ROTARY CLUB OF CEBU

Chartered on November 28, 1932, Rotary Club of Cebu is the second oldest club in the Philippines. The club currently has 63 members and prides itself in the quality of its members and the excellent fellowship that characterizes its weekly meetings.

The club sponsored the organization of several Rotary clubs in the Visayas and has produced six district governors, including Vicente L. Faenar, Joaquin Panis, Vicente Lozada, Federico Reyes and Manuel de Veyra. The latest, Edgar Chiongban, was the District Governor in RY2013-2014 and also the RY2017-2018 Chairman of the Philippine College of Rotary Governors.

Rotary International District 3860 has consistently recognized the club for its role and contribution to the District, winning the Club of the Year and President of the Year awards multiple times over the years. Our members continue to donate generously to The Rotary Foundation and consistently leads the District in TRF Donations and Disaster relief drives. The club has long led the district with the greatest number of Major Donors (15 currently) and in RY2019-2020, three members of the club (one posthumously) were inducted into the Arch Klumph Society, the first AKS members in our District. Likewise, RCC was the first club to establish a TRF Endowment Fund in the District. Lastly, the RCC has been very active in Global Grant projects, leading the country with almost 5% of the total approved Philippine global grant budget over the past six years.

Greetings from the Rotary Club of Cebu!

It has been a whirlwind of activities for our club during the first month of Rotary Year 2021-2022. We kicked it off during the first week with our annual New Rotary Year Party at Community Scouts Youth and Guidance Center. Then we had our first hybrid meeting at Casino Espanol on the second week with Atty Joy Pesquera who heads the Noah Complex Mega Vaccination Site followed by a virtual meeting with Mandaue City Mayor Jonas Cortes the week after. We are very grateful for both guest speakers for sharing their time to speak to our club about topics that are affecting the Cebu community. And we were also able to connect in person with Lars Wittig from our sister club Rotary Club of Makati West who is our partner with the Gift of Life Program.

Our Gift of Life program has transitioned to sending patients to Manila because elective surgeries are not yet being done in our partner hospital here in Cebu. Despite the challenges in the travel restrictions and logistics, Dir. George and the Gift of Life Team have been able to save more than 20 children with Congenital Heart Defects already. PP Bernard has also been personally connecting with so many past and new patients around the province of Cebu to attend to their needs. Thanks to these heroes

of our club for their passion in giving these children a new lease in life.

Since last year, our club has been working on our own vaccination program for our members and their extended families. This is with the help of Mandaue Chamber of Commerce under ICTSI Foundation Inc. Thanks to the herculean efforts of Rtn Stanley Go

and Sec Charles Ong for making this very very complicated project possible.

Our Service Projects Team has also been going around the whole province and even outside the province to provide assistance by way of distributing

Personal Protective Equipment and other necessities to help the frontliners in battling this pandemic. This is also a difficult task considering that we have to take care of our own safety but Dir Joey Ontanillas has always been on top of everything from inventory, turnovers, deliveries, and documentation.

One of the Global Grant Projects planned for this rotary year is the Butuanon Linear Park or Rotary Park and the club had the opportunity to visit first hand the sites wherein this can be located. The site was the former dumpsite in Barangay Umamad 7 years ago and the transformation is astounding as it is now very clean and flat with healthy soil. A very promising project indeed that when done, can be enjoyed by everyone.

And with Global Grants, we are currently continuing with our ongoing projects which are the Juan Pamplona National High School and Paypay National High School TechVoc and we have provided the necessary equipment, training for teachers, and produced graduates that are currently doing their immersion program in well known resorts in their area. These two projects will be producing hundreds of employable graduates every year for many many years to come.

Two more activities capped off the month and they are the District 3860 Rotary Day of Service Bloodletting Activity and the Mountain Cleanup and Tree Planting Activity organized by our own Rotaract Club of Cebu. The former was held at the Red Cross Cebu Facility and our club participated by bringing in volunteers to donate blood. A very successful event that will save the lives of people in need. The Tree planting was held at Calbasaan Minglanilla where a total of 150 seedlings were planted and participated by our club members and their families. The school which does not have running water since it was it was built 39 years ago, will be one of the beneficiaries of our WASH 2.0.

Last but certainly not the least, our sincerest gratitude to District Governor Anna, Assistant Governor Maricel, and all the District Officers of RI3860 for all the support and encouragement extended to our club. An awesome team that keeps on inspiring all the rotary clubs to do more.

This summary does not do justice for all the dedication, passion, and hard work of the members of Rotary Club of Cebu. So many other activities not mentioned above and the meetings and planning held in the background are countless. This is truly an amazing club composed of People of Action. My heartfelt gratitude to all RCC members for your service.

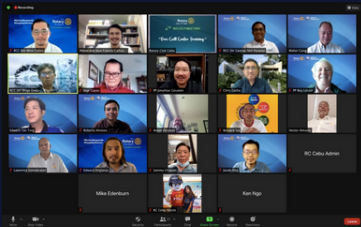
