#### WHAT HAPPENED LAST WEEK...

BUSINESS MEETING

This week's meeting started off on a high as Pres. Mike announced the total collection for TRF has breached the \$100k mark! Well done RCC. We still have many months ahead of us so let's keep the ball rolling. He also reminded everyone that the club sponsored New Members and Club Protocols seminar is happening on Saturday the 24th. He encouraged all new members to join as it gives greater insight into how Rotary works, and the hows and whys our meetings are undertaken the way they are.

Our speaker last week, Ed Hitosis is from EduChild, where together with his wife he cochairs the "Married Love" course. Ed first spoke about their program designed to teach parents how to deal with their growing kids, called NPEP, New Parent Education Program. I had taken that course and indeed it provides greater insight into understanding the minds of our kids and what makes them tick. He also stressed how one child can be very different from others so what works on one may not necessarily work with another.



Ed spoke of modules covered under the course for married couples and the first module they share is Marriage is a Lifetime Commitment. He described the difference between a contract and a covenant, the latter being made with God rather than man. And that one cannot ascribe an expiry date to a covenant. One of the biggest take away from his talk was Men and Women are Different. Our minds are wired different from women. The

often used phrase of "Men are from Mars and women are from Venus" had greater meaning when he cited examples of how men and women deal with stress. Polar opposites! And this often sets up a perfect setting for how we dig ourselves into a deeper hole.

He spoke of Marital Communication, a rather innocuous phrase that is often the source of marital strife. For a man's way of saying something innocent can be sound waves that enter a woman's ear and by the time it reaches her brain, has turned into a completely different message. One interesting fact in marital communication is that only 30% are verbal, 70% are non-verbal. And of that 30% verbal communication, only 7% are actual words that are spoken, the rest being the tone of the voice, temperament, etc. And it works both ways to boot!

Work Life Balance was another module and as the name implies, it is one's ability to maintain a good balance of the two. This reminds me of my cardiologist's advice when it came to food. Everything in moderation is always good. And the last module covers Family Life, Ed reminded us of our priorities in married life which involves the children, our spouse and parents/relatives. We must always prioritize our spouses because one day, our kids will leave and our parents will pass on. We will only have our spouse so we should always give them our priority. In doing so, our children will follow next and our parents to follow them. While this often makes sense, he pointed out that in some cultures and countries, the sequence can go the opposite way.

Their method of teaching involves case studies, couple discussion, small group discussions with a facilitator and a plenary discussion with a moderator. One interesting information is that often the parties go through the course without evening realizing they have a problem. But through their process of discussion and deliberation, they can begin to identify the problem and recognize the cause, and finally what to do about it. It may be as simple as setting "alone" time for the couple each week, or even just to set a time for an honest talk with their kids, or even just a vacation.

As I looked across the room, it was interesting to see the facial expressions of our members, young and old. Some smiled as they recalled previous skirmishes as a result of such an example. Others nodded in agreement while some snickered like one who's hand had been caught in a cookie jar.

In closing, he reminded us all to invest time in our family. Parenting is a task that should not be left to chance and for the forces of the environment take over. For no amount of success can compensate for failure in the home.

#### My fellow Rotarians:



I'm pleased to share the important news that as of today, 21 August 2019, it has been three years since a child in Nigeria was paralyzed by the wild poliovirus. This means that the entire World Health Organization (WHO) African region could be certified as wild poliovirus-free as soon as mid-2020.

Along with our Global Polio Eradication Initiative partners and the Nigerian government, we've strengthened immunization and disease detection systems, and we are now reaching more children than ever in some of the hardest-to-reach places in Nigeria.

We can take pride in this progress, but it is not time to celebrate quite yet. We still have work to do and we must continue making it a priority to reach every child in Nigeria—and other polio-threatened countries—with the polio vaccine, and build strong levels of immunity to fully protect the entire population against polio.

In part because of the hard work and dedication of Rotarians in Nigeria and around the world, we will soon be able to check another country off of the polio-endemic list. Rotary members in Nigeria have been hard at work raising awareness for polio eradication, advocating with the government and addressing other basic health needs to complement polio eradication efforts, like providing clean water to vulnerable communities.

After the African region is certified wild poliovirus-free later next year, 5 out of the 6 WHO regions in the world will be considered polio-free. As the first organization to dream of – and promise to deliver – a polio-free world, Rotary is committed to fulfilling our promise. Our progress in Nigeria is a big step toward that goal, but we need to maintain momentum so that Pakistan and Afghanistan see the same level of progress.

It's crucial that Rotarians continue to support polio eradication as we overcome the final hurdles in the fight to end the disease forever. You can support PolioPlus by making a donation, or raise awareness by holding an event or fundraiser on World Polio Day on 24 October.


I look forward to joining with Rotarians as soon as mid-2020 to celebrate a wild poliovirus-free Africa.




















## Rotary International District 3860 Philippines

#### **Areas of Focus**

Rotary has identified six areas of focus that reflect critical humanitarian issues and needs that Rotarians are addressing worldwide. Each icon to the right represents one facet of Rotary's six areas of focus:



- 1. Peacebuilding and Conflict Prevention (Formerly Peace and conflict prevention/resolution)
- 2. Disease Prevention and Treatment
- 3. Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (Formerly Water and Sanitation)
- 4. Maternal and child health
- 5. Basic education and literacy
- 6. Community Economic Development (Formerly Economic and Community development)





Show all six icons together uniformly in one Rotary neutral color.

When discussing one specific area of focus, highlight that icon using any Rotary leadership or secondary color. All other icons should remain neutral.



When all areas are being discussed simultaneously, highlight all six icons using a single Rotary leadership or secondary color.



Use the same color to highlight the icons within a single document or communication.

Do not color code the six areas of focus, and do not alter proportions or the shape of the circle housing the symbols.
