
Chartered on November 28, 1932, Rotary Club of Cebu is the second oldest club in the Philippines. The club currently has 63 members and prides itself in the quality of its members and the excellent fellowship that characterizes its weekly meetings.

The club sponsored the organization of several Rotary clubs in the Visayas and has produced six district governors, including Vicente L. Faelnar,

Joaquin Panis, Vicente Lozada, Federico Reyes and Manuel de Veyra. The latest, Edgar Chiongbian, was the District Governor in RY2013-2014 and also the RY2017-2018 Chairman of the Philippine College of Rotary Governors.

Rotary International District 3860 has consistently recognized the club for its role and contribution to the District, winning the Club of the Year and President of the Year awards multiple times over the years. Our members continue to donate generously to The Rotary Foundation and consistently leads

the District in TRF Donations and Disaster relief drives. The club has long led the district with the greatest number of Major Donors (15 currently) and in RY2019-2020, three members of the club posthumously) inducted into the Arch Klumph Society, the first AKS members in our District. Likewise, RCC was the first club to establish a TRF Endowment Fund in the District. Lastly, the RCC has been very active in Global Grant projects, leading the country with almost 5% of the total approved Philippine global grant budget over the past six years.

PRESIDENT'S VALEDICTORY MESSAGE

INTRODUCTION

Hello and good evening, everyone.



First and foremost, I want to thank my family: my wife, Angela; and my children Andie and Enzo. For their constant support behind the scenes during my tenure as president To my board members and committee chairs: It has been an absolute privilege to serve alongside such a committed group of individuals, united for a common cause. None of this would have been possible without you.

I would also like to thank Gov. Lilu, who has probably attended more of our project turnovers than 90% of our club members. No matter the situation, you can count on Gov. Lilu to be there: from lending her presence when foreign dignitaries would visit the club, to joining us for mountain treks where no high heel shoes dare tread. She even found time to join me for a working lunch in Melbourne with our Global Grant partner, the president of the GOL Foundation, which resulted in three more Global Grants for our club.

Thank you to incoming Gov. Twinkle and spouse Pres. Archie for reaching out early on and supporting us in our club's 90th year. I know you'll be a great Governor. To our members: I wish I had enough time to acknowledge and thank you all individually for the work that you do. I want to express my deepest gratitude to each one of you for your unwavering support and dedication throughout my tenure as president. It was an honor to have been chosen to lead the RCC during it's an 90th year.

Today, we also mark a new beginning as we entrust the leadership of our club to a remarkable individual who has shown exceptional dedication and passion for our Rotary ideals. Our incoming president, Walter Cang, has an inspiring vision for the future, and rotary's vision to create hope in the world. I have complete confidence that under his guidance, our club will continue to flourish and

grow.

I. PLANS

During my term, I was challenged by RC President Jennifer Jones' theme for the rotary year: Imagine Rotary! I was ready to run with this and was already looking forward to my term as an imaginary president... but I was told we had to do more for our 90th year.

It was in with that in mind that we decided on two main goals for the year:

- 1. Building a stronger foundation for the club, to position it for the next 100 years;
- For our club to take more of a leadership role by supporting other clubs within the district.

To position our club for the future, we realized we needed a permanent home for the RCC. Our club is fortunate to have such a rich history and we knew this legacy needed to be preserved. Thanks to member donations, we are currently in the process of securing our own office.

We also decided to rebuild our very own RCC Foundation, by rebalancing our contributions to the Rotary foundation. Charity begins at home, and this was another step to ensure that our club will be able to sustain its projects into the future. We also chose to focus on renewing and strengthening our relationships with other clubs here and abroad: We had numerous Japanese and Korean visit us for our 90th anniversary celebration bringing more contacts, fellowship, and potential funding for our future projects.

I also made it a point to visit as many clubs

and projects as possible. My rotary year took me to Manila, Ormoc, Tacloban, Davao, Japan, Australia, in addition to our project turnovers all over Cebu.

Rotarian leadership is leadership by example. Within our district, we wanted to commemorate our 90th anniversary and express our gratitude by offering our DDF to other clubs in support of their projects. Not just to thank them for supporting our club through the years, but to serve as an example. By "teaching others to fish" and paying it forward, we wanted to equip and inspire the other clubs in our district to reach the next level, win awards, and even obtain their own global grants.

II. ACHIEVEMENTS

As I step down from this role, I am filled with a sense of pride and accomplishment. The memories we have created, the impact we have made, and the friendships we have forged will forever hold a special place in my heart.

What started as a 'sit-back-and-relax' year ended with 79 congenital heart patients operated on from July 1, 2022 – June 30, 2023. That's 1.5 lives saved every week.

We finished & closed 3 Global Grants this year. We had to. Our club had the distinction of hitting the limit of 10 open Global Grants. We could not apply for more unless we finished and closed some of these projects.

We donated 24,314 books to different entities. Rotaract Clubs, Rotary Club of Bohol, Cebu Province, 27 different schools and 3 complete libraries.

We also connected to 6 schools in mountain barangays for our WASH project – Water,

Sanitation, and Hygiene. These are schools that had been operating for up to 20 yrs without running water affecting 6,241 students and their teachers – schools where students walked up to 2km carrying their own water daily. Where even female students and teachers, would have to go into the fields to do their business.

How rewarding it is to hear the faculty and students thank us for these little miracles when we turn over these projects. It is gratifying to know that none of these students will have to miss school because of their periods and that they can continue their education with a little more comfort and dignity. We also have 15 more of these schools identified by another club that we mentored, the Rotary Club of Banilad Metro.

None of this would have been possible without the extraordinary teamwork and collaboration that defines our Rotary club. Our members have consistently demonstrated an unwavering spirit of service and a willingness to go above and beyond. I am truly humbled by the incredible projects we have undertaken and the lives we have touched.

Rotary has been a transformative experience for me, and I hope that it has been the same for each and every one of you.

To our new president, I offer my heartfelt congratulations and extend my fullest support. I know that you will lead with integrity, compassion, and a steadfast commitment to Rotary's core values. Your passion for service is contagious, and I am confident that you will inspire our members to reach new heights of excellence.

III. CLOSING

In closing, let us remember that Rotary is not just an organization—it is a powerful force for change. It is a global network of individuals driven by a shared purpose: to make the world a better place. As we embark on this new chapter, let us continue to embrace Rotary's motto of "Service Above Self" and work tirelessly to create lasting change. We are not closing out on an era or ending one term. 
