Chartered on November 28, 1932. Rotary Club of Cebu is the second oldest club in the Philippines. The club currently has 63 members and prides itself in the quality of its members and the excellent fellowship that characterizes its weekly meetings.

The club sponsored the organization of several Rotary clubs in the Visayas and has produced six district governors, including Vicente L. Faelnar, Joaquin Panis, Vicente Lozada, Federico Reyes and Manuel Veyra. The latest, Edgar Chiongbian, was the District Governor in RY2013-2014 and also the RY2017-2018 Chairman of the Philippine College of Rotary Governors.

Rotary International District 3860 has

its role and contribution to the District, winning the Club of the Year and President of the Year awards multiple times over the years. Our members continue to donate generously to The Rotary Foundation and consistently leads the District in TRF Donations and Disaster relief drives. The club has long led the district with the greatest number of Major Donors (15 currently) and in RY2019-2020, three members of the club (one posthumously) were inducted into the Arch Klumph Society, the first AKS members in our District. Likewise, RCC was the first club to establish a TRF Endowment Fund in the District. Lastly, the RCC has been very active in Global Grant projects, leading the country with almost 5% of the total approved Philippine global grant budget over the past six years.



TRUSTEE CHAIR'S **MESSAGE**

Barry Rassin Trustee Chair 2023-24

JULY 2023

I love Rotary for many reasons, perhaps most of all for the impact we make when we work together. There is really no other group like us. In the last five years, The Rotary Foundation has helped 100 million beneficiaries. That is staggering.

But the need is great. There are countless more we could be reaching and supporting right now if we had the resources. We could reach twice as many in the next five years. And your fellow Rotaractors and Rotarians are ready to help. They're hungry for more grants to help more people who need us.

That's why, this year, The Rotary Foundation Trustees have set an ambitious goal for giving of \$500 million, our highest ever.

This breaks down to \$150 million for the Annual Fund to help fund grants and \$50 million for polio eradication, to be matched by \$100 million from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. For the Endowment Fund and our future, we are targeting \$60 million in outright giving and \$80 million in commitments, totaling \$140 million. And we want to collect \$60 million in other contributions, such as direct giving, cash for global grants, and Disaster Response Fund donations.

To make this happen, we need all of you -

Did you know that over 80 percent of Rotary members make no contributions to PolioPlus, or that over 60 percent make no donation at all to The Rotary Foundation? For an organization of 1.4 million members, that means that nearly 1 million of us are not contributing each year.

Imagine the tremendous difference it would make if each of those 1 million could contribute just \$25 a year. That would be \$25 million we wouldn't need to raise from our best donors.

We can all give something. That's why I am asking each of you to set a goal to give what you can to The Rotary Foundation this year.

Never have we set such an audacious goal, but I believe that you, who make up Rotary, always respond to a challenge, especially when you see the difference we can make with those funds. We are part of an audacious organization, one that dreams big and makes our dreams a reality.

As I got ready for our meeting this week, I was reminded of a statement made in the past by a more insightful member. "As our club has become more dynamic and active with the infusion of young blood in our ranks, let's try not to marginalize senior members who are unable to take part in our activities just because they're not as mobile, or they are unable to withstand the rigors of travel. And indeed, as I reach out to members who regularly attending haven't been our meeting, I need to keep them in mind.


PE Shige has already organized our first fellowship and from the looks of the sign-up sheet, we're getting a good crowd, drawing many whom I haven't seen regularly at our meetings. I do hope all who signed up really do show up! Kudos to PE Shige for producing the plan.

But I know it still left our senior members out. I've been thinking of an easier way to meet them and wondered if a mid-day fellowship on a weekend would do? Maybe a Saturday brunch or lunch or even just for coffee? It reminds me of the days back in Canada when I go to malls and see a congregation of retirees having coffee and chatting away at 10 in the morning. And it seemed to work very well for them. What do you think? It doesn't have to replace our weekly luncheon meeting. Maybe one of our members would want to host a small gathering at his home? If you have other ideas, please let me know!

The past Saturday, I had the chance to attend our District's bloodletting activity. I'm sure you all saw the announcements and I'd like to thank our members who took part or sent their staff to give blood. I learned 189 individuals show up! Initial screening whittled it down to 168 donors and other factors came into play as we were able to collect 134 bags of lifesaving blood. Not bad for a weekend! I used to donate every quarter a few years back but with age and medication I'm sadly disqualified from continuing the practice. I know several of our members who fall into that category, but it didn't stop them from arranging their workforce

to give blood. Now that brings event greater impact to the program many times over.

As you know, District 3700 had collaborated with us for a blood donation van. In fact, during their visit this year, we were able to quickly visit and see the van in action up on Naga. It was very touching for club members from both countries witness blood being



it was turned over to them. If things work out, I hope we can convince our fellow Rotarians from Korean to consider another project to replicate the van so that more areas may be covered. I will keep you posted.

Another project in the works is our Disaster Water Trailer. This project will be chaired by PP Jacob Ong, and he will be working closely with Rtn. Bobong to assemble 2 trailer mounted ISO tanks. The idea is to have these tanks fitted with a bank of faucets that can be towed to any area in need of water after a disaster strikes. To quote Rtn. Bobong, "...this is all about giving disaster victims a sense of dignity by being able to wash and maintain hygiene." This is especially important for people who may have lost all their earthly possessions in a disaster. He has also graciously offered to house this asset and have it ready for deployment.

Discussions about this project reminded me of the 4 water tanks we had loaned out the 4 police stations right after typhoon Odette hammered us 19 months ago. The plan then was to allow communities in the area to have access to clean water but since much time has passed, it is time to pull them out and get them ready to be deployed in the event another disaster strikes.

With the help of Rtn. Edward Tan Ting who conducted an informal inquiry, we now know the state of 2 tanks. One has been mounted on a small tower and hooked up to a pressure pump, with a downpipe supplying water to the station. It has been put to permanent use so we may not be able to retrieve this anymore. Another tank has been set aside and not in use so we should be able to pull that one when the time comes. Rtn Edward will continue to check the whereabouts of the other 2 tanks and once ascertained, we will be pulling them out. Again, Rtn. Bobong has graciously offered to house them for us at his plant. Stay tuned!




