### WHAT HAPPENED LAST WEEK...

BUSINESS MEETING

One thing that makes our meetings interesting has always been our guests. On certain days, it may be someone important, on others, someone we barely know. Sometimes the topic may be a burning issue, and others a topic that doesn't appeal to too many. But this has never stopped us from attending our meeting, after all, the fellowship we enjoy is just as important. Occasionally we hear from someone who talks about something, we're all familiar with. And sometimes, like last week, we listened to a guest speaker who comes from an industry that only the blind would not appreciate, publishing. Print news reporting to be more precise. Yet for everything that we already know about, we realized we've only ever scanned the front pages, pun intended. For deep into the pages behind, is a story that was new to many of us.

Jayjay Neri Jr. belongs to an old breed of leaders flourishing in an industry that many consider to be in the sunset. Worldwide, he acknowledged that the newspaper industry has seen its circulation go on a downward slump, a trend ongoing for many years. The prognosis for the near and long term isn't any better either. The cost of paper accounts for one of the highest in a newspaper. In fact, for every

copy that goes out the press, they only get a



fraction of the cost back in sales. The only way they can make up for this by selling ad space. Yet even in that aspect, the numbers have dropped. For many publications, the more copies they sell, the more money they stand lose. A nasty catch 22 situation. Over the years as he says, "Many are bleeding" and in fact one of our country's most popular broadsheets, The Phil. Daily Inquirer, has been losing money for years. Philippine Star, and Sunstar Publishing continues to buck the trend and stay in the black.

This begs the question, how is Sunstar Publishing doing Mr. Neri? Since, Jayjay heads the media group that publishes most widely read and circulated newspapers in major cities outside of Manila, his story is worth listening. Despite all the gloom, they are doing well. With newspapers in key cities in Visayas and Mindanao, they have spread their presence and increased their following. They have looked into bundling their ad space sales with online print and video presence for their advertisers. It is a matter of changing one's mindset that

allows them to keep innovating to stay relevant. Yet he admits this is perhaps the hardest challenge they face.

Because readership profile has changed with millennials; now becoming a force to contend with. They had to come up with ways to make sure they still appeal to them. Retailers and fashion brands are now suffering because their market prefer to live, work, eat, and buy online. He also mentioned that decision makers and industry leaders still prefer to read their news the traditional way. But I personally think this is little consolation. For these leaders' behavior is present only because they are from the old generation, soon to be replaced by younger ones who think more like millennials than Gen X or Gen Zs.

spoke of traditional publications He switching their resources online, to sell advertising and subscription in that space. Yes, it has not worked very well due to the preponderance of online news available for free. But he cited NY Times which had seen subscription rise when they switched online. That's good but the qualifying statement that came after that was a humdinger. They flourished because of their crossword puzzle and cooking videos BUNDLED with the subscription. Rather tell-tale if I may declare! He also spoke of coming up with tabloids to buck the trend. Seems that circulation for these are healthy owing to its low price, high

readership, and for some, a tendency to come up with naughty headlines. And no, they don't and won't get into that.

In the end, he said one thing they have going for them when it comes to competing with online publications is this – veracity. Fake news abounds on the web and even publications like Rappler and PDI have been caught peddling fake news. In short, you can't trust the internet 100% but if it's on print, documented for posterity, a statement printed in black and white on something you can hold in your hands, it must be true.

Yes, the differentiator between them and those who publish fake news is they go out of their way to verify their news is true. But it is a process undertaken by their staff and therefore fraught with risk if they are not careful. No doubt, Sunstar has done a great job in protecting their reputation so they have been careful when it came to be vetting their sources. This is where they excel and must stay on top to stay in the game. This is where anyone worth their salt in peddling news, be it in print or online, must uphold to the highest standard.

Thank you Jayjay for sharing your story with us. We appreciate the insight into the world we thought we know much of and yet your stories and experiences were eye-opening. We wish you all the best and success in your noble undertaking!

It was launched in 1985, with the help of Dr. Albert Sabin, developer of the oral polio vaccine, as a worldwide program to protect children from the cruel and fatal consequences of polio. In 1988, the World Health Assembly challenged the world to eradicate polio, and since that time, Rotary's efforts along with partner agencies, including the World Health Organization, the United Nations' Children's Fund, the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and governments around the world have achieved a 99 percent reduction in the number of polio cases worldwide. By the time the world is certified polio-free, our contributions will make Rotary the largest non-governmental financial contributor to the global polio eradication effort.

# **RIDE TO END POLIO CEBU 2019**

Cycling So Others May Walk

### **ABOUT RIDE TO END POLIO**

This coming November 22-24, 2019, Rotary Club of Cebu will hold the first ever Ride to End Polio Cebu. This is a 550-kilometer ride composing of Rotarians and friends of Rotary cyclists with the main goal of raising funds to provide vaccines for the island of Cebu. This 3-day ride also aims to create awareness that polio is a deadly yet very preventable disease. We are hopeful that we can raise vaccination rate to 95%.

#### **ABOUT ROTARY & POLIO**

Rotary's global quest is eradication of polio in the world; the goal is to make every child safe from the ravages of this terrible disease. Since 1985, Rotary has helped reduce the incidence of polio more than 99+% (from 1000 cases per day to less than 230 per year); more than two billion children around the world has received oral polio vaccine. In 1979, Rotary International's first efforts at eradicating polio was here in the Philippines. The last case of Polio was reported in 1993 and by year 2000, we were declared polio-free. Just recently, Polio cases were discovered. We are "this close", but we need to finish the job, and you can help by raising funds with your pledge in the Ride to End Polio.

### WHERE CAN YOU HELP

We are asking for contributions or pledges from Rotarians and Non-Rotarians alike to pledge. These pledges shall become donations as these cyclists complete the 550-kilometer ride around the whole island of Cebu. All funds will go the eradication of polio.



### The roots of Rotary's polio eradication efforts

On 29 September 1979, volunteers administered drops of oral polio vaccine to children at a health center in Guadalupe Viejo, Makati, Philippines. The event in metropolitan Manila was arranged and attended by Rotarians and delegates from the Philippine Ministry of Health.

When James L. Bomar Jr., then RI president, put the first drops of vaccine into a child's mouth, he ceremonially launched the Philippine poliomyelitis immunization

effort. Rotary's first Health, Hunger and Humanity (3-H) Grant project was underway.

Bomar and Enrique M. Garcia, the country's minister of health, had earlier signed an agreement committing Rotary International and the government of the Philippines to a joint multiyear effort to immunize about 6 million children against polio, at a cost of about \$760,000.

In a 1993 interview, Bomar reminisced about the trip. He recalled how the brother of one of the children he had immunized



tugged on his pant leg to get his attention and said, "Thank you, thank you, Rotary."

The project's success led Rotary to make polio eradication a top priority. Rotary launched PolioPlus in 1985 and was a founding member of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative in 1988. Through decades of commitment and work by Rotary and our partners, more than 2.5 billion children have received the oral polio vaccine.
