THE 4-WAY TEST

One of the most widely printed and quoted statements of business ethics in the world is the Rotary 4-way test. It was created by Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor in 1932 where he was asked to take charge of a company that was facing bankruptcy Taylor looked for a way to save the struggling company mired in depression-caused financial difficulties. He drew up a 24-word code of ethics for all employees to follow their business and professional lives. The 4-Way Test became the guide for sales, production, advertising and all relations with dealers and customers, and the survival of the company is credited to this simple philosophy.

Herb Taylor became President of the Rotary International in 1954-55. The 4-Way Test was adopted by Rotary in 1943 and has been translated into more than a hundred languages and pub-

of the things we think, say or do.

- 1 Is it the truth?
- 2 Is it fair to all concerned?
- 3 Will it build goodwill and better friendships?
- 4 Will it be beneficial to all concerned?

OBJECT OF ROTARY

Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster;

1.The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;

2.High ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations; and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society.



3.The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life.

4.The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world of fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

- Offer my vocational talents to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, and to improve the quality of life in my community.
- Adhere to honesty in my advertising and in all representations to the public concerning my business or profession.
- Neither seek from nor grant to a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.

2. Use my vocational experience and talents to serve in Rotary.
3. Conduct all of my personal, business, and professional affairs, ethically, encouraging and fostering high ethical standards as an example to others.

5. Promote recognition and respect for all occupations which are useful to society.
6. Offer my vocational talents: to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, and to improve the quality of life in my community.
7. Honor the trust that Rotary and fellow Rotarians provide and not do anything that will bring disfavor or reflect adversely on Rotary or fellow Rotarians.
8. Not seek from a fellow Rotarians a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relation-

New Year Message from RI President Holger Knaack ...

January is finally here. As we look forward to 2021, our thinking doesn't have to stop at the end of these 365 days. Are you thinking ahead about what you will be doing in 2022, 2023, and beyond?

We cannot foresee the future, but we can steer ourselves where we want to go.

I think it is important that every Rotary club hold a strategic meeting at least once a year.

Past Rotary International Director, Greg Yank, who has a lot of experience working with clubs on their plans, shares his viewpoint.

A famous aphorism states, 'By failing to prepare, you are preparing to fail'. Planning is essential to achieving success in all areas of life, including Rotary, and we're getting better at it every year.

Strategic planning for Rotary clubs works. I have helped many clubs find that pathway by working with them to build what I call a blueprint, a multiyear plan that answers the fundamental question: "What is our vision for our club?"

The best plans I have seen are those that are focused, when a club concentrates its resources on the best opportunities it has.

Planning is essential to achieving success in all areas of life, including Rotary, and we're getting better at it every year."

Your Rotary club cannot be all things to its members and to the community it serves; it has limited human, financial, and time resources. A successful plan factors in assets and limitations to chart the desired pathway for your members.

Begin building a multiyear strategic plan by brainstorming with your club, asking, "What are our initiatives and priorities for the next two to three years?"

Document your answers using action-oriented language that is specific, concrete, and measurable about the goals you want to achieve.

The best plans I have seen are those that are focused, when a club concentrates its resources on the best opportunities it has."

Next, narrow down your initiatives to a core set of three to five priorities.

Your club will then develop specific objectives for each initiative, outlining who will be involved, key milestones of achievement, how progress will be tracked, and a timeline for completion. Keep your plan short and simple.

Then go out and do it. Review the progress you make toward accomplishing the initiatives, and revise as needed at least once a year.

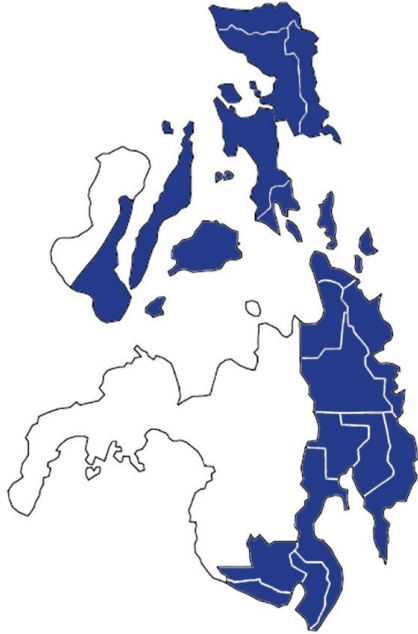

How District 3860 Evolved

Fourteen years after the first Rotary club was organized by Paul P. Harris in Chicago, the Rotary movement reached the shores of the Philippines when the Rotary Club of Manila, the first Rotary club in Asia, was chartered in June 1919.

Thirteen years later, RC Manila sponsored the birth of the first Rotary club outside Manila and the second in the country – Rotary Club of Cebu – on November 26, 1932 with 26 charter members. This was followed in 1933 by the organization of the Rotary Club of Iloilo.

RC CEBU SOUTH MILESTONES

In the beginning, the Rotary Club Cebu South was just the proverbial “gleam-in-the-eye” of RC Cebu West resident Joe Cavan, and former District Governor Marianing Ilano. The year was 1968, and a feasibility study showed that there were as many as 92 classifications that could be availed of in the southern portion of the sponsoring club’s territory. The matter was not pursued, however, and it was not until the incumbency of President Tom Espina that the move to form the new club was revived by then District Governor Onor Lozano.

On January 8, 1972 the Rotary Club Cebu South was formally organized at a meeting held at Cavan’s Resort in Guadalupe, Cebu City, and a Charter was applied for. On March 5, 1972, Rotary International gave its official sanction to the club and released its Charter as the Fourth Club in RI District 385. On May 27, 1972, Rotary Club Cebu South held its Charter Presentation and Induction at the Casino Espanol de Cebu, with first President Munding Crystal accepting the Club Charter from District Governor Onor Lozano. There were 28 Charter Members then.

Through the years, the club continues to create footprints and impact in the service of the rotary. Its passions for service were manifested by the countless awards and citations as it rises to prominence and importance. The club prided itself for having a new President every rotary. This is just among the qualities of its members who can be the leader of the Club that can continue its legacy and identity. Currently, the Club has 30 active members. Even with the swift passing of the time that some men of honor and dedication to Club’s service have gone by, the Club’s enthusiasm to serve the community and do better has earned in the Rotary Year 2016-2017 marvelous and exceptional awards, as follows:

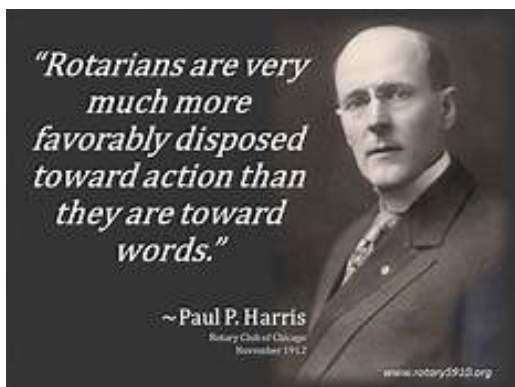

Covid-19 vaccine: your questions answered

Information from US CDC

Can the vaccine make me sick with Covid-19?

NO

None of the authorized/recommended vaccines in US (Pfizer/BioNTech and Moderna) contain the live virus that causes COVID-19.

After vaccination, will I test positive for Covid-19 on a viral test?

NO

None of the authorized/recommended vaccines can cause positive viral tests, used to detect current infections.

Will the vaccine alter my DNA?

NO

The Covid-19 messenger RNA vaccines do not change or interact with the DNA in any way.

mRNA vaccines teach cells to make proteins that trigger an immune response, but never enter the cell nucleus, where the DNA is kept.

Does the vaccine protect me from getting sick with Covid-19?

YES

The vaccine teaches the immune system to recognize/fight the virus that causes Covid-19.

The vaccines currently available have effectiveness range from 60 to 95%. Experts are still collecting data on the effects of the vaccines.

If I recovered from Covid-19, do I still need a vaccine?

YES

There are severe health risks associated with Covid-19, and reinfection is possible.

VACCINATION

After vaccination, the body takes a few weeks to build immunity.

May cause symptoms like fever, a normal sign that the body is building protection against the Covid-19 virus.

It is possible a person can be infected with the virus just before or just after vaccination and still get sick.

This is because vaccine that has not had enough time to provide protection.

MANILA, Philippines — After a nerve-wracking year marked by an unprecedented lockdown to contain a coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, investors are looking forward to a recovery in corporate earnings and stock prices this 2021.

The main-share Philippine Stock Exchange index (PSEi) may rebound to 7,878 this year on the back of a 39.7 percent recovery in earnings from last year's level.

The yearend PSEi outlook – a median of forecasts by AP Securities, BDO Unibank, CLSA, BPI Securities, AB Capital Securities, Sun Life of Canada, Papa Securities and First Metro Securities—suggests an average upside of 738.41 points or 10.3 percent from last year's finish.

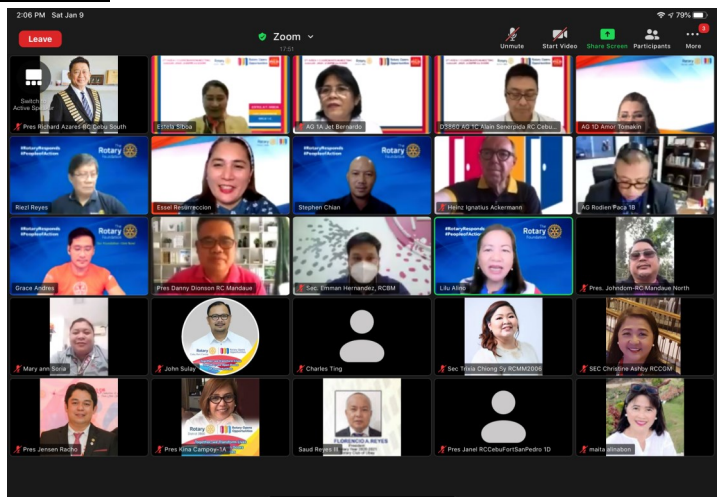
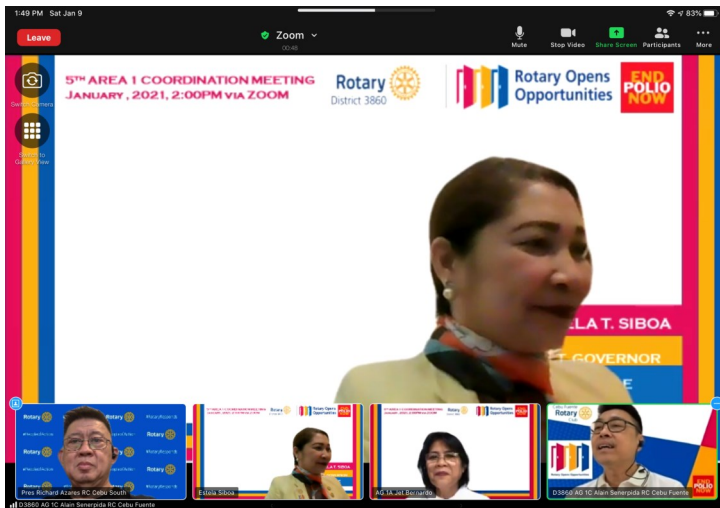

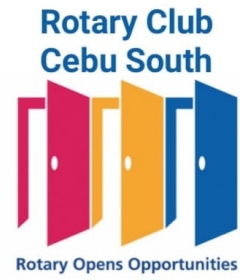
