#### **ROTARY CLUB OF CEBU**

Chartered on November 28, 1932, Rotary Club of Cebu is the second oldest club in the Philippines. The club currently has 63 members and prides itself in the quality of its members and the excellent fellowship that characterizes its weekly meetings.

The club sponsored the organization of several Rotary clubs in the Visayas and has produced six district governors, including Vicente L. Faelnar, Joaquin Panis, Vicente Lozada, Federico Reyes and Manuel de Veyra. The latest, Edgar Chiongbian, was the District Governor in RY2013-2014 and also the RY2017-2018 Chairman of the Philippine College of Rotary Governors.

Rotary International District 3860 has consistently

recognized the club for its role and contribution to the District, winning the Club of the Year and President of the Year awards multiple times over the years. Our members continue to donate generously to The Rotary Foundation and consistently leads the District in TRF Donations and Disaster relief drives. The club has long led the district with the greatest number of Major Donors (15 currently) and in RY2019-2020, three members of the club (one posthumously) were inducted into the Arch Klumph Society, the first AKS members in our District Likewise, RCC was the first club to establish a TRF Endowment Fund in the District. Lastly, the RCC has been very active in Global Grant projects, leading the country with almost 5% of the total approved Philippine global grant budget over the past six years.

# TRUSTEE CHAIR'S MESSAGE

John F. Germ

#### May 2022

As an engineer, I have worked my entire life for success that can be measured. I believe in the kind of success you can reach out and touch. And I also know that it doesn't come overnight, it happens one step at a time. At The Rotary Foundation, we don't settle for a vague idea of doing good; we take measurable steps, ones that are concrete and real, toward a defined goal. It's progress that you can see and tell your family and friends about, each step of the way.

Measurable success is what our new Programs of Scale grants are all about. The first member-led program to receive this annual \$2 million grant, Partners for a Malaria-Free Zambia (PMFZ), seeks to reduce malaria by 90 percent in 10 highly affected districts within two provinces of Zambia. It's an ambitious but achievable goal, based on a community health worker model that has been successful in reducing malaria in other parts of Zambia, as implemented by Rotary members and our partners on the ground.

To help end malaria in Zambia, The Rotary Foundation, World Vision U.S., and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation are each contributing \$2 million to PMFZ, whose Rotary-led program already has begun to expand life-saving malaria diagnosis and treatment to hundreds more rural communities. So far this Rotary year, PMFZ has trained, equipped, and deployed more than 1,300 of the 2,500 new community health workers who will help local health centers reach more people who are vulnerable to malaria, such as mothers and children. PMFZ is also collecting and analyzing data to ensure medical supplies get to where they are needed most. This work, along with the close collaboration between



implementing partners and Rotary and Rotaract clubs across Zambia, has comprised the first bold steps toward our goal.

PolioPlus is another example of a global project that has been engineered for impact. The fact that we have reduced polio cases by 99.9 percent worldwide is a testament to your generous contributions, our strong partnerships through the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, and a vast network of volunteers who administer drops to children around the world.

And we won't stop now. Rotary spearheaded the drive to end polio, and Rotary will complete it. Encourage your district leaders to designate leftover District Designated Funds (DDF) for polio eradication, so we can finish the job.

As an engineer, I have been proud to see my blueprints transformed into great structures and facilities. But perhaps I am even prouder of how together in Rotary we have engineered a better world — measurably, step by step, project by project. In Rotary, we can all be engineers of hope, building a better future for the next generation.

Greetings to my fellow Rotarians.

PP Bing while still in the US, Derrick, and Terry in South Korea are working hard in writing the Global Grant Application for Sisters of Mary Boystown TechVoc. This involves so much information gathering and coordination with the school administration and all of these are being done thru emails and phone calls. It will be a project valued at almost USD100,000 with the objective of producing highly skilled Senior High Graduates in the field of Carpentry,



Plumbing, and Welding. Thank you so much PP Bing, Derrick, and Terry for your dedication and hard work.

One of our adopted schools, Balungag Elementary School in San Fernando, was severely damaged by Typhoon Odette and with face to face classes about to start soon, they are in urgent need of classrooms that can be used by the students. Our 2 Joeys, Joey Ontanillas and Joey Suaco have already coordinated with the school principal and we also have approval for District Grant to repair 3 classrooms and their stage with a budget of P500,000. Thanks to Joey and Joey for making this happen!

Work for our Gift of Life Team led by George Paraoan has been non-stop and all this while working on the final requirements for the new GOL Global Grant. A lot of communication between Rob Raylman and Brenda, Delos Santos Medical Center, Philippine Heart Center, and several suppliers are critical in fine tuning the details for the grant. Thanks to this very amazing team!

Finally, our Moderna vaccines are also expiring today and the last day for the vaccination was yesterday (May 11). Secretary Charles, Stanley Go, and April have been working tirelessly for this program every week for more than a year already. I don't know exactly how they managed to overcome the staggering amount of work and challenges with this very complicated undertaking, but I know this team, together with volunteers from our club showing at Velez Hospital, have helped thousands and thousands of people get vaccinated during the height of the pandemic up to the present.

So much work being done in the background by our members from Club Admin to Finance to Service projects, it is just inspiring to be part of this club of dedicated individuals. Thank you everyone for your Service.
