## WHAT HAPPENED LAST WEEK...

### BUSINESS MEETING

President Mike shared exciting news that we received the approval for 2 major global grants, one for ROSAS that amounted to \$163,000 and our GOL VTT at \$290,000. He took the opportunity to encourage our members to take part in these activities in line with our spirit of volunteerism.



He also announced that at present, our contributions to The Rotary Foundation is at \$89,000 just 2 months into our Rotary Year. He expressed optimism that the club will breach the \$100k level very soon. He encouraged all to continue this momentum of generosity.

PDG Ed Chiongbian spoke briefly about the unfortunate rise of dengue cases in our region. While Cebu had been spared, outlying areas have been hit hard. One of these is Bohol. He announced a planned one-day trip to Tagbilaran to meet with members of RC Panglao and discuss plans to launch another anti-dengue program through the effective application of Temephos. He will be accompanied by the district's anti-dengue czar, RC Metro Cebu PP Wyben Briones and Rtn. Bobong Castillo.

Sec. Walter Cang shared some update regarding the upcoming VTT, including the recent release of the volunteer matrix and requested our members to be aware of their assignment and schedule and to communicate with their team lead and committee head

if their schedule has a conflict. He also informed everyone that the students from Paypay National High school are in town undertaking their OJT for the next 3 months. 7 of them are staying in the home generously provided by PP Stephen. Anyone who wishes to donate food or snack items to augment their limited resources may notify Sec. Walter

Our speaker last week is more a Rotarian, a banker, singer and our go-to for all things banking. Rtn. Jun Castaño has delivered his annual report, "Where's The Beef", to our club for many years. As a banker, he has insight into our country's financial well-being, and an in-depth view that is often unseen by most of us. Rtn. Jun shared his report by first telling us how our country economically fared in 2018, identifying the drivers behind the rise and fall of our economy. Then he segued into how the different regions performed in terms of deposits year to year.

As expected NCR continues to hold the lion's share of money saved in banks with Makati, Manila and Quezon city taking the top 3 spots of cities with the largest deposit. Cebu, Davao and Iloilo took over the top 3 spots for provincial cities. Compared to other cities in the country, Cebu was ranked no. 5 nationwide, no. 1 in Vis-Min. It was interesting to note Clark, Pampanga's meteoric rise due to the huge amount of money flowing it due to the infrastructure program that is going full blast, with highways and expansion of their airport that is generating a lot of direct and indirect growth.

Jun shared one concerning info and that was Cebu's position in the rankings is being challenged. Cities around our region have registered robust growth rates in the last few years while Cebu seemed to be plodding along, with 2016 and 2017 showing single digit growth rates for bank deposits unlike its previous years. One factor cited was the worsening traffic situation, a handicap that came inevitably with high vehicle sales in an unchanged topography.

So Cebuanos can rejoice in the fact that we're still doing relatively well in our lofty spot but we shouldn't sit back and relax because challenging times are upon us. Rtn. Jun did not go in-depth into how the trend can be changed or steps to take in order to keep pace with growth of other cities. But he did point out that Cebu, Mandaue and Lapu-Lapu cities combined have 89.2% of deposits in the province! Perhaps it's time to spread the wealth and look more closely into expanding businesses outside of these cities. Spread the wealth, manage the growth and stay in the countryside. This allows the rest of the province to begin taking a more active role in our growth. Certainly food for thought!

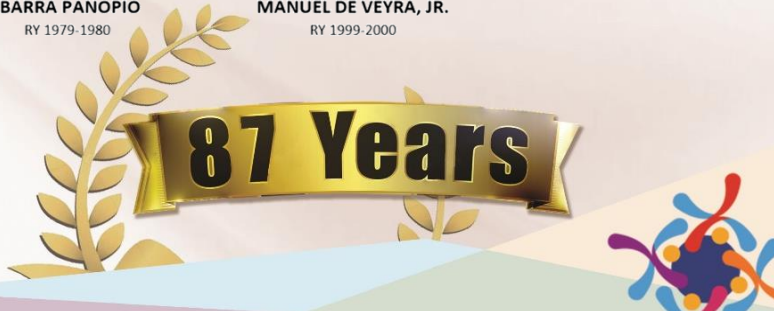

# POLIOPLUS FACT SHEET

Although it currently circulates in only a few countries, polio is highly infectious and spreads rapidly. The disease, which afflicts mainly children, is transmitted via contaminated water and food supplies. Five to 10 percent of cases are fatal. As long as polio threatens even one child anywhere in the world, children everywhere are at risk. Only the global eradication of polio will ensure that no child ever again suffers its devastating effects.

## WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

- If polio is not eradicated, within 10 years, as many as 200,000 children will be paralyzed by it each year.
- In 2018, more than 400 million children were vaccinated multiple times using more than two billion doses of oral polio vaccine. This will be done every year until the world is certified polio free. Rotary funds will help do this.
- To date, 122 countries have benefited from PolioPlus grants.
- Since 1988, the number of polio endemic countries declined from over 125 to three.
- With the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, every \$1 Rotary commits to polio eradication is matched 2-to-1 (up to \$ 50 million per year).

On average, a child can be fully protected against polio for US\$3.



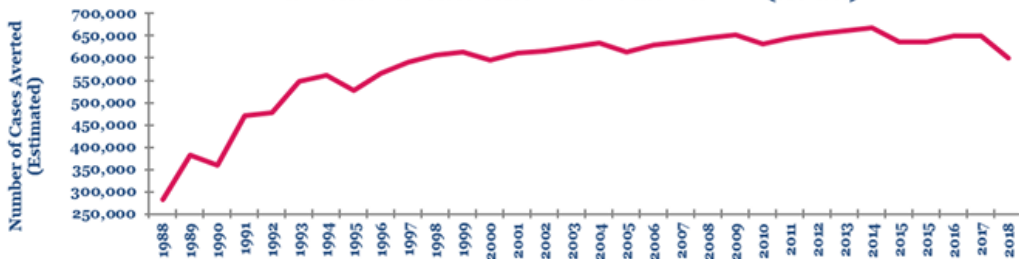
A study published in 2010 in the medical journal "Vaccine" estimates the economic benefit of polio eradication as US\$40-50 billion.



Since 1998, Vitamin A supplements have been added to polio immunization activities, helping to avert an estimated 1.5 million childhood deaths.

Polio Dashboard

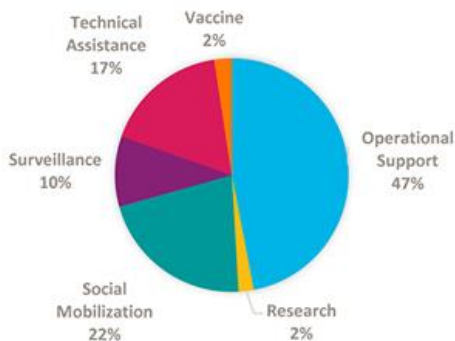
## FUNDING

- A new strategy called the *Polio Endgame Strategy 2019-2023: Eradication, Integration, Certification and Containment* is being drafted. Rotary is extending our matching agreement with the Gates Foundation to raise US\$50 million per year to be matched 2:1 to support the new strategic plan.
- By the time the world is certified polio-free, Rotary's contributions to the global polio eradication effort will exceed US\$2.2 billion, including over US\$985 million in matching funds from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation.
- Rotary's contribution to the GPEI since 1988 accounts for nearly 10% of all contributions through June 2018 and approximately 31% of private sector giving.

### Select PolioPlus Grant Projects Funded in 2018

1. DR Congo: 300,000 information, education and communication materials (posters) as well as 751 broadcasting messages by community based media during National Immunization Days.
2. Afghanistan: Allowance and training for 125,014 vaccinators during one National Immunization Day and one Sub-National Immunization Day.
3. Pakistan: Allowance and training for 310,229 vaccinators during one National Immunization Day and one Sub-National Immunization Day.
4. Cameroon: Organization of a micro-plan workshop, 800 post-round evaluation meetings, and cross-border activities for one National Immunization Day.

### What is circulating vaccine-derived virus?

In populations with low-immunization coverage, it is possible for the weakened virus used in the oral vaccine to circulate in the environment long enough to undergo genetic changes that can cause paralysis. This is called vaccine derived poliovirus and is tracked separately than cases of wild poliovirus. When a population is fully immunized, they will be protected against both vaccine derived and wild polioviruses.

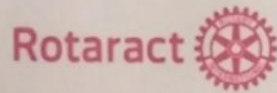
