



Rotary has been working to eradicate polio for more than 35 years. Our goal of ridding the world of this disease is closer than ever.

As a founding partner of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, we've reduced polio cases by 99.9 percent since our first project to vaccinate children in the Philippines in 1979.

Rotary members have contributed more than \$2.1 billion and countless volunteer hours to protect nearly 3 billion children in 122 countries from this paralyzing disease. Rotary's advocacy efforts have played a role in decisions by governments to contribute more than \$10 billion to the effort.

Today, polio remains endemic only in Afghanistan and Pakistan. But it's crucial to continue working to keep other countries polio-free. If all eradication efforts stopped today, within 10 years, polio could paralyze as many as 200,000 children each year.

With their hashtag #IRunToEndPolioD3680, The Rotary Club of Central Butuan had expressed their support with their international mission to altogether end polio.

On October 13, 2021 a fire broke up into Barangay Ampayon, which afflicted several families where households are proximally adjacent to one another.

The members of Rotary Club of Central Butuan have prepared and distributed cash assistance & food packs to fire victims of Brgy. Ampayon in collaboration with the office of Senator Bong Go, DSWD & other government agencies through the help of Rotarian Jovi Cinco.

35 fire victim families had been given the donations. One of the fire victims was a cleft-palate patient, Nenita Castro, a widow with 3 children whose main source of income was only from selling vegetables in the local market. Acknowledging the how particularly marginalized this individual was, the members of RCCB have pledged to take charge in rebuilding her family's home.
