WHAT HAPPENED LAST WEEK...

Once again, I have been proven wrong. Just as I thought we had set a hard-to-break record in terms of attendance in 2019, I arrived last week to a standing room only luncheon meeting! We had a great mix of visiting Rotarians from RC Banilad Metro and a few more from other clubs which I failed to take note of, much to my regret. Of course,



we had 8 members of RC Chilliwack-Fraser from British Columbia, Canada together with a few more friends in our midst. They had visited Balungag Elem. School in the hinterlands of San Fernando to conduct the handover of the school's WASH facility.

Their President, Mike McLatchy shared how touched he was to see and meet the children of the school and the warm welcome accorded them. He shared how their trip was an eye opener and hoped that this trip may be the start of a long-term collaborative effort between the 2 clubs. As a gesture of friendship and gratitude, he invited all RCC members to stand up and gave each of us a small pin of the Canadian flag and another one that represents the first nations, the aboriginal tribe that inhabited Canada in the past. For the club, he presented a wooden carving in the shape of a paddle used by first nation Indians to travel in their canoes.



One of their members, Sandy Stilling, spoke to us about the Days for Girls Program. Sandy is a retired schoolteacher and shared with us her story of how Days for Girls came into being. DFG began in 2008 when Founder and CEO Celeste Mergens was working with a family foundation in the outskirts of Nairobi, Kenya. It was during her trip that she learned girls who hit puberty were forced to stay home and be unproductive when they



had their monthly period. Unable to leave their room, they often went without food unless someone would bring it to them. This situation came as a shock to her since women from developed countries never found themselves in such a predicament!

Their initial attempt to address this situation was pretty straightforward, ship sanitary pads to Kenya so women may lead a more normal life during their time of the month. Alas, while it temporarily resolved one issue, it created a more long-term fallout. Because of the absence of an effective garbage disposal system in their country, discarded sanitary pads began to show up in places where garbage was disposed, often in plain sight. Clearly a Plan B was necessary, and this came in the form of a washable, reusable and long-lasting pad. By trial and error and over 28 iterations later, the

DFG kit as they are known today was born.

Today, Days for Girls has reached more than one million women and girls in 125+ countries with DfG Kits and menstrual health education. With proper care and maintenance, these kits could last up to 3 year, translating into over 115 million days of dignity, health, and opportunity! What makes this story even better is that the founding organization has an incredible website that helps other organizations learn how to make their own kit to give away, providing ideas on how to take the program to the next level



as a livelihood project for communities. Truly an inspiring story of how to turn a sad circumstance into one of triumph and upliftment of life.
