ROTARY CLUB OF CEBU

Chartered on November 28, 1932, Rotary Club of Cebu is the second oldest club in the Philippines. The club currently has 63 members and prides itself in the quality of its members and the excellent fellowship that characterizes its weekly meetings.

The club sponsored the organization of several Rotary clubs in the Visayas and has produced six district governors, including Vicente L. Faelnar, Joaquin Panis, Vicente Lozada, Federico Reyes and Manuel de Veyra. The latest, Edgar Chiongbian, was the District Governor in RY2013-2014 and also the RY2017-2018 Chairman of the Philippine College of Rotary Governors.

Rotary International District 3860 has consistently recognized the club for its role and contribution to the District, winning the Club of the Year and President of the Year awards multiple times over the years. Our members continue to donate generously to The Rotary Foundation and consistently leads the District in TRF Donations and Disaster relief drives. The club has long led the district with the greatest number of Major Donors (15 currently) and in RY2019-2020, three members of the club (one posthumously) were inducted into the Arch Klumph Society, the first AKS members in our District. Likewise, RCC was the first club to establish a TRF Endowment Fund in the District. Lastly, the RCC has been very active in Global Grant projects, leading the country with almost 5% of the total approved Philippine global grant budget over the past six years.

Thank you everyone for the very well attended fellowship at Jpark Island Resort & Waterpark. It was really nice to see everyone and I dedicated that day to recognize and award all the members of this amazing club for all that you have done for this Rotary year.

We are now in the home stretch for this year but our members are still hard at work for our service projects and club activities. Our



WASH 2.0 has just taken off and this will benefit 6 schools, Taptap Integrated School, Calbasaan Integrated School, Cebu City Central School, Santican Elementary and Santican National High School. This is happening while we are in the process of closing the first WASH Global Grant. Thanks to our WASH Team led by Chairman DJ Moises, these projects will provide water and washing facilities to generations and generations of students for the years to come.

There is also another Global Grant we are applying for, and this is for Sisters of Mary School Boystown Technical Vocational Education. The committee for this will be led by Rtn Derrick Chua with Rtn Pet Dakay, PP Bernard Sia, and PP Bing Martinez. This project will provide the equipment, training, and classroom fitouts for technical vocational courses Carpentry, Plumbing, and Welding. Thanks to Terry Kim who is currently in South Korea, has secured DDF Funding of USD35,000 from District 3700 which will be matched with our own DDF and the World Fund. The total estimated budget for this project will reach more than USD90,000.

With PP Ricky Dakay working on a District Grant to provide a library for Oprra Elementary School and another one being planned to repair a school damaged by Typhoon Odette, it looks like we will be providing service to the community right up to the end of the year on June 30.

Our Gift of Life Team led by Dir George Paraoan is also working non-stop in helping children with CHD. During the last 2 weeks, 2 children have been successfully operated on and are already headed home to recover and lead a normal life.

Once again, Thank You so much to all the members of Rotary Club of Cebu. Your passion and generosity are truly inspiring!



Paul Harris: Rotary's Founder

Rotary started with the vision of one man — Paul P. Harris.

Harris was born on 19 April 1868 in Racine, Wisconsin, USA. At age 3, he moved to Wallingford, Vermont, where he grew up in the care of his paternal grandparents. He attended the University of Vermont and Princeton University and received his law degree from the University of Iowa in 1891.

In 1896, Harris settled in Chicago and opened a law practice. Four years later, he met fellow attorney Bob Frank for dinner on Chicago's North Side.

They walked around the area, stopping at shops along the way. Harris was impressed that Frank was friendly with many of the shopkeepers. He had not seen this kind of camaraderie among businessmen since moving to Chicago and wondered if there was a way to channel it, because it reminded him of growing up in Wallingford.

"The thought persisted that I was experiencing only what had happened to hundreds, perhaps thousands, of others in the great city. ... I was sure that there must be many other young men who had come from farms and small villages to establish themselves in Chicago. ... Why not bring them together? If others were longing for fellowship as I was, something would come of it."

Harris eventually persuaded several business associates to discuss the idea of forming an organization for local professionals. On 23 February 1905, Harris, Gustavus Loehr, Silvester Schiele, and Hiram Shorey gathered at Loehr's office in downtown Chicago for what would become known as the first Rotary club meeting.

In February 1907, Harris was elected the third president of the Rotary Club of Chicago. Toward the end of his presidency, he worked to expand Rotary beyond the city. Some club members resisted, not wanting to take on the additional financial burden. But Harris persisted, and by 1910, Rotary had expanded to several other major U.S. cities.

Harris recognized the need to form a national association with an executive board of directors. In August 1910, Rotarians held their first national convention in Chicago, where the 16 existing clubs unified as the National Association of Rotary Clubs (now Rotary International). The new association unanimously elected Harris as its president.

At the end of his second term as Rotary president, Harris resigned, citing ill health and the demands of his professional practice and personal life. He was elected president emeritus by convention action, a title he held until his death.


Harris died on 27 January 1947 in Chicago at age 78, after a prolonged illness. Before his death, he made it known that he preferred contributions to The Rotary Foundation in lieu of flowers. By coincidence, days before he died, Rotary leaders had committed to a major fundraising effort for the Foundation.

Upon news of his death, Rotary created the Paul Harris Memorial Fund as a way to solicit these donations. Rotarians were encouraged to commemorate the late founder of Rotary by contributing to the fund, which would be used for purposes dear to Harris' heart. In the 18 months following his death, The Rotary Foundation received \$1.3 million, which helped support the Foundation's first program — scholarships for graduate study abroad.







