THE 4-WAY TEST

One of the most widely printed and quoted statements of business ethics in the world is the Rotary 4-way test. It was created by Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor in 1932 where he was asked to take charge of a company that was facing bankruptcy Taylor looked for a way to save the struggling company mired in depressioncaused financial difficulties. He drew up a 24-word code of ethics for all employees to follow their business and professional lives. The 4-Way Test became the guide for sales, production, advertising and all relations with dealers and customers, and the survival of the company is credited to this simple philosophy.



ROTARY INTERNATIONAL NEWS UPDATE

Volunteers work to keep the community of Kingston, Ontario, healthy and safe

If ever there was a time for Rotary to step up and take initiative, this was certainly it.

Rotary and Rotaract members in Kingston, Ontario, Canada, have been volunteering at the region's largest COVID-19 vaccination center, helping to facilitate the process of immunizing hundreds of people per day.

Shortly after COVID-19 vaccines became available to the province in March, Kingston, Frontenac and Lennox & Addington (KFL&A) Public Health converted a hockey rink in the INVISTA Centre into a vaccination site. Local health workers have been vaccinating about 300 people a day and are preparing to inoculate up to 2,000 a day when more vaccine become available.

Appointments were initially open to medical workers, people who are at least 80 years old, and residents of nursing or retirement homes. But appointments will expand to people in other demographic groups when the supply increases.

Mike Moore, a member of the Rotary Club of Kingston-Frontenac, was watching news coverage of mass COVID-19 vaccination sites in the U.S. when he realized local Rotary clubs could be of use at the site near them.

"It's directing traffic or directing people or assisting in any non-technical way," says Moore. "This is what we do — we volunteer for stuff like this all the time. Our public health authorities aren't usually dealing with a pandemic, and I knew they would need help."



ROTARY INTERNATIONAL RI CONVENTION TAIWAN 12-16 June 2021

The Rotary International Convention, scheduled for 12-16 June 2021, in Taipei, Taiwan, will now be a virtual event in response to the ongoing threat of COVID-19.

We are sorry that we will not see you in Taipei this year, but this decision, made by the Rotary Board of Directors, is necessary to protect the health of everyone involved. We will share more details about the 2021 Rotary International Virtual Convention soon. Here's what you need to know now:

Convention, pre-convention, and ticket refunds

RI will automatically cancel and refund all existing registrations. This includes purchases made for Rotaract, Youth Exchange, and Intercountry Committees preconvention events, and ticketed meal events.

We kindly ask that you NOT contact RI Registration to inquire about registration, ticket, or housing cancellations as they work diligently to inform all attendees and process cancellations and refunds. Those who had already canceled prior to today will receive a refund of the \$50 processing fee.

Host Organization Committee (HOC) ticketed event registrations

The HOC event ticket fees will be refunded by the Taipei HOC. For more information, please visit <u>rotarytaipei2021.org</u>.

Hotel rooms

No action is required from those attendees who made accommodations secured within Rotary's official housing block. Maritz, formerly Experient and Rotary's official housing partner, will contact those who currently have rooms secured with the cancellation details. Others who have secured group room blocks and made a full or partial payment will receive a follow-up communication and instructions on receiving a refund.





DISTRICT 3860

Fourteen years after the first Rotary club was organized by Paul P. Harris in Chicago, the Rotary movement reached the shores of the Philippines when the Rotary Club of Manila, the first Rotary club in Asia, was chartered in June 1919.

Thirteen years later, RC Manila sponsored the birth of the first Rotary club outside Manila and the second in the country – Rotary Club of Cebu – on November 26, 1932 with 26 charter members. This was followed in 1933 by the organization of the Rotary Club of Iloilo.

In the beginning, the Rotary Club Cebu South was just the proverbial "gleam-in-the-eye" of RC Cebu West resident Joe Cavan, and former District Governor Marianing Ilano. The year was 1968, and a feasibility study showed that there were as many as 92 classifications that could be availed of in the southern portion of the sponsoring club's territory. The matter was not pursued, however, and it was not until the incumbency of President Tom Espina that the move to form the new club was revived by then District Governor Onor Lozano.

On January 8, 1972 the Rotary Club Cebu South was formally organized at a meeting held at Cavan's Resort in Guadalupe, Cebu City, and a Charter was applied for. On March 5, 1972, Rotary International gave its official sanction to the club and released its Charter as the Fourth Club in RI District 385. On May 27, 1972, Rotary Club Cebu South held its Charter Presentation and Induction at the Casino Espanol de Cebu, with first President Munding Crystal accepting the Club Charter from District Governor Onor Lozano. There were 28 Charter Members then.

Through the years, the club continues to create footprints and impact in the service of the rotary. Its passions for service were manifested by the countless awards and citations as it rises to prominence and importance. The club prided itself for having a new President every rotary. This is just among the qualities of its members who can be the leader of the Club that can continue its legacy and identity. Currently, the Club has 30 active members. Even with the swift passing of the time that some men of honor and dedication to Club's service have gone by, the Club's enthusiasm to serve the community and do better has earned in the Rotary Year 2016-2017 marvelous and exceptional awards, as follows:
