Chartered on November 28, 1932, Rotary Club of Cebu is the second oldest club in the Philippines. The club currently has 63 members and prides itself in the quality of its members and the excellent fellowship that characterizes its weekly meetings.

The club sponsored the organization of several Rotary clubs in the Visayas and has produced six district governors, including Vicente L. Faelnar,

Joaquin Panis, Vicente Lozada, Federico Reyes and Manuel de Veyra. The latest, Edgar Chiongbian, was the District Governor in RY2013-2014 and also the RY2017-2018 Chairman of the Philippine College of Rotary Governors.

Rotary International District 3860 has consistently recognized the club for its role and contribution to the District, winning the Club of the Year and President of the Year awards multiple times over the years. Our members continue to donate generously to The Rotary Foundation and consistently leads

the District in TRF Donations and Disaster relief drives. The club has long led the district with the greatest number of Major Donors (15 currently) and in RY2019-2020, three members of the club posthumously) inducted into the Arch Klumph Society, the first AKS members in our District, Likewise, RCC was the first club to establish a TRF Endowment Fund in the District. Lastly, the RCC has been very active in Global Grant projects, leading the country with almost 5% of the total approved Philippine global grant budget over the past six years.





So it is not surprising to hear how Rotary stepped in to meet the humanitarian needs of Filipinos hit by a calamity.

Almost a year ago, we suddenly found ourselves on the other end of the table with typhoon Odette. But it was not that Rotary came to our aid that mattered most. It was how quickly Rotary was able to get things organized and send help our way. It was not Rotary who helped us rebuild our homes and businesses, but it was Rotary that allowed us to become an instrument to help others rebuild their lives and home.

As you all may have heard, our District's Disaster Management Committee is responding to the recent flooding in Maguindanao due to typhoon Paeng. The

rains from last week cause havoc to many of our roads and communities here. But in mountainside communities in Maguindanao, it caused landslides that covered entire sitios. Home and lives were lost from flash floods. One finds it hard to imagine the devastation as the storm was nowhere near their area. But the rain induced by the typhoon was enough to cause mayhem. Our District was able to respond thanks to preparations made specifically for this eventuality.

As a club, we have also taken steps to ensure we are not caught flat footed. That is why we currently maintain funds that are intended for use in times of disaster. Generous members have taken it upon themselves to donate and pool funds that are held by the club. Give real meaning to



the saying "saving for a rainy day" - so that our club may be able to respond effectively when the call comes.

On another note, we're about three weeks away from our 90th Anniversary celebration. Have you signed up to attend our main celebration on the 27th? If you haven't yet, please do. We're looking at finalizing the headcount and I would love to hear from you all. And while we're keeping our eye on this ball, allow me to digress a bit and tell you about a worthy project RCC will be involved in this month. We're still letting the paint dry literally so I can't share too much details yet. However, I hope to be able to share the good news once I get a go signal from the incredible people behind the project. The potential for this to snowball is incredible and let's just say it will be a "village" that will help us become another instrument to help the sick and needy. Stay tuned!


