TRUSTEE CHAIR'S MESSAGE

Following the news is challenging these days. Stories of war and violence are deeply discouraging. It breaks my heart when I hear about innocent bystanders, particularly women and children, who are caught in the crossfire of conflict.

Is there anything we can do about it? We certainly can't turn away from the problem. I think in these times, we need to shift our focus from what we can't change to what we can do. We can also support what we know works.

February is Rotary's Peacebuilding and Conflict Prevention Month. It is one of our areas of focus because peace is central to everything we do in Rotary. Even though most of us aren't diplomats at the negotiating table or peacebuilders working on active conflicts, in Rotary's singular way, what we do works to promote peace and prevent conflict somewhere, every day.

Every Rotary member should remember this during the month of February: When you support any of the areas of focus of The Rotary Foundation, you are contributing to peace. Foundation grants that address fundamental issues — such as a global grant focused on enhancing basic literacy in a community — will cultivate a better understanding of the world and lead to greater economic stability, laying the groundwork for peace.

You can say the same for all the areas of focus, from the environment to economic development. They help stabilize communities, lift families out of poverty, and foster the pursuit of education.

Peace is and always has been interwoven into the fabric of Rotary beyond our projects, too. In 1999, when we established the Rotary Peace Centers through a visionary initiative of our Foundation, we reaffirmed this commitment. This month, we are once again renewing that vision, with Bahçeşehir University in Istanbul, our host partner for the newest Rotary Peace Center, as it takes its first steps to prepare for the initial cohort of students arriving in early 2025.

All along the way, as Rotary has evolved into a global force for good, it has championed peace and understanding in countless ways, and our Foundation remains the great driving force behind that vision. It will be part of Rotary's eternal legacy.

And by supporting our work, you will be able to say that you are a part of that legacy. You can directly support it by visiting rotary.org/donate and selecting peacebuilding and conflict prevention as the area of focus.

So, yes, there is a lot you can do to support peace and prevent conflict. The next step is up to you.

April 25, 2024

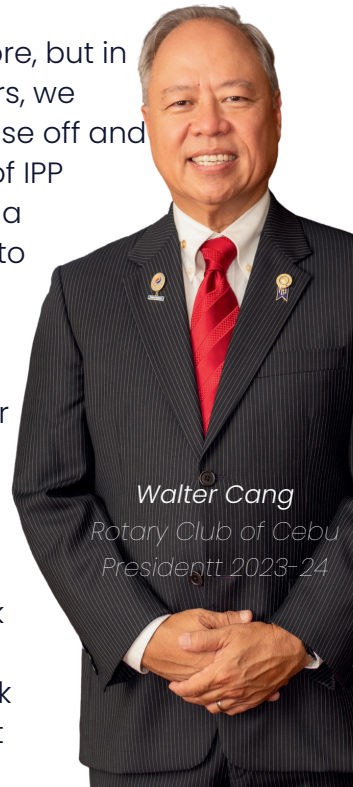

RCC GOES TO JAPAN 2024

On April 4, 2021, 10 members of RCC flew to Japan for a quick 4-day visit to meet RC Okazaki and RC Kasugai in Nagoya. Apart from our first meeting with members of RC Okazaki, we were there to witness the celebration of RC Kasugai's 55th Founding Anniversary.

Much of our first full day was spent on trains and buses as we visited some of Japan's bucket list destinations such as the inner and outer shrines of Ise Grand Shrine (a must for the Japanese) and walking along Okage Yokocho where you find all sorts of shops and restaurants.



That evening, we had our first meeting with members of RC Okasaki. It was very cordial and with plenty of good food and drinks, it didn't take long for our gathering to warm up to plenty of laughter and toasts. The night ended with a walk along their picturesque river lined with cherry blossoms that were in bloom. As we bade our goodbyes, we extended our invitation from them to visit us soon, as we look forward to future collaboration between both clubs.

Saving best for last, our 2 days with RC Kasugai was one which the 10 of us will not forget. They met us at the hotel at a little past 8 and in 30 minutes, we were on board a chartered bus for a 3-hour ride to Takayama to see a heritage site, an old community called Shirakawa Go. What made the road trip special was they had loaded a cooler with "refreshments" and snacks, and I must say toasting to each other's health and happiness with shouts of "Kampia" before 9 in the morning was incredible!

The following day, they provided each of us with a set of traditional Japanese kimono called Yukata and walked us through the proper way to wear the garb. They even provide us with their traditional socks and wooden sandals. The experience was new to us except PE Shige, but more was to come as we were escorted out of the hotel to take a stroll outside along the Kiso river. The route was lined with cherry blossoms that led to the Inuyama Castle, and where the famed annual Inuyama Festival was in full blast.

Inuyama Castle is the oldest of 12 castles to have retained its tower intact. Among the 12 remaining main towers, the one at Inuyama Castle is designated as a National Treasure of Japan. We spent the next 5 hours in our attire, touring and blending in with many locals in the same attire, until we started talking! Lunch was served in bento boxes and the meal was enjoyed along the river lined with cherry blossoms. I have toured foreign lands that I know little of. But this is the first time I toured a foreign country in an immersive manner. The experience it gave is incomparable.

That evening, we joined RC Kasugai as they celebrated their anniversary. In attendance were other Rotary clubs in their city, and we shared tables with their sister clubs from Taiwan. Their city Mayor and Councilor were also in attendance

along with District dignitaries led by their District Governor. The program was short and simple but meaningful. Congratulatory messages were delivered, gifts were exchanged between clubs and innumerable toasts were made for the club's continued success. And in true Japanese fashion, the party was not over until we had our after-party event – karaoke singing!



Like most trips to Japan, our stomachs were constantly full as the sights and aroma of food and snacks were hard to ignore. But the memory that comes with the

experience is bound to stick and bring a smile to anyone's face. We are most grateful for our hosts and our President Elect Shige Onda who not only was our translator, but our tour guide and travel planner as well. Till next time!
