The school was caught on fire last July 27, 2021 leaving majority of the essential learning facilities and offices devastated. Library, music room and 35 rooms & offices including all the documents of the alumni, books for the students and personal belongings of the teachers such as laptops, etc. were burnt and recovered nothing. What had happened was so disheartening not only to the owners of the school but to the teachers, students, and workers and even to the alumni and parents of the students.

To support the rally behind the cause of helping TCA rise again, the Rotary Club of Central Butuan donated cash which was officially turned-over by our Life-changing President Mary Grace Villanueva to Mr. Patrick Go, TCA Alumni President and Mr. Joey Abrenilla, Incoming TCA Alumni President. It aims to help rise not just for TCA as a school but the teachers & workers who might lost their source of living and to the students whom their education was affected. With this little amount, it contributed and served to change the lives of the affected.

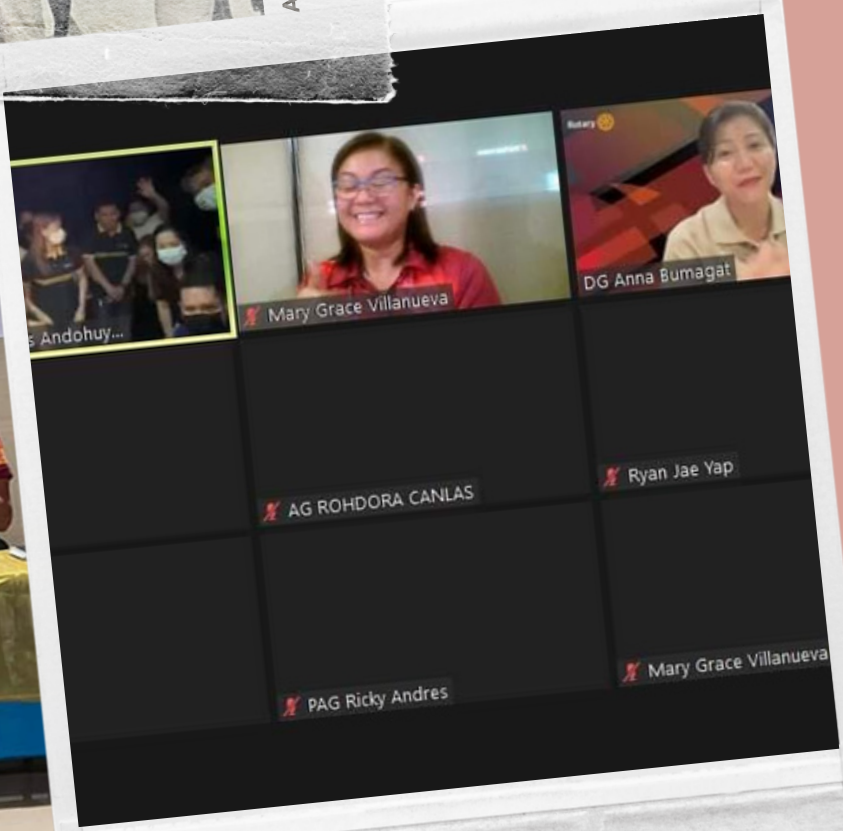
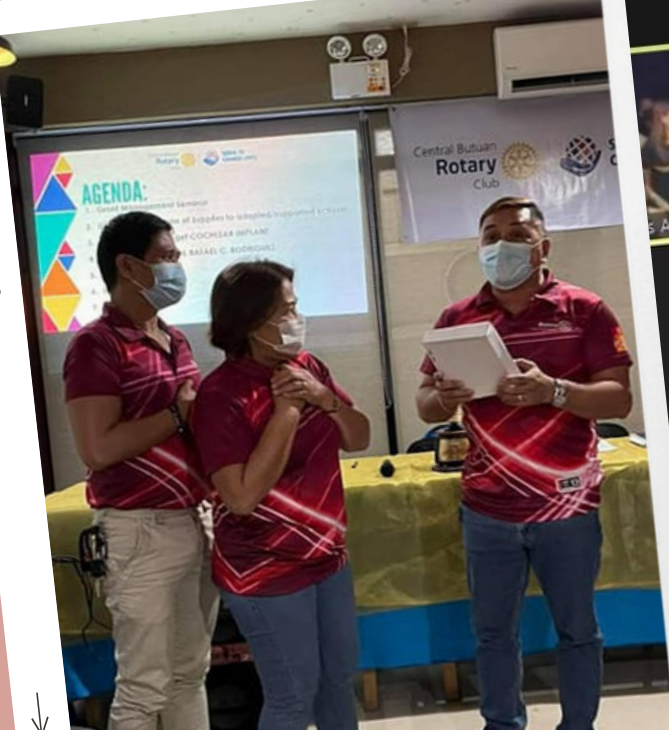

In this project, the Rotary Club of Central Butuan extended their ability to serve by collaborating with the project organizer Agusan del Norte Police Provincial Office, and other government agencies namely the Philippine National Police, Agusan del Norte Local Government Units, TESDA, Department of Agriculture and NGOs such as Philippine Eagles, Stingers, Agusan Up, Alsa Bisaya, and Prycegas. The target area, Brgy. Jaguimitan, is part of the Geographically Isolated and Disadvantaged Areas (GIDAs) meaning the area is underdeveloped due to socio-economic conflicts with the government. Through this activity, we are continuing to bridge the gap with their society, thereby promoting Peace Building & Conflict Prevention.

The mentioned benefactors provided basic health needs such as face masks, face shields, alcohol supply, and dental goods such as toothpaste and toothbrushes. Dozens of rice sacks were given to aid the daily sustenance of the community. In addition, the 200 pax attendees were provided with lunch meals prepared by the Rotarians themselves. This is to emphasize the importance of Disease Prevention and Treatment. In addition, the organizers also collaborated with TESDA to conduct dynamic trainings on livelihood skills. This is to maximize utility for the supplied tools, such as bolos, shovels, heavy-duty oven, baking and cooking apparatus, and other livelihood equipment. The project also provided livestock start-ups such as free-range chickens to further accelerate the society towards Community Economic Development.
