Chartered on November 28, 1932, Rotary Club of Cebu is the second oldest club in the Philippines. The club currently has 63 members and prides itself in the quality of its members and the excellent fellowship that characterizes its weekly meetings.

The club sponsored the organization of several Rotary clubs in the Visayas and has produced six district governors, including Vicente L. Faelnar,

Joaquin Panis, Vicente Lozada, Federico Reyes and Manuel de Veyra. The latest, Edgar Chiongbian, was the District Governor in RY2013-2014 and also the RY2017-2018 Chairman of the Philippine College of Rotary Governors.

Rotary International District 3860 has consistently recognized the club for its role and contribution to the District, winning the Club of the Year and President of the Year awards multiple times over the years. Our members continue to donate generously to The Rotary Foundation and consistently leads

the District in TRF Donations and Disaster relief drives. The club has long led the district with the greatest number of Major Donors (15 currently) and in RY2019-2020, three members of the club posthumously) inducted into the Arch Klumph Society, the first AKS members in our District. Likewise, RCC was the first club to establish a TRF Endowment Fund in the District. Lastly, the RCC has been very active in Global Grant projects, leading the country with almost 5% of the total approved Philippine global grant budget over the past six years.

WHAT HAPPENED LAST MEETING.....

Last week's meeting went off really well. We had moved to Casino Español once again and with a topic like firearms ownership, I had a feeling it was sure to our members like bees to honey. While we did draw a good crowd to the meeting, I was most pleased to see many of our members who haven't been seen since our induction! JoFranz was there along with his gang, Glenn Besañes, Donato Gonzales, Patrick Lopez, and even the elusive Taipan, Edward Garcia was there too. From the looks of it they enjoyed the fellowship. PP Ricky and Anton managed to find time to be there and all of them got warm welcome. I guess finding speakers who can touch on "bro" topics makes sense.

Our guest speaker, Mr. Manuel Tan, was a neighbor and quickly became a childhood friend. I guess you can say I knew him long before I knew anything about girls. Manuel shared his vast knowledge about firearms and given that even 30 minutes would not do justice for such a broad topic, he could only talk about it on the surface. So he didn't attempt to go into too much detail during his talk.

Some of the things and anecdotes he pointed out included careless handling of weapons, and a simplified guide to the right firearms for home defense. He reminded us that a firearm is nothing more than a tool and when used incorrectly, it creates more problems. He also reminded everyone that when you store your duly licensed firearm at home, anyone in your household, servants included, are legally allowed to use it

against any home invader. I didn't know that.

Manuel shared his opinion regarding home invasions. The good news is that there is no spike in cases. But bad news is that home invaders can be armed and victimize even the most posh residential gated communities. He suggested that all rooms be locked at night and everyone must be trained to stay in their rooms, lie low and seek cover until the police arrive Don't ever attempt to go out of the room just

because you are armed. House-clearing, as he called it should only be done by professionals.

Of course, there was that inevitable question of what type of firearm is best. Manuel's response was to keep it simple. Unless you have the chance to practice using your pistol at least once a month, you are better off with a revolver. The latter is simple and easy to use whereas a pistol, by nature of its design requires several steps to make it ready to shoot. Even a simple failure to fire means one must pull the slide to eject

and load another road in a pistol. But with a revolver, you just pull the trigger again. As for the much argued topic of ammunition capacity between a pistol and a revolver? He had this to say. If you can't sort out your problem with 6 rounds from a revolver, your problem will likely sort you out. That statement certainly elicited laughter from the audience and drove home the point.

We could have heard more but time was up. One thing we know is that we could invite him back next time and speak about another topic, such as home defense? Or maybe firearms proficiency? How about personal safety? The options are immense and the opportunity for a return engagement could be likely.



PolioPlus is Rotary's priority program, which supports global efforts to eradicate polio. It was launched in 1985, with the help of Dr. Albert Sabin, developer of the oral polio vaccine, as a worldwide program to protect children from the cruel and fatal consequences of polio. In 1988, the World Health Assembly challenged the world to eradicate polio, and since that time, Rotary's efforts along with partner agencies, including the World Health Organization, the United Nations' Children's Fund, the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and governments around the world have achieved a 99 percent reduction in the number of polio cases worldwide. By the time the world is certified polio-free, our contributions will make Rotary the largest non-governmental financial contributor to the global polio eradication effort.
