SERVE TO CHANGE LIVES



ROTARY CLUB OF CEBU

Chartered on November 28, 1932, Rotary Club of Cebu is the second oldest club in the Philippines. The club currently has 63 members and prides itself in the quality of its members and the excellent fellowship that characterizes its weekly meetings.

The club sponsored the organization of several Rotary clubs in the Visayas and has produced six district governors, including Vicente L. Fañanar, Joaquin Pano, Vicente Lazalla, Federico Reyes and Manuel de Vega. The latest, Edgar Chongbin, was the District Governor in RY2013-2014 and also the RY2017-2018 Chairman of the Philippine College of Rotary Governors.

Rotary International, District 3860 has consistently recognized the club for its role and contribution to the District, winning the Club of the Year and President of the Year awards multiple times over the years. Our members continue to donate generously to The Rotary Foundation and consistently leads the District in TRF Donations and Disaster relief drives. The club has long led the district with the greatest number of Major Donors (15 currently) and in RY2019-2020, three members of the club (one posthumously) were inducted into the Arch Kluge Society, the first 400 members in our District. Likewise, RCC was the first club to establish a TRF Endowment Fund in the District. Lastly, the RCC has been very active in Global Grant projects, leading the country with almost 5% of the total approved Philippine global grant budget over the past six years.

PRESIDENTIAL MESSAGE

As we focus on membership in Rotary this month, I ask you to help make history this year. For more than 20 years, our membership has stood at 1.2 million. Rotary is a vibrant organization with a 116-year history, members in more than 220 countries and geographic areas, and a rich legacy of work in polio eradication and other humanitarian programs. Rotary has changed so much in our own lives and the lives of others. As we Serve to Change Lives, don't you think Rotary could have an even greater impact on the world if more people were practicing Service Above Self?

My vision is to increase Rotary membership to 1.3 million by July 2022, and the call to action is simple: Each One, Bring One. This year, I want every Rotarian and Rotaractor to introduce a new person into their club.

As you grow more, you will be able to do more. Let us keep empowering girls through our work in each of the areas of focus. Scholarships for girls, toilets in schools, health and hygiene education — there is so much we can do. Projects focused on the environment are also attracting interest the world over. Do participate in these projects locally and internationally to make this world a better place for us and for all species.

Each of you is a Rotary brand ambassador, and all of the wonderful work done by Rotarians around the world needs to be shared outside the Rotary community. Use social media to tell your friends, colleagues, and relatives the stories of Service Above Self.

Finally, I'm challenging every club, during the coming year, to plan at least one Rotary Day of Service that will bring together volunteers from inside and outside Rotary and will celebrate and showcase the work of your club in your community. In August, we focus on membership — exploring ways we can expand Rotary's ranks and reach. As we form new clubs and answer RI President Shekhar Mehta's call of Each One, Bring One, let's consider how these efforts will have a positive impact at every level of our organization.

Rotary's two greatest assets are its members and The Rotary Foundation, and they are linked. Our organization is made up of more than 48,000 Rotary and Rotaract clubs, and without our dedicated club members, we can't perform service. Our members also carry out the Foundation's mission of doing good in the world, by working on grassroots projects and making contributions that support countless Foundation programs and grants.

With more members in Rotary, the Foundation could do even more good in the world. We would have more hands to set up water, sanitation, and hygiene projects, so that more people could access clean water. We would have more minds to plan global grants projects that support prenatal services, so that more babies could live. We could fund more district grants that support literacy, so that more people could learn to read. Today, roughly a third of our members actively support the Foundation through annual giving or other means. Imagine how we could extend Rotary's reach if we were to increase that engagement, even by just a little. More Rotarian



contributions would mean additional funding for the Rotary Peace Centers, as well as more matched contributions to help eradicate polio, thanks to our partnership with the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation.

The Rotary Foundation is a powerful force that efficiently carries out impactful and sustainable projects around the world; Charity Navigator has recognized The Rotary Foundation with a four-star rating annually for 13 consecutive years. All Rotary members can be proud of this. And how great it would be if all Rotarians would support the Foundation in whatever way they could.

I have a simple request this month. Please take 10 minutes during your next club meeting to discuss ways to get more involved in the Foundation this year. It could be planning an online fundraiser to benefit the Foundation or partnering with other clubs for a global grant project.

Whatever you do, remember that our members — all of us — drive Rotary's efforts and sustain our Foundation.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

August 2021

Greetings from Rotary Club of Cebu!

Following in the footsteps of the month of July, August proved to be another exciting month for our club with numerous activities. We started off by donating the necessary electrical items for the NOAH Mega Vaccination Center of Cebu City to help with the set-up of their Bio-freezer. Then we launched our Vaccination Awareness Campaign with LTRFB Regional Director Eduardo Montealto Jr who incidentally is a rotarian himself. This is to place the Vaccines Work poster inside 4,000 jeepneys and 3,000 buses. We were also able to donate PPEs and Facemasks to Barangay Cubacub Health Center in Mandaue City. Our 6th Club meeting was also held during this week with our very

own member, Past District Rotary Foundation Chair Ibarra Panapio as speaker who spoke to us about the Rotary Foundation. Our last activity for that week was on Sunday where we visited Calbasaan Integrated School in Minglanilla to measure the distance and elevation between the school and its water source. This school is one of the beneficiaries of our Global Grant WASH 2.0.

We then proceeded on the second week with 3 donations to help the frontliners fighting against COVID. These were facemasks

and Alcohol for Barangay Lahug, 5,000 gloves for the 400 contact tracers of Cebu City Emergency Operations Center, and PPEs for REAVO who is an emergency response unit transporting COVID positive patients in their ambulance. We also continued to coordinate with Atty Joy Pesquera of NOAH on ways we can help the government with their vaccination drive. And for our club meeting for that week which was our 7th for this rotary year, we had Past President Bing Martinez speak about Global Grants in detail to our club members and guests.

For the third week of August, we continued to donate more PPEs and facemasks to ERUF who transports patients to and from the hospital, and also to Municipality of Santander which is one of the municipalities in the South experiencing a spike in COVID cases. Then we donated 2 portable Public Address systems to NOAH Vaccination Center to streamline and make their process more efficient. That week's club meeting was with the General Manager of Marco Polo hotel, Mr. Brian Connelly, speaking about the effects of the pandemic on the hospitality industry.

Now for the last week of August, our COVID response committee continued to do their work in shipping 300 PPEs to Rotary Club of Dumaguete North and to Mandaue Police Station 6. We also conducted a career orientation talk at the Community Scouts Youth and Guidance Center where Major Lloyd Orcullo gave a talk on what a military career is. Major Orcullo is the Commanding Officer of the 7th Regional Community Defense Group. Then we had a business meeting for our 9th general membership meeting where various committee chairmen gave details on what is happening with our projects. On the last day of August, August 31, we had a joint meeting with our sister club Rotary Club of Makati and Rotary Club of Davao where the speaker was Department of Justice Secretary Menardo Guevarra. Secretary Guevarra spoke about justice and the 4-way test of Rotary.

Another month has passed and our members show no signs of slowing down. True to this year's them, Service to Chaneg Lives, the spirit of doing service is truly embodied in each and every member of the Rotary Club of Cebu. Thank you very much everyone for your service to humanity.

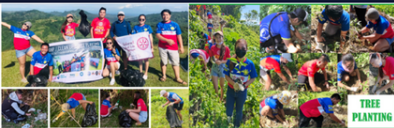
