Forty years ago, the first Polio vaccination happened in the Philippines, Manila on the 29th of September. Then followed the island of Cebu. It was an event attended no less than RI President. James L Bomar, Jr. And in the morning of October 1, 1979, Polio drops were administered at Cebu City Medical Center headed by Rotary Club of Cebu President Ibarra Panopio. Rotary International and the Health Ministry signed an agreement to immunize Six million children against Polio in a multi-year implementation. So today, it is with great honor and privilege that we recognize the effort of Past President Dr. Ibarra Panopio on this 40th World Polio Day.

WHAT HAPPENED LAST WEEK...

CLASSIFICATION TALK

This week, we started our meeting with a series of jokes from RCC's PP John Domingo who was visiting from the states. PP John is said to be heading back soon after wrapping up important personal matters stateside. As a PP, he's well loved by our members, more so when he steps up the podium to share jokes that brings out laughter from even the most reserved member. Makes me thing John must have been a comedian in his past life, if there is such a thing. It was good to see you again John and we look forward to the day when you will once again call Cebu your home.

With the District 3860 Walk to End Polio coming up, PP Bernard shared details of the upcoming event such as meeting time and venue and exhorted everyone in the room to take part. He then gave

updates on next month's Ride to End Polio (also known as End Polio Perimeter Cycling Cebu 2019). Going through the details, it was abundantly clear this undertaking is no walk in the park. Everything about it is fraught with complexity in logistics, difficulty in planning, requiring commitment in training, and surely, tenacity in undertaking. Kudos to PP Bernard who conceptualized this and continues to lead the charge with his team of volunteers. And if that weren't difficult enough, we continued to face the challenge of sourcing the vaccines needed to mount a decent vaccination drive in the target towns. I hope this provincial undertaking will galvanize our all members to help in any way possible. We have called on other Rotary clubs to join us by raising pledges on their own which will go towards their own club's donation to PolioPlus.

Rtn. DJ Moises also spoke briefly to update us on the WASH projects we are undertaking this year. With an ocular recon trip scheduled Friday next week, he enumerated the 6 target schools that need to be visited in southern Cebu. There will be 2 groups, one headed to the eastern side and the other the west facing side with plans to meet up at some point along the way.

Rtn. George Paraoan conducted a classification talk but before he started, we were treated to the oratory skills of our beloved PP and most senior member, Joe Gapas who introduced his nephew. It was also Joe who sponsored George who likely saw the potentials in his

young nephew to become an asset to Rotary. He shared his of story George's life and how he became а Mariner and how when George decided bid adieu to his globetrotting



life, he sat down with him and shared his passion for Rotary.

Rtn. George shared experience working in the maritime industry as a merchant marine officer. He also showed us a photo of his "baby", a cargo ship with a capacity of up to 80,000 cars! Yes, for a behemoth, it only required a crew of 18 due to advanced technology packed into the ship. He sailed all over the globe, Korea to Europe and anywhere in the US. Throughout his journeys, he realized that even though Filipinos are well known for manning ships that sailed the world, the quality of training could be further improved.



So, 5 years ago, he gave up his wandering life and founded his company to train future mariners using simulators. This was a giant step from the traditional use of the chalkboard used in his days to learn navigation. He has since taken it a step further that his company is now an assessment center to administer industry required theoretical and practical exams. This used to be done only in Manila until the government began a program to decentralize the process. His company, Integrated Maritime became the first outside of Manila to be granted this authority.

He also shared some interesting facts, such as when travelling at night, the ship loaded with cargo worth hundreds of millions of dollars can continue its journey with only 2 crews staying up. The rest, even the engineers, retire to their bunks to rest. Again, this is made possible through automation and technology. The destination once entered on to the computer, is plotted by the system and one only needs to monitor the progress of your journey, overriding the computer only when necessary. So while their manual skills may not be necessary, their technical skills need to be on track.

The beauty of simulators is that they can recreate any situation that could be encountered and repeatedly practice maneuvers so that it becomes second instinct. The result is that with the use of simulators, mariners graduate with more confidence, higher skills and better chances for success in their careers.

"RAC Cebu Joins Walk To End Polio Now"



The Philippines was declared polio-free country since October 2000, with the last case of poliovirus reported in 1993. After 19 years, the DOH on Thursday, September 19, declared a polio epidemic or outbreak after it recorded a case of the disease from a 3-year old girl in Lanao del Sur last September 14.

The DOH sees low vaccination coverage, poor early surveillance of polio symptoms and substandard sanitation practices as culprits in this reemergence.

The health department found that polio

vaccination for children with or below 5 years old, as the target of polio virus, dropped to less than 95% in 2018, and the average polio vaccination stands at about 66-68%.

This polio epidemic in a polio-free country is a reason why the Rotary and Rotaract need to double their effort to increase awareness to End Polio Now.

As part of the Rotaract Club of Cebu's campaign to End Polio Now, they joined and supported the District 3860 activity entitled "Walk To End Polio Now" hosted by



their mother club, the Rotary Club of Cebu, on Sunday, October 20, at 5-9am at Fuente Osmeña Circle to Metro Colon back to Fuente Osmeña Circle.

The Walk To End Polio was a great success. But the real success lies to the informed people after they witness the Walk To End Polio and let their children



from 5 and below years old be polio vaccinated.

After the event, the Rotaract Club of Cebu attended the mass at Basilica Minore del Sto. Niño in Cebu City and went to SM after for their fellowship.

It was indeed a memorable friendship building & productive day for the Rotaractors of Cebu.
