# THE 4-WAY TEST

One of the most widely printed and quoted statements of business ethics in the world is the Rotary 4-way test. It was created by Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor in 1932 where he was asked to take charge of a company that was facing bankruptcy Taylor looked for a way to save the struggling company mired in depression-caused financial difficulties. He drew up a 24-word code of ethics for all employees to follow their business and professional lives. The 4-Way Test became the guide for sales, production, advertising and all relations with dealers and customers, and the survival of the company is credited to this simple philosophy.

Herb Taylor became President of the Rotary International in 1954-55. The 4-Way Test was adopted by Rotary in 1943 and has been translated into more than a hundred languages and pub-

# OBJECT OF ROTARY

- Adhere to honesty in my advertising and in all representations to the public concerning my business or profession.
- Neither seek from nor grant to a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.

## January Message from RI President Holger Knaack



### New Year Message from RI President Holger Knaack ...

January is finally here. As we look forward to 2021, our thinking doesn't have to stop at the end of these 365 days. Are you thinking ahead about what you will be doing in 2022, 2023, and beyond?

We cannot foresee the future, but we can steer ourselves where we want to go.

I think it is important that every Rotary club hold a strategic meeting at least once a year.

Past Rotary International Director, Greg Yank, who has a lot of experience working with clubs on their plans, shares his viewpoint.

*A famous aphorism states, 'By failing to prepare, you are preparing to fail'. Planning is essential to achieving success in all areas of life, including Rotary, and we're getting better at it every year.*

*Strategic planning for Rotary clubs works. I have helped many clubs find that pathway by working with them to build what I call a blueprint, a multiyear plan that answers the fundamental question: "What is our vision for our club?"*

*The best plans I have seen are those that are focused, when a club concentrates its resources on the best opportunities it has.*

***Planning is essential to achieving success in all areas of life, including Rotary, and we're getting better at it every year."***

*Your Rotary club cannot be all things to its members and to the community it serves; it has limited human, financial, and time resources. A successful plan factors in assets and limitations to chart the desired pathway for your members.*

*Begin building a multiyear strategic plan by brainstorming with your club, asking, "What are our initiatives and priorities for the next two to three years?"*

*Document your answers using action-oriented language that is specific, concrete, and measurable about the goals you want to achieve.*

***The best plans I have seen are those that are focused, when a club concentrates its resources on the best opportunities it has."***

*Next, narrow down your initiatives to a core set of three to five priorities.*

*Your club will then develop specific objectives for each initiative, outlining who will be involved, key milestones of achievement, how progress will be tracked, and a timeline for completion. Keep your plan short and simple.*

*Then go out and do it. Review the progress you make toward accomplishing the initiatives, and revise as needed at least once a year.*

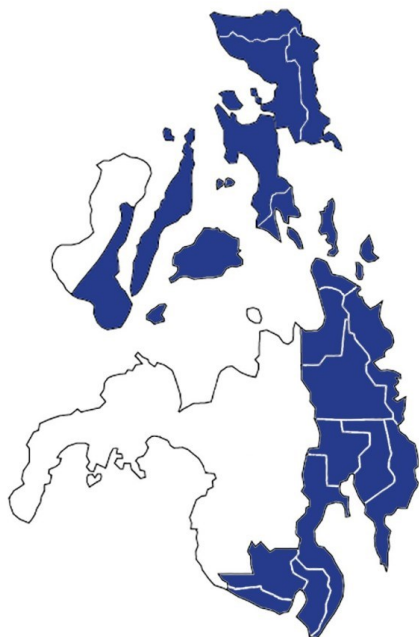

### How District 3860 Evolved

### DISTRICT 3860

Fourteen years after the first Rotary club was organized by Paul P. Harris in Chicago, the Rotary movement reached the shores of the Philippines when the Rotary Club of Manila, the first Rotary club in Asia, was chartered in June 1919.

Thirteen years later, RC Manila sponsored the birth of the first Rotary club outside Manila and the second in the country – Rotary Club of Cebu – on November 26, 1932 with 26 charter members. This was followed in 1933 by the organization of the Rotary Club of Iloilo.

# RC CEBU SOUTH MILESTONES

In the beginning, the Rotary Club Cebu South was just the proverbial “gleam-in-the-eye” of RC Cebu West resident Joe Cavan, and former District Governor Marianing Ilano. The year was 1968, and a feasibility study showed that there were as many as 92 classifications that could be availed of in the southern portion of the sponsoring club’s territory. The matter was not pursued, however, and it was not until the incumbency of President Tom Espina that the move to form the new club was revived by then District Governor Onor Lozano.

On January 8, 1972 the Rotary Club Cebu South was formally organized at a meeting held at Cavan’s Resort in Guadalupe, Cebu City, and a Charter was applied for. On March 5, 1972, Rotary International gave its official sanction to the club and released its Charter as the Fourth Club in RI District 385. On May 27, 1972, Rotary Club Cebu South held its Charter Presentation and Induction at the Casino Espanol de Cebu, with first President Munding Crystal accepting the Club Charter from District Governor Onor Lozano. There were 28 Charter Members then.

Through the years, the club continues to create footprints and impact in the service of the rotary. Its passions for service were manifested by the countless awards and citations as it rises to prominence and importance. The club prided itself for having a new President every rotary. This is just among the qualities of its members who can be the leader of the Club that can continue its legacy and identity. Currently, the Club has 30 active members. Even with the swift passing of the time that some men of honor and dedication to Club’s service have gone by, the Club’s enthusiasm to serve the community and do better has earned in the Rotary Year 2016-2017 marvelous and exceptional awards, as follows:

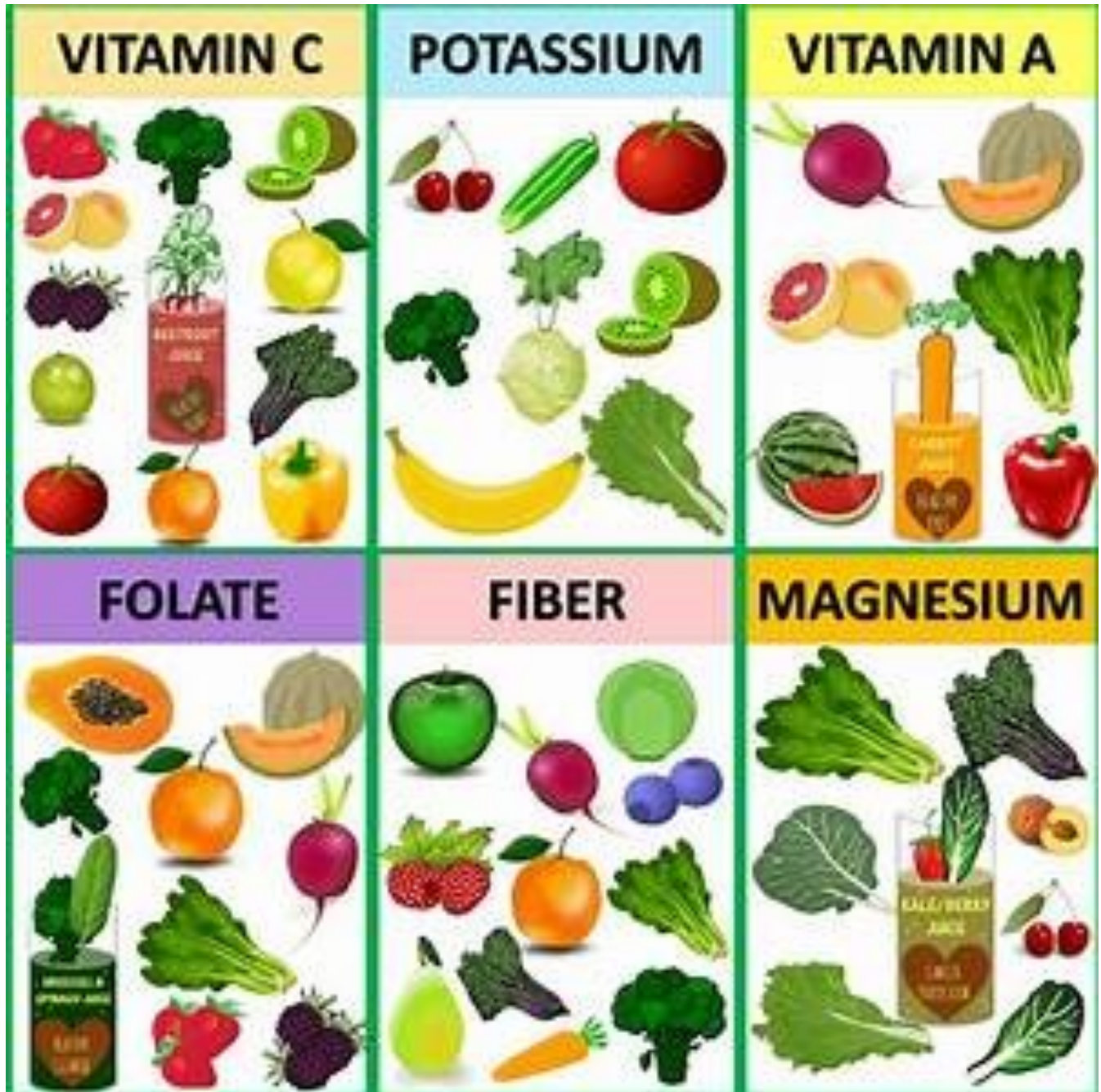

## CCPO to Cebu City gov't: Seek IATF approval on Sinulog 2021 Ligan said they cannot secure an activity that is not sanctioned by IATF



CEBU CITY, Philippines –Police officials are urging the Cebu City government to seek the approval of the Interagency Task Force (IATF) before pushing through with the planned Sinulog street dancing and ritual showdown on January 17.

Police Colonel Josefino Ligan, director of the Cebu City Police Office (CCPO), said that they cannot assist an activity that may be prohibited by the IATF and while a state of public health emergency remains. Ligan said that the IATF must have the final say on whether or not this year's festival should be allowed to push through.

However, Ligan clarified that he does not see any problem with virtual events and other activities that are scheduled this year. His greatest concern is the festival that will be held at the South Road Properties (SRP) that is expected to draw a crowd of at least 2,000 people that will include the performers, their support staff, and the Sinulog organizers.

Since the activity could result to a possible spread of the coronavirus disease, it is important for the IATF to have a say on the matter, the police director said.

He said that the IATF should be able to review the plans for the event and the guidelines for the implementation of the health protocols. It is only when the IATF gives its nod on the festival that the police will also extend its support for the hosting of this year's Sinulog.

"It still remains that only the religious activities is allowed unless it is amended to include the Sinulog activities. But then again duol na kaayo ang panahon (the event's schedule is already fast approaching), there is no time to amend with the guidelines of the IATF. In our part, we still maintain that only the religious activities will be allowed," said Ligan.

Ligan said that IATF is a collegiate body and the police cannot just decide on its own. They will have to wait for the IATF's decision. / dcb

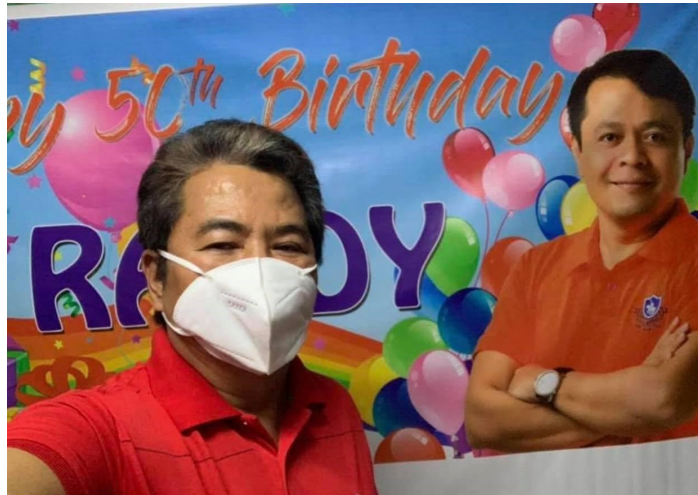

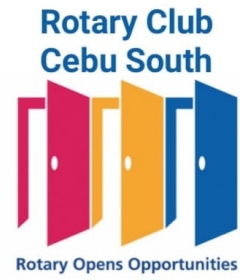
