## HISTORY OF RCCB

---

The formation of Rotary Club of Central Butuan was quick but long in the making, considerably hurried but certainly not impulsive. In hopes of rekindling the flames of camaraderie and bond, they [members] established the club in the following months. They submitted their application documents in mid-October 2010 and paid their registration fees on the 5th of November of the same year. To recognize the club's willingness, capabilities, and readiness to serve, some of its members were randomly questioned by the Rotary International which soon after led to the unanimous approval of the club's effectivity on the 4th of December 2010.

In just six months, the newly recognized Butuanon Rotarians immediately took on the challenge and the responsibilities of fulfilling their mission of building a better community for their brethren. A decade later, the club continues to provide a broad spectrum of service-oriented activities and programs addressing critical socio-economic issues such as hunger, the environment, violence prevention, illiteracy, drug abuse prevention, polio eradication, youth, the elderly, and AIDS awareness, and education. Following their motto: Service above self, Rotary Club of Central Butuan pursues in bringing out the best of humanity by losing oneself in the service to others.

He heads the Skyline Group engaged in Real Estate Development in different parts of India, including the largest group housing in the state of Rajasthan,

(ii) Operation Eyesight India, a Canada-based organization,

Shekhar Mehta joined Rotary in 1985 and has been Chairman of Strategic Planning Committee of Rotary International, Rotary India Literacy Mission. Rotary Foundation India, Rotary India Centennial Celebrations. Rotary India Humanity Foundation

He served as District Governor from 1999-to 2000 and was elevated to the Board of Directors of Rotary International from 2011-to 2013.

While serving as Rotary International Director, he helped Rotary add 2 countries to its fold - Bhutan & Maldives.

July 3, 2021



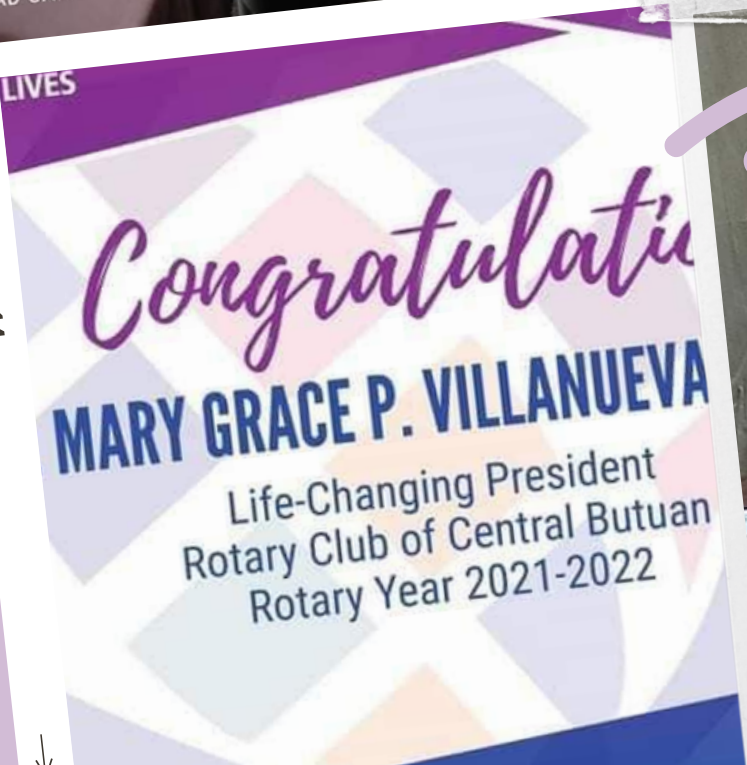

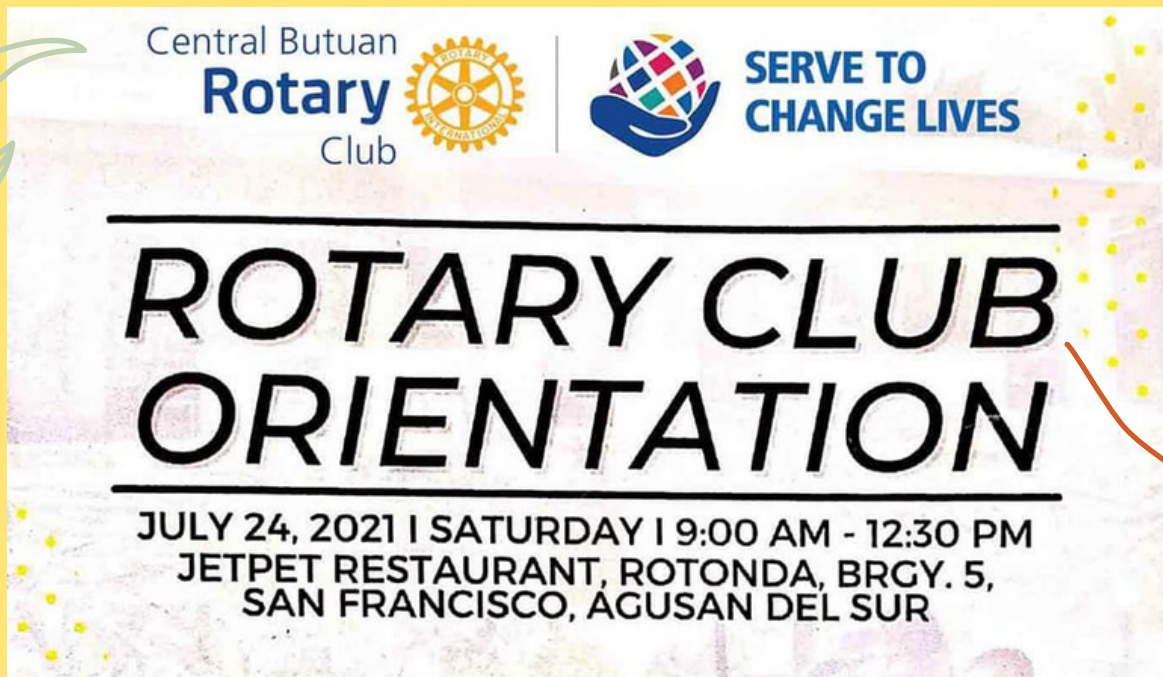

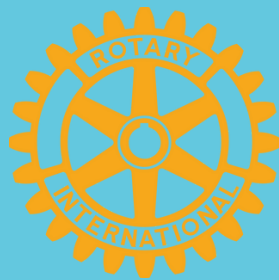
