WHAT HAPPENED LAST WEEK...

WEEKLY LUNCHEON MEETING

At our meeting last week, we were fortunate to have in our midst, Ms. Michelle Rohan from the RC of Moorestown, NJ. This is the first time we are hosting a Rotarian whose club and district is one of the donors for this year's



Gift of Life VTT program. Having been forewarned by Roy Morris of our tradition to invite female guests to lead in the fellowship singing, she was coiled and ready to hit the notes with a very great rendition of Bon Jovi's "Livin' on a Prayer" and I dare say she sang with distinction beside some of our fellow Rotarians!

Michelle spoke eloquently of her personal involvement with Gift of Life and was very impressed with what she had seen the last few days since her arrival. She was scheduled to accompany PP Bing Martinez on a road trip to Daan Bantayan and Tabuelan to distribute books to the schools in the area and no doubt it will be an eye-opening experience for her. We wished her all the best in her journey, and may this be the first and not the last trip for her to our shores.

We also had in our midst Rotarian Ambassador-at-Large from RC Manila, our mother club, Rtn. Bobby Joseph who presented us the commemorative coffee table book of their 100th founding year. He was also followed by DS Barbetta Lominoque. She spoke briefly about an invitation to RC Districts in the country to visit Russia and then introduced a former RCC member, and now a member of RC Metro Cebu, Rtn. Cesar Narvasa Atienza. Rtn. Cesar informed us that Phil. President Rodrigo Duterte is set to fly to Russia at the end of the month to meet his counterpart. An invitation was also extended by Russia's RC District (they only have one) to RC Districts in the Philippines to join the Phil. delegation and sign a sisterhood agreement. He encouraged members of RCC who may be interested to join this trip to sign up.

Our guest speaker had the unenviable task of speaking about the chronic garbage situation in Cebu. With over 600 tons of garbage disposed by residents of metro Cebu daily, the Hon. Councilor Joel Garganera had his work cut out for him. Having been in politics for many years, he came well prepared with a deck and pertinent data related to his topic. It was a bit

alarming and sad to hear that how our government had put convenience and short sightedness ahead of long-term plans by operating a dumping ground instead of a proper landfill. How steps to prevent leeching of chemicals and allow venting of dangerous fumes were never instituted. Images of these dumpsites flashed on the screen and one can easily imagine the smell that must have emanated in these areas. These failures surely had 2 casualties at the very least – our environment and ourselves.

Councilor Garganera enumerated the many sites that has since been used as alternatives to the Inayawan dump site. Aloguinsan, Binaliw, Consolacion and other areas around the island. But sadly, there seems to be a lack of cohesion in the plans for a long-term facility to handle trash coming from the city. A status quo is not an option and touched on the different options to consider, from incineration to recycling. Bottom line is Cebuanos must help in finding a suitable solution to the problem and not just leave it to the government.



Personally, I felt he was mouthing many things that had already been said by other politicians and I was hard pressed to hear anything that can be considered “net new”. And I reached this conclusion not as an indictment of his ability but more of accepting the fact that when it comes to garbage disposal, there is no such thing as a new idea or a new discovery. It’s an age-old problem tackled by politicians of many generations. Therefore, I did not expect to hear anything earth shaking because as they say, it’s same old, same old. The only way we can effectively tackle this is for every Cebuano to be willing to sacrifice, for our government to do what is right, not what cheap, what will work long term, not what is a shortcut.

There’s been too many “studies” made, meetings held, consensus asked, and constituents consulted. The only way to deal with this is to meet it head on, with steely resolve, hold the course and pray that the politicians who come after him will for once, forsake the damn attitude of his-way-against-my-way and plod on. Otherwise we will be doomed to smell and drown in our own filth one day.



HOW DID THE ROTARY FOUNDATION GET STARTED? The Rotary Foundation was created in 1917 by Rotary International's sixth president, Arch C. Klumph, as an endowment fund for Rotary "to do good in the world." It has grown from an initial contribution in 1917 of \$26.50 from the Rotary Club of Kansas City, Missouri to more than 2.663 billion dollars in total contributions. The Rotary Foundation made its first grant of \$500.00 to the International Society for Crippled Children in 1930, and to this day, it continues to "do good in the world" in the name of Rotary.

Tan gave a brief but very inspiring welcome speech to enkindle to everyone the importance and impact of the activity. The participants then headed to Oceanside village to formally start the mangrove planting activity. Along with some local fishermen and guides, the participants immediately got themselves wet and a bit muddy as they indulge on the shallow waters of the shore to plant seedlings of mangroves. While were on it, it was also good that we had the initiative to communicate with a local that was able to impart with us on the proper planting of mangroves. It was an eye opener, as we noticed that the mangroves we planted last year did not seem to grow as we weren't able to see vast amounts of grown-up mangroves in the area.
