## The RAGG Pyramid: A Clear Picture of Our District's Future

The RAGG Pyramid: Understanding Our Present, Shaping Our Future

This Rotary year, District 3860 undertook a comprehensive RAGG analysis to gain a clearer understanding of our membership landscape. The purpose was not merely to review statistics, but to see, with honesty and intention, where our district stands today and where our greatest opportunities for growth truly lie.

The results form a distinct and meaningful shape, a pyramid that reflects both our strengths and our responsibilities.

At its peak are three Gold clubs, representing 3 percent of the district. With memberships of 60 or more, these clubs demonstrate what is possible when strong leadership, active engagement, and a shared sense of purpose come together. They serve as living examples of sustainability and vitality in Rotary.

Just below them are twelve Green clubs, accounting for 11.8 percent of District 3860. With 41 to 59 members, these clubs are stable and energized, poised for further growth with continued focus and support.

At the center of the pyramid are thirty-four Amber clubs, comprising 33.6 percent of all clubs. With memberships ranging from 25 to 40, these clubs represent the district's greatest opportunity. They have the structure, potential, and capacity to move upward through deeper engagement and intentional development.

Forming the foundation are forty-nine Red clubs, nearly 48.5 percent of the district, with 24 members or fewer. Rather than being a point of concern, this base defines our mission. Meaningful transformation begins here, where support, collaboration, and renewed commitment can create the strongest ripple effect across the district.

Viewed together, the RAGG Pyramid tells a powerful story. Gold shows the destination. Green reflects momentum. Amber highlights opportunity. Red defines purpose. Even modest progress at each level can elevate the entire district.

This Rotary year, District 3860 is committed to uplifting every club, supporting every president, and activating every area team. Membership growth is not simply about numbers, it is about strengthening service, expanding impact, and ensuring that no club is left behind.

When we grow together, we strengthen our ability to serve. And in doing so, we truly live our promise to Unite for Good.

# ROTARIAN DOCTOR OFFERS FREE LEPTOSPIROSIS PREVENTION IN CEBU CITY

November 4, 2025 -

As Cebu faced the aftermath of heavy rains and flooding, health concerns quickly followed, among them the threat of leptospirosis, a waterborne disease that often spreads after floods.

In true Rotary spirit, Rotarian Doctor Maamo extended his time and expertise by offering free medical prescriptions for leptospirosis prevention to Cebu City residents. His initiative ran until November 4, providing accessible care and guidance to help protect the community during a critical time.

Acts like this reflect what Rotary stands for: service that responds to real and immediate needs. Through individual commitment and compassion, members continue to uphold the Rotary ideal of "Service Above Self," turning care into concrete action when it's needed most.

# ROTARY IN ACTION: CEBU RISES AGAIN

November 8, 2025

Typhoon Tino brought heavy rains and strong winds that left many Cebuano families in urgent need of help. In the spirit of service and compassion, the Rotary Club of Cebu Fort San Pedro responded swiftly, extending relief and hope to affected communities.

Through the Bangon Cebu initiative, a total of 310 households received relief packs distributed across Talisay City. Two hundred thirty packs were delivered to Purok Talong in Poblacion, while eighty packs reached Barangay Biasong. Each relief pack contained essential items such as rice, canned goods, noodles, bottled water, and toiletries, providing comfort and immediate support during a difficult time.

This day of service reflected the true essence of Rotary, people coming together to help, uplift, and stand beside communities in need. Beyond the relief goods, it was a powerful reminder that solidarity and compassion remain Cebu's greatest strength.

Together, we rebuild. Together, we rise.



# WATER FOR HOPE

**November 8, 2025**

In Sitio Biasong and nearby Barrio Wak-wak, located in the lower valley of Brgy. Bonbon, families are now able to draw safe drinking water straight from floodwaters through the Water Roam Filter, a portable purifier that works efficiently without electricity. In just minutes, it transforms murky water into clean, drinkable water, capable of producing up to a million liters for the community.

This life-saving equipment was donated by the Red Cross Singapore, through the coordination of Dr. Maamo and Mr. Jun Hulaysan of the Philippine Coast Guard Auxiliary, and turned over to Mr. Steven Lava for the benefit of the residents of Sitio Biasong and Barrio Wak-wak.

The Rotary Club of Cebu Fort San Pedro also distributed 100 relief packs to support families in these affected areas as part of its ongoing recovery efforts.



# A DAY OF PURPOSE OVER PANIC

November 9, 2025

Despite a last-minute evacuation notice, we pushed through after confirming that Typhoon Uwan had already passed. Our plan to distribute relief at a church changed quickly, and we set up medical and legal aid at the evacuation site instead. Thank you to DGN Edwin Valencia, our volunteer doctors, and pharmacists.

With DGE Arlene Adlawan, we reached remote mountain sitios where families said little help had arrived. There, we distributed food, water, and essentials to those most in need. Hearing their stories of floods and loss was heartbreakingly, but it reminded us why we serve.

Three more roadside distributions followed, wrong turns, traffic, and mud included. Still, we carried on, because that's what Rotary does.

What began as a two-club effort turned into a multi-club mission with Rotary District 3860, the Rotary Clubs of Cebu, Mandaue East, Metro Cebu, Cebu Fort San Pedro, and friends from Davao. Together, we lived our calling: Service Above Self.

# A NEW CHAPTER OF LEADERSHIP



We're grateful for your trust and your time, and we look forward to bringing more people together through service and purpose in the future.



This month also includes the announcement of the official Rotary International exchange rate for November 2025, set at \$1 = ₱59. This helps ensure transparency and consistency in contributions and transactions across Rotary activities.


