

Our members seek to offer humanitarian assistance to those affected by conflict, and our global reach requires that we promote peacebuilding and conflict prevention with crosscultural, cross-border connections and friendship through Rotary.

For decades, Rotary has harnessed these connections to carry out service projects, support peace fellowships and scholarships, and establish programs like Rotary Peace Centers to help build lasting peace. Our members also take action to promote Positive Peace, addressing the underlying causes of conflict, including poverty, discrimination, ethnic tension, lack of access to education, and unequal distribution of resources.

Rotary members who wish to wage peace can use district grants and Rotary Foundation global grants to support projects with other Rotary members that help refugees and displaced people, provide medical support, and more worldwide. Members can also work with or join peace-focused Rotary Action Groups, Friendship Exchanges, Fellowships, and intercountry committees. And District Designated Funds or district cash can support our peacebuilding and conflict prevention efforts.

Members and nonmembers alike can learn more about peacebuilding through the Rotary Positive Peace Academy, a free online course available to anyone with an internet connection. You can find it at positivepeace.academy/rotary.

There is no denying that incidents of violence and atrocities being perpetuated around the world seem to be escalating. Global peace is fragile, and the stakes are getting higher.

Still, we know that it is possible to bring all people together to work toward a shared goal. Rotary members do so every day in every part of the world. May our ability to unify in common purpose be a spark that helps light the path out of these dark days.

January 4, 2024

Happy new year everyone! I hope you all enjoyed the long break and holiday with family and friends. Over the holidays, our club membership grew by 1 as we added Rtn. Wendel Chu into our roster. Please welcome Wendel as he transferred his membership from RC Ormoc Bay to RCC as life has brought him to Cebu where he now calls home.

Also in our midst today is the lovely family of District 6460 Assistant Governor, Nancy Waters. Her home club is Rotary Club of Quincy (Illinois) where she also serves as Director this Rotary year. I have spoken to Nancy, and I am sure we will all enjoy hearing from her as she shares her breadth of experience in Rotary. Nancy's sons were Rotary Youth Exchange scholars and 2 of them are with her today. They live in different countries in our region and chose to spend the holidays in Cebu. So having her as our quest speaker is certainly a wonderful and fortunate circumstance for us.


Now that we've crossed the threshold to the second half of the Rotary year, let's do a quick review of what's behind us and what lies ahead. We started the year with 66 members and we're now at 68 with 2

candidates ready for induction, and 2 or more in our pipeline. Our membership chair has been busy! We also began beefing up the coffers of our Cebu Rotary Club Foundation, Inc. so we're hoping to have a good balance in giving between our foundation and TRF.

This year, we saw the completion of 3 Global Grants in Paypay National Science High School, Sisters of Mary Boys Town (Tech Voc programs) and ROSAS (Cleft Lip & Palate surgeries). A District Grant funded library rehabilitation and expansion was also completed. We've undertaken 2 club funded service projects

and provided a WASH facility to a community rendered homeless by a devastating fire last month.

Our Gift of Life program continues to chua along with over 101 kids given their life-saving surgery the past 6 months. We did face challenges with our WASH applications this year so we may have to rethink that strategy. With all that happening, we also

Clubs and assisted them in their first service projects. Overall, we continued to grow and delivery what really matters as a Rotary club, service to our community.

We capped off our year with the Christmas Village of Love. And I must say this is perhaps a true testament to our club members' willingness to give. We started well into December and committed to the organizers that we will adopt at least 40 houses. I couldn't have picked a better person to lead this endeavor as Dir. Stanley not only had 50 houses adopted, but he also managed to convince a few to shell out more to adopt 2 towns and 4 villages!

All in all, we raised a whopping \$475,000 for this year's Christmas Village. Half of that, my fellow Rotarians, goes into our project fund so we couldn't have asked for a better Christmas gift. Thank you, Dir. Stanley, for your passion to help, perseverance in reaching out and devoting so much of your time over the holidays to make this happen.

In the next 6 months, we aim to wrap up another Global Grant with the Sisters of Mary Girls Town as we are in the process of applying for another one, involving the 4laboratory fit out for the Cebu City National Science High School. This is a huge undertaking, and we are sending feelers out to find suitable foreign partner(s).

With help from our District, we are moving forward to assemble a 20-thousand-liter tank mounted on a trailer for deployment in times of disaster. The project has been in our minds since the Covid lockdown and made more apparent after we were hammered by typhoon Odette. It was clear to us that access to water is most critical immediately after a disaster, but we're hampered by having to borrow from other organizations and firms for this crucial asset. With this project, our club will have that ability to alleviate some of the pain and restore dignity for survivors of natural disasters and calamities.

We are also starting the construction of an overhead shelter that will be used as an outdoor classroom in the mountain community of Calbasaan. This is a joint project between our club and D3700 of Korea. We're still open to undertaking more as the opportunities are found so the fun continues!

Our annual trip to Japan is coming up in early April. This annual trip is our way of strengthening our ties with our sister friendship clubs in Japan, many of whom have collaborated with us in projects over the years. This year's trip will not include our spouses and we will spend most of our time in Nagoya to break bread with RC Kasugai and RC Okazaki. Flights and accommodations have not been booked to date but do inform PE Shige is you wish to be in the loop with travel plans.


