THE 4-WAY TEST

One of the most widely printed and quoted statements of business ethics in the world is the Rotary 4-way test. It was created by Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor in 1932 where he was asked to take charge of a company that was facing bankruptcy Taylor looked for a way to save the struggling company mired in depression-caused financial difficulties. He drew up a 24-word code of ethics for all employees to follow their business and professional lives. The 4-Way Test became the guide for sales, production, advertising and all relations with dealers and customers, and the survival of the company is credited to this simple philosophy.

Herb Taylor became President of the Rotary International in 1954-55. The 4-Way Test was adopted by Rotary in 1943 and has been translated into more than a hundred languages and pub-

of the things we think, say or do.

- 1 Is it the truth?
- 2 Is it fair to all concerned?
- 3 Will it build goodwill and better friendships?
- 4 Will it be beneficial to all concerned?

OBJECT OF ROTARY

Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster;

1.The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;

- Adhere to honesty in my advertising and in all representations to the public concerning my business or profession.
- Neither seek from nor grant to a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.

December Message from RI President Holger Knaack

I will choose to remember 2020 as a year of great change and strength for us; Rotary didn't stop, despite the pandemic. We removed obstacles, found new ways to connect, and embraced new approaches to service, such as online projects and virtual fundraising. I have invited two Rotarians to share their stories about how Rotary grew stronger this year.

As I look back on 2020, I reflect on how our lives have changed. The global COVID-19 pandemic brought pain and loss to



many of us. And for almost all of us, our daily lives, family time, and work also changed this year. But we've made it to the end of this difficult year, not on our own but by reaching out to one another, as we always do in Rotary. With each passing year, I become prouder of our organization.

When the pandemic shut everything down, our emerging e-club was already providing digital service, including internationally. Fourteen U.S. women and I, members of multiple Rotary clubs, were using WhatsApp to mentor women entrepreneurs in rural Costa Rica, helping them to grow their ecotourism business, RETUS Tours [the subject of the magazine's May cover story, "Nature & Nurture"]. The project has grown, with 30 Rotarians now providing consulting and help with the RETUS website and social media. Most importantly, we continue building relationships and empowering these women to transform.

I was president of my club when COVID-19 hit, and many members didn't yet have Zoom. Only 10 of our 53 members participated in the first Zoom meeting during the pandemic. I thought that reaching out and getting guest speakers from around the world to engage our members would help. Many Rotary leaders, a Rotary Peace Fellow, and even RI President Holger Knaack visited virtually and spoke to our club. Meeting attendance improved, while we reduced running costs by cutting out meals. Some members who worked outside our city and had missed our meetings even rejoined us. Registering our online meetings on My Rotary enhanced contacts with clubs across the world, and the joint meeting addressed by Holger attracted more than 300 visitors. We also raised more funds as members and visitors contributed to our projects. To continue being flexible for all, we are now offering hybrid meetings. For me, 2020 has been the best year in Rotary as I've made many new friends.

These stories should give us all reasons to be optimistic about Rotary in the year ahead. We are not just surviving; we are gaining strength. We are discovering how resilient our organization truly is. We are seeing for ourselves how Rotary Opens Opportunities — even during pandemics — to grow, connect, and engage our members and the communities we serve.

From our home in Ratzeburg to yours, Susanne and I would like to bid you and your family the warmest of season's greetings. We can't wait to see the good things that 2021 will bring.

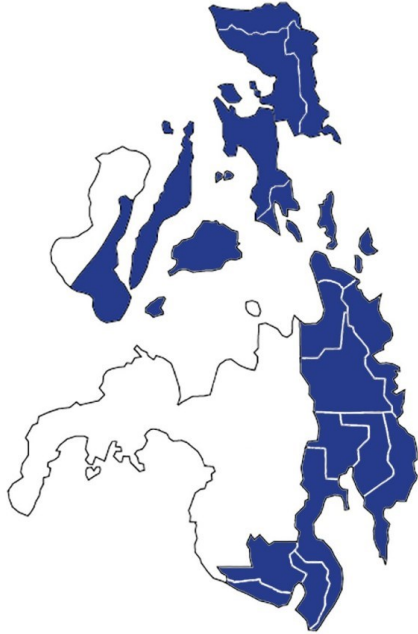

How District 3860 Evolved

Fourteen years after the first Rotary club was organized by Paul P. Harris in Chicago, the Rotary movement reached the shores of the Philippines when the Rotary Club of Manila, the first Rotary club in Asia, was chartered in June 1919.

Thirteen years later, RC Manila sponsored the birth of the first Rotary club outside Manila and the second in the country – Rotary Club of Cebu – on November 26, 1932 with 26 charter members. This was followed in 1933 by the organization of the Rotary Club of Iloilo.

RC CEBU SOUTH MILESTONES

In the beginning, the Rotary Club Cebu South was just the proverbial “gleam-in-the-eye” of RC Cebu West resident Joe Cavan, and former District Governor Marianing Ilano. The year was 1968, and a feasibility study showed that there were as many as 92 classifications that could be availed of in the southern portion of the sponsoring club’s territory. The matter was not pursued, however, and it was not until the incumbency of President Tom Espina that the move to form the new club was revived by then District Governor Onor Lozano.

On January 8, 1972 the Rotary Club Cebu South was formally organized at a meeting held at Cavan’s Resort in Guadalupe, Cebu City, and a Charter was applied for. On March 5, 1972, Rotary International gave its official sanction to the club and released its Charter as the Fourth Club in RI District 385. On May 27, 1972, Rotary Club Cebu South held its Charter Presentation and Induction at the Casino Espanol de Cebu, with first President Munding Crystal accepting the Club Charter from District Governor Onor Lozano. There were 28 Charter Members then.

Through the years, the club continues to create footprints and impact in the service of the rotary. Its passions for service were manifested by the countless awards and citations as it rises to prominence and importance. The club prided itself for having a new President every rotary. This is just among the qualities of its members who can be the leader of the Club that can continue its legacy and identity. Currently, the Club has 30 active members. Even with the swift passing of the time that some men of honor and dedication to Club’s service have gone by, the Club’s enthusiasm to serve the community and do better has earned in the Rotary Year 2016-2017 marvelous and exceptional awards, as follows:

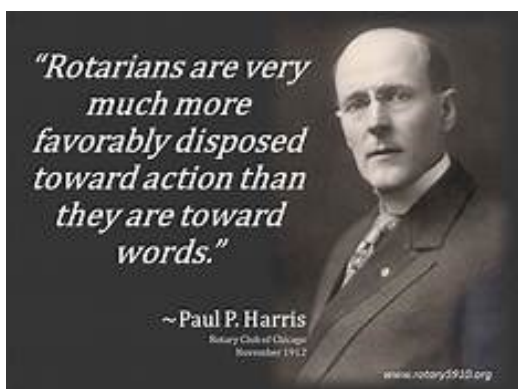

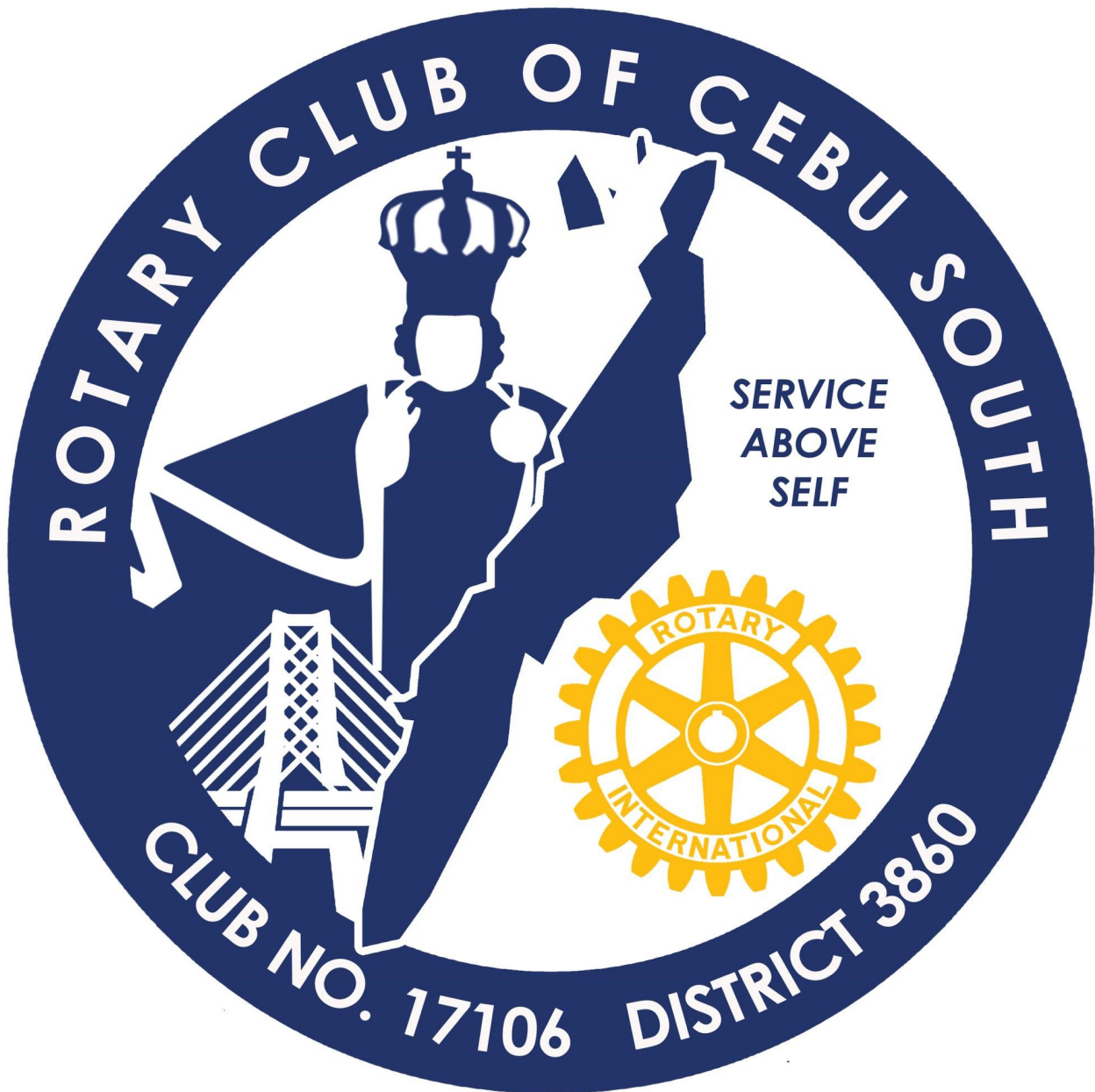

Metro Manila mayors to consult experts before allowing minors out . . .

MANILA, Philippines — Metro Manila mayors will consult medical experts first before deciding whether to allow minors to leave home during the general community quarantine, San Juan Mayor Francis Zamora said Tuesday, December 1, 2020.

Zamora said this the decision made on Tuesday evening in a meeting of the Metro Manila Council (MMC), which is composed of the 17 mayors of the region.

“It’s important for our decision or recommendation to have a medical basis because the safety of our citizens is at stake here,” he said in Filipino. “We will meet as soon as we get the opinions of the doctors.”

Earlier, Interior Secretary Eduardo Año said Metro Manila mayors should first come out with a [resolution](#) that would allow minors to go to malls with their parents during the strict quarantine.

MANDAUE CITY, Philippines — More than 60 Traditional Public Utility Jeepney (TPUJ) drivers and operators flocked to the Traffic Enforcement Agency of Mandaue (TEAM) office on Tuesday, December 1, 2020, to get a TEAM clearance.

Arnold Malig-on, TEAM operations chief, said that it was the first time that there were that many jeepney drivers who went to their office to get a TEAM clearance.

A TEAM clearance will enable the drivers to be endorsed to the Emergency Operations Center (EOC) Task Force to undergo free swab testing.

Those who will test negative for the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) will then proceed to the one-stop-shop where the final test and inspection of their vehicles will be done.
