THE 4-WAY TEST

One of the most widely printed and quoted statements of business ethics in the world is the Rotary 4-way test. It was created by Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor in 1932 where he was asked to take charge of a company that was facing bankruptcy Taylor looked for a way to save the struggling company mired in depression-caused financial difficulties. He drew up a 24-word code of ethics for all employees to follow their business and professional lives. The 4-Way Test became the guide for sales, production, advertising and all relations with dealers and customers, and the survival of the company is credited to this simple philosophy.

Herb Taylor became President of the Rotary International in 1954-55. The 4-Way Test was adopted by Rotary in 1943 and has been translated into more than a hundred languages and pub-

of the things we think, say or do.

- 1 Is it the truth?
- 2 Is it fair to all concerned?
- 3 Will it build goodwill and better friendships?
- 4 Will it be beneficial to all concerned?

OBJECT OF ROTARY

Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster;

1.The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;

2.High ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations; and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society.



3.The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life.

4.The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world of fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

- Recognize the honor and respect due to all occupations which are useful to society.
- Offer my vocational talents to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, and to improve the quality of life in my community.
- Adhere to honesty in my advertising and in all representations to the public concerning my business or profession.
- Neither seek from nor grant to a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.

ROTARY CODE OF CONDUCT

As a Rotarian, I will

1. Exemplify the core value of integrity in all behaviors and activities.
2. Use my vocational experience and talents to serve in Rotary.
3. Conduct all of my personal, business, and professional affairs, ethically, encouraging and fostering high ethical standards as an example to others.
4. Be fair in all dealings with others and treat them with the respect due to them as fellow human beings.
5. Promote recognition and respect for all occupations which are useful to society.
6. Offer my vocational talents: to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, and to improve the quality of life in my community.
7. Honor the trust that Rotary and fellow Rotarians provide and not do anything that will bring disfavor or reflect adversely on Rotary or fellow Rotarians.
8. Not seek from a fellow Rotarians a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relation-

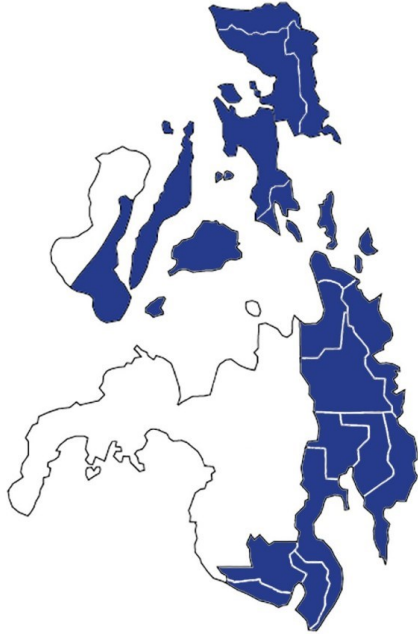

How District 3860 Evolved

Fourteen years after the first Rotary club was organized by Paul P. Harris in Chicago, the Rotary movement reached the shores of the Philippines when the Rotary Club of Manila, the first Rotary club in Asia, was chartered in June 1919.

Thirteen years later, RC Manila sponsored the birth of the first Rotary club outside Manila and the second in the country – Rotary Club of Cebu – on November 26, 1932 with 26 charter members. This was followed in 1933 by the organization of the Rotary Club of Iloilo.

RC CEBU SOUTH MILESTONES

In the beginning, the Rotary Club Cebu South was just the proverbial “gleam-in-the-eye” of RC Cebu West resident Joe Cavan, and former District Governor Marianing Ilano. The year was 1968, and a feasibility study showed that there were as many as 92 classifications that could be availed of in the southern portion of the sponsoring club’s territory. The matter was not pursued, however, and it was not until the incumbency of President Tom Espina that the move to form the new club was revived by then District Governor Onor Lozano.

On January 8, 1972 the Rotary Club Cebu South was formally organized at a meeting held at Cavan’s Resort in Guadalupe, Cebu City, and a Charter was applied for. On March 5, 1972, Rotary International gave its official sanction to the club and released its Charter as the Fourth Club in RI District 385. On May 27, 1972, Rotary Club Cebu South held its Charter Presentation and Induction at the Casino Espanol de Cebu, with first President Munding Crystal accepting the Club Charter from District Governor Onor Lozano. There were 28 Charter Members then.

Through the years, the club continues to create footprints and impact in the service of the rotary. Its passions for service were manifested by the countless awards and citations as it rises to prominence and importance. The club prided itself for having a new President every rotary. This is just among the qualities of its members who can be the leader of the Club that can continue its legacy and identity. Currently, the Club has 30 active members. Even with the swift passing of the time that some men of honor and dedication to Club’s service have gone by, the Club’s enthusiasm to serve the community and do better has earned in the Rotary Year 2016-2017 marvelous and exceptional awards, as follows:

Gaisano retail unit holds off on Cebu warehouse, prioritizes Luzon

Gaisano group-led retailer Metro Retail Stores Group Inc. (MRSGI) has carved P714.91 million out of its initial public offering (IPO) proceeds to build a new warehousing and logistics hub in Sta. Rosa City, Laguna province.

“At present, the demand for warehousing and logistics requirements in Luzon has been increasing and can no longer be accommodated by the existing leased property in Silangan, Canlubang, Laguna, which currently serves as the DC (distribution center) of the corporation for Luzon,” MRSGI said in a disclosure to the Philippine Stock Exchange on Monday.

Based on MRSGI’s prospectus in 2015 when it debuted on the Philippine Stock Exchange, P776 million of the proceeds would be earmarked for logistics and the establishment of a distribution center in Cebu, for disbursement from 2016 to 2017.

Out of the total amount, MRSGI has so far used P61.69 million, leaving a balance of P714.91 million.

Apart from a greater need for logistics facility in Luzon, MRSGI said there was no assurance that the existing leased property in Laguna—where the current facility stands—could be renewed under favorable terms in the long term.

MRSGI said it had a more viable alternative to construct its own distribution center in Sta. Rosa City, Laguna.

Furthermore, MRSGI said it could continue to serve the warehousing and logistics requirements in Cebu using the existing facilities.

Thus, MRSGI said it would be “beneficial and advantageous” for MRSGI to use the previously allocated amount to construct a distribution center in Barangay Pulong, Sta. Cruz, Sta. Rosa City, Laguna, instead of Cebu.

The target date to start construction of the new facility on Sta. Rosa City is second quarter of 2021.

Meanwhile, MRSGI also obtained approval from its board to embark on a stock buyback program to enhance shareholder value and establish an executive stock option plan. It has budgeted P300 million out of its existing cash supported by unrestricted retained earnings—without using IPO proceeds to fund the stock buyback.

The share buyback program will not involve any active and widespread solicitation from the stockholders and will be implemented in the open market through the trading facilities of the local stock exchange, the disclosure said. —**DORIS DUMLAO-ABADILLA** INQ
