ROTARY CLUB OF CEBU

Chartered on November 28, 1932, Rotary Club of Cebu is the second oldest club in the Philippines. The club currently has 63 members and prides itself in the quality of its members and the excellent fellowship that characterizes its weekly meetings.

The club sponsored the organization of several Rotary clubs in the Visayas and has produced six district governors, including Vicente L. Faelnar, Joaquin Panis, Vicente Lozada, Federico Reyes and Manuel de Veyra. The latest, Edgar Chiongbian, was the District Governor in RY2013-2014 and also the RY2017-2018 Chairman of the Philippine College of Rotary Governors.

Rotary International District 3860 has consistently recognized the club for its role and contribution to the District, winning the Club of the Year and President of the Year awards multiple times over the years. Our members continue to donate generously to The Rotary Foundation and consistently leads the District in TRF Donations and Disaster relief drives. The club has long led the district with the greatest number of Major Donors (15 currently) and in RY2019-2020, three members of the club (one posthumously) were inducted into the Arch Klumph Society, the first AKS members in our District. Likewise, RCC was the first club to establish a TRF Endowment Fund in the District. Lastly, the RCC has been very active in Global Grant projects, leading the country with almost 5% of the total approved Philippine global grant budget over the past six years.

PRESIDENTIAL MESSAGE

Shekhar MehtaPresident 2021-22

March 2022

We have overcome so many challenges these past two years and changed numerous lives. It brings me great joy that we have worked so hard this year to grow Rotary through the Each One, Bring One initiative. The result has been excellent growth in membership. Let us keep up the momentum. I am happy that you have put a spotlight on all we do by organizing projects around the world in our Rotary Days of Service. The future looks brighter than ever for Rotary and our 1.4 million members.

On 11 March 2020, the World Health Organization declared that COVID-19 constituted a pandemic, and two years later it is important that we continue to draw on our expertise in our disease prevention and treatment area of focus to help people worldwide cope with the continuing challenges. The pandemic continues to defy all expectations, but we cannot be frozen in fear. Our work is too important. It is also important that we make time for each other, and I urge you to register for the upcoming 2022 Rotary International Convention in Houston. It is a great way for all of us to safely celebrate Rotary service.

We can continue to build hope and spread peace in the world by using our resources to help the most vulnerable and keeping our faith in the future. The pandemic has had an especially devastating impact on girls worldwide. On the first anniversary of the pandemic, Henrietta Fore, the executive director of UNICEF, said that "immediate action is needed to mitigate the toll on girls and their families." This need, unfortunately, remains just as strong a year later. The ripples of the pandemic have affected girls in unique ways — stunting their educational attainment, weakening their job prospects, and contributing to other terrible results such as child marriages and increased human trafficking.

Data from UNICEF reveals why our action is so essential. In the 2010s, important progress was made toward eliminating the practice of child marriage, and UNICEF estimates that 25 million such marriages were averted worldwide. Unfortunately, the pandemic reversed those positive trends, and as a result an additional 10 million girls are vulnerable to becoming child brides by the end of this decade.

This is why our focus on Empowering Girls is such vital work, and I am delighted that at this year's virtual International Assembly, President-elect Jennifer Jones committed to continuing this initiative for another year. In my travels, I have witnessed many wonderful examples of club projects that back our Empowering Girls goals. But all Rotary members know that real change requires big efforts sustained over many years. This is the power of our global grants and actions taken within our areas of focus.

I encourage clubs to think of innovative ways to empower girls when designing their grant projects. Every step we take to improve education, health care, and economic opportunities for girls makes an important difference in helping them achieve their full potential. With opportunity we create hope, and with hope we address the root causes of conflict around the world, setting the stage for sustainable peace.

None of us know how long the COVID-19 virus will linger — and as an organization that has worked tirelessly for decades to eradicate polio, we understand better than most the difficult work that lies ahead for the world. That is why we need to remain focused on the future and on what is possible — not feeling nostalgic for the way our lives were, but looking hopefully to a future that uses this opportunity to Serve to Change Lives. I look forward to continuing this good work with you.

The latest of which are 2 very young babies, Daenerys Flor Bacaron and Roe Syndex Maningas. Most notable is baby Roe



Maningas who is a 6 month old baby, he was admitted on March 7 and diagnosed as a very critical case. The doctor sent a message to Treasurer Edward that the child could die with a simple crying fit. That's how severe his case was. Thanks to Edward and George who gave the Go signal that we will finance the surgery, Roe has already been operated on and already recovering.

As for our Typhoon Odette Response, we have one last relief mission next Saturday (March 19), and this will be led by PP Jonie Gesalem to small islands. Details will be posted soon on our viber chatroom and I hope a lot of us can join this last mission.

The Rotary Club of Makati Business District thru their President Rachel Harrison has also reached out to us requesting us to co-host a joint meeting on March 31, 2022. This will be together with 2 other clubs in Davao and Baguio and the Guest Speaker will be Atty Rowena Guanzon who is the former Comelec Commissioner. The schedule is from 3:00PM to 5:00PM so we will be joining this one in lieu of our usual noon meeting.

EXPRESSING DEEPEST GRATITUDE AND APPRECIATION TO THE ROTARY CLUB OF CEBU, HEADED BY ITS PRESIDENT, MR. JACOB ONG, IN COORDINATION WITH VIRGINIA FOOD, INCORPORATED, LED BY ITS VICE PRESIDENT FOR SALES AND MARKETING, MR. WHEREAS, on December 16, 2021, Super Typhoon Odette (Rai) brought torrential rains, violent winds, landslides, and storm surges to the Southern part of Cebu, leaving most of the towns in the 7th District severely devastated;

WHEREAS, shortly after the reports of massive destruction, the Rotary Club of Cebu, under the staunch leadership of its President, Mr. Jacob Ong, in collaboration with Virginia Food, Incorporated, led by its Vice President for Sales and Marketing, Mr. Stanley Go, immediately organized and dispatched critical relief items such as rice, water, canned goods, and noodles to the most vulnerable communities in the hardest-hit areas of Southern Cebu;

Cebu Provincial Board Resolution during their third regular session thanking the Rotary Club of Cebu for the distribution of relief goods to the towns of Alegria, Malabuyoc, Dumanjug, and Ronda.

The 4 towns are just a few of the towns that Rotary Club of Cebu and Virginia Food, Inc distributed relief goods to. There's also Argao, Dalaguete, Carcar, etc.
