THE 4-WAY TEST

One of the most widely printed and quoted statements of business ethics in the world is the Rotary 4-way test. It was created by Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor in 1932 where he was asked to take charge of a company that was facing bankruptcy Taylor looked for a way to save the struggling company mired in depressioncaused financial difficulties. He drew up a 24-word code of ethics for all employees to follow their business and professional lives. The 4-Way Test became the guide for sales, production, advertising and all relations with dealers and customers, and the survival of the company is credited to this simple philosophy.

ROTARY INTERNATIONAL November Message from RI President Holger Knaack



We all know Rotary's tremendous power to transform our communities and ourselves. However, in every community, people have been left out, and we have not made a strong enough effort to reach them.

The RI Board of Directors is taking action to make Rotary more welcoming and diverse. We formed a task force to promote diversity, equity, and inclusion to help

I still remember the relief I felt as a RYLA participant four years ago. I had finally found my people: people who cared as much as I did. All over the world, Rotary has the same heart. We serve our communities and take action where others feel paralyzed by the size and scope of a problem.

Let's continue that spirit, especially when the conversation is difficult. Racism, prejudice, and discrimination take on different forms but exist in every country, in every city, and in every person. How do we root it out?

As a diversity, equity, and inclusion consultant, I help organizations create a culture that empowers and attracts everyone using the power of empathy. When we feel with others as if they were ourselves, we cannot hold prejudice in our hearts. When every child reminds you of your own child, when every woman or man reminds you of your mother or brother, you start seeing the world differently.

We can apply The Four-Way Test through the lens of empathy. Are we building goodwill and friendship with everyone in our area, including women? Are things fair and beneficial to people of all ages? Who has to make choices that you don't have to make?

I made a heartbreaking choice between Rotary and my religion when a Rotary convention was held during Ramadan. I wondered: When we ask if this is fair and beneficial to all concerned, did that not include me as a Muslim? Would the convention ever be held over Easter? Only by asking difficult questions can we begin the work of creating a more inclusive and diverse Rotary.


We already connect so many people across the world. Imagine the possibilities when we bring even more people along for the ride. That's the future of Rotary I want to see: one where we are unstoppable in our service, relentless in our kindness, and intentional in the change we want to see.

Rotary has a big enough heart. If we open our door wider, we might find a lot of interesting people with new voices and new perspectives. We already have a variety of clubs offering different styles, cultures, and opportunities — and those who do not feel welcome in any particular club might be great candidates for new clubs created on different models. 

DISTRICT 3860

Fourteen years after the first Rotary club was organized by Paul P. Harris in Chicago, the Rotary movement reached the shores of the Philippines when the Rotary Club of Manila, the first Rotary club in Asia, was chartered in June 1919.

Thirteen years later, RC Manila sponsored the birth of the first Rotary club outside Manila and the second in the country – Rotary Club of Cebu – on November 26, 1932 with 26 charter members. This was followed in 1933 by the organization of the Rotary Club of Iloilo.



In the beginning, the Rotary Club Cebu South was just the proverbial "gleam-in-the-eye" of RC Cebu West resident Joe Cavan, and former District Governor Marianing Ilano. The year was 1968, and a feasibility study showed that there were as many as 92 classifications that could be availed of in the southern portion of the sponsoring club's territory. The matter was not pursued, however, and it was not until the incumbency of President Tom Espina that the move to form the new club was revived by then District Governor Onor Lozano.

On January 8, 1972 the Rotary Club Cebu South was formally organized at a meeting held at Cavan's Resort in Guadalupe, Cebu City, and a Charter was applied for. On March 5, 1972, Rotary International gave its official sanction to the club and released its Charter as the Fourth Club in RI District 385. On May 27, 1972, Rotary Club Cebu South held its Charter Presentation and Induction at the Casino Espanol de Cebu, with first President Munding Crystal accepting the Club Charter from District Governor Onor Lozano. There were 28 Charter Members then.

Through the years, the club continues to create footprints and impact in the service of the rotary. Its passions for service were manifested by the countless awards and citations as it rises to prominence and importance. The club prided itself for having a new President every rotary. This is just among the qualities of its members who can be the leader of the Club that can continue its legacy and identity. Currently, the Club has 30 active members. 

Cebu City plans to intensify testing following COVID-19 spike

CEBU CITY, Philippines — Cebu City is planning to intensify contact tracing and testing following the rise of new Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) cases in the past weeks.

The Emergency Operations Center said that it is only through aggressive testing can the transmission of the COVID-19 be detected and prevented.

The EOC eyes the implementation of increased surveillance testing to areas with a high prevalence of the virus to track the recent spike of its cases.

Doctor Brian Albert Lim, an infectious disease expert, said that virologists and medical practitioners expected a spike would happen around mid-November.

He explained that it would take around 5 to 14 days for the virus to incubate, thus, one must observe two weeks to determine the trend of Covid.

"COVID follows human behavior. Data would show that 14 days before the spike,


