One of the areas of focus of Rotary is the Basic Education & Literacy, thus Rotary wholeheartedly supports Brigada Eskwela and Brigada Pabasa to aid the needs of school's preparation for the re-opening of classes.

Rotary Club of Central Butuan, represented by 7 club members and 1 spouse, had turned over facemasks, faceshields, alcohol, paints & brush, lumbersticks, bags of cement, broomsticks, bondpapers, notebooks, pencil & pens to the School Brigada Eskwela Coordinator.

Aside from the turn-over, we have also conducted a reading remediation/intervention for the learners who are considered non-readers and frustration-level readers. In this way, the club members were able to really interact with the students hands-on.

All in all, this activity has allowed us to achieve two things: 1) provide essential school supplies that would assist the general student population, and also 2) give emphasis to the disadvantaged students, in terms of reading.



The Rotary Club of Central Butuan has launched the initiative "Kasilyas Mo, Hinangon Ko," in partnership with MGVillanueva Realty and Task Force COVID Bougainvillea.

The beneficiary of this project is the Castro family residing in Barangay Ampayon. The family is headed by Nenita Castro, a single parent breadwinner to her 3 young children, working as a small-scale vegetable vendor in their barangay. She is also differently-abled (PWD), due to the genetic disorder, cleft palate. This is why it was difficult for the Castro family to recover when their shelter was completely destroyed due to the unfortunate 2021 Ampayon fire.

Thus, RCCB and their collaborators made it their goal to alleviate the Nenita's Situation by constructing the family's very own durable and completely functional comfort room. This is important especially during this pandemic when sanitation and hygiene are strictly observed.

Someone once said: "Helping one person might not change the world, but it could change the world for one person." This resonates to our action plan of helping an individual who has experience life from one misfortune to another. This project may be singular at present, but we at RCCB believe that nothing is impossible in the future, most importantly when it comes to serving to change lives.
