotaract program came from Rotary's youth service club for secondary school students, Interact clubs. Established in 1962, the Interact program enjoyed immediate success. However, since membership was only open to students in secondary schools, graduated Interactors and Rotarians were soon looking for ways to extend their relationship. Several proposals were brought before the RI Board of Directors to allow membership in Interact clubs to extend for a few years after graduation. Instead of extending the age requirements for Interact, the Board decided to study the feasibility of creating a new service club program for young adults at the university and young professional level.

The decision to adopt the Rotaract program came at a time when student protests worldwide were of growing concern to Rotarians. The Rotaract program was adopted not only as means of keeping former Interactors within the Rotary family, but as a means of channeling the energies of young adults into positive activities that could benefit their communities.



Today, Rotaract continues to experience phenomenal growth. There are currently more than 8,000 Rotaract clubs in 155 countries and geographic areas, with an estimated membership of more than 186,000 Rotaractors. As the program continues to grow, Rotaractors repeatedly show that they are prepared for "Fellowship Through Service."
