



## HSTORY

## of the Rotary Club of Central Butuan

Our existence as a new club is rather swift but long in preparation, expeditious but not impulsive. We loosely met somewhere in June 2010 as old fellas trying to rekindle the flames of camaraderie and bonding. Like old shoes that fit easily, we jelled well and got serious in our intention of putting up a club in the months that followed.

We submitted our documents for application in Mid-October of 2010 and then paid our registration fees on the 5th of November 2010. While waiting, at least for of our prospective members were asked at random by the Rotary International just to gauge whether we are able, willing, and ready to be recognized as a club.

On the 4th of December 2010, we learned that our club got the resounding approval effective 26th day of November 2010 by the Rotary International which made us jubilant and awed. In six months, we were hatched as a new club ready to take the challenge. Our existence likewise is sort of paradoxical. We are young but not neophytes. On the other hand, we are mature enough but not that old. We are simply as old as our fears before, and now we are young as our hopes.

Like the Phoenix, we have just risen from the ashes of our past and now we are born again. Like a seed that has fallen on the ground and died, we have now germinated and started to welcome the sun. Like the lyrics of the song rendered in a rephrased manner, we have just shed our leaves in winter only to make them grow back in spring. Like a ball, we have hit the bottom and now we are bouncing back again.

We may profound that just like a butterfly, we have metamorphosed and emerged from the cocoon as a new creation, and it dawned on us - as if during the 6th day of God's creation that we found ourselves complete in our complementation and it was very good.

We come a long way and we intend to continue via a brand new start, believing that we have promises to keep and miles to go in order for us to continue fulfilling our mission to the lest of our brethren. And continue we shall, considering that "They profit who serve best."

## ROTARY INTERNATIONAL PRESIDENT

Jennifer E. Jones, a member of the Rotary Club of Windsor Roseland, Ontario, Canada, has been nominated to become Rotary's International president for 2022-23, a groundbreaking selection that will make her the first woman to hold that office in the organization's 115-year history.

Jones will officially become president-nominee in October if no other candidates challenge her.

Jones says she sees Rotary's Action Plan as a catalyst for increasing Rotary's impact.

"As we reflect upon our new strategic priorities, we could have never envisioned that our ability to adapt would become our North Star during what is inarguably the most profound time in recent history," Jones said in her vision statement. "Silver linings rise out of the most challenging circumstances. Using metric-driven goals, I will harness that historic landscape to innovate, educate, and communicate opportunities that reflect today's reality."

As the first woman to be nominated to be president, Jones understands how important it is to follow through on Rotary's Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) statement. I believe that diversity, equity and inclusion...begins at the top and for us to realize growth in female membership and members under the age of forty - these demographics need to see their own reflection in leadership, " Jones said. "I will champion double-digit growth in both categories while never losing sight of our entire family."

Jones is founder and president of Media Street Productions Inc., an award-winning media company in Windsor. She was chair of the board of governors of the University of Windsor-Essex Regional Chamber of Commerce. She has been recognized for her service with the YMCA Peace Medallion, the Queen's Diamond Jubilee Medal, and Wayne State University's Peacemaker of the Year Award, a first for a Canadian.



Jones holds a Doctor of Laws (LL.D.) degree.

A current Rotary Foundation trustee, Jones has been a Rotary member since 1997 and has served Rotary as RI Vice President, director, training leader, committee chair, moderator, and district governor. She played a lead role in Rotary's rebranding effort by serving as chair of the Strengthening Rotary's Advisory Group. She is the co-chair of the End Polio Now Countdown to History Campaign Committee, which aims to raise \$150 million for polio eradication efforts

Jones recently led the successful #RotaryResponds telethon which raised critical funds for Covid-19 relief and was viewed by more than 65,000. Jones has also received Rotary International's Service Above Self Award and the Rotary Foundation Citation for Meritorious Service. She and her husband, Nick Krayacich, are members of the Rotary Foundation's Arch Klump Society, Paul Harris Society, and the Bequest Society.

Lilo is an educator, an entrepreneur, and a Chamber advocate. But her enduring passion is service work in Rotary.

Lilo has been teaching at her alma mater, St. Theresa's College-Cebu where she graduated with a degree in Mass Communications. She has been teaching under the Masscom and Business programs since 1983. She is presently a board member of the STC Foundation.

She has over 35 years experience in Marketing Communication and is presently the managing director of lilo Advertising and Marketing Solutions, Inc.

Lilo has served the Cebu Chamber of Commerce and Industry for over 10 years; she was appointed as Cebu Business Month Chair and Adviser in 2018-2019, Vice-President for External Affairs in 2020-2021, and currently, as Trustee where she advocates for ease of doing business and to elevate the creative industry as another economic driver for Cebu.

She is affiliated with the Philippine Marketing Association as Past President, Philippine Retailers Association as convenor for the Outstanding Filipino Retailer (Cebu), and Cebu International Film Festival as Past President and current Board Member.

Lilo is a proud member of Rotary Club of Cebu Gloria Maris since 2004. She was awarded as the most outstanding President of District 3860 in RY 2008-2009. She has served Rotary International as Assistant Public Image Chair in 2013-2015 for Zone 7A covering the Philippines and Indonesia. Lilo has served District 3860 in different positions since 2007. Currently, Lilo is the District Rotary Foundation Committee Chair serving 3 years until RY 2021-2022. Lilo will serve as District Governor in RY 2022-2023.

## Valedictory Speech

Life-Changing President RY 2021-2022



Fellow Rotarians, dignitaries and guest, it is my honor to report to you our accomplishments and service projects for the life changing year 2021-2022.

We were able to Achieve 6% increase in Membership Growth, 100% per Capita and Every Rotarian Every Year, End Polio Now TRF Goal achiever, Polio Fund Giving Club, 100% Membership Participation, 100% Sustaining Paul Harris Club, 2 Sustaining Major Donors; 3 Paul Harris Society Members; and I was able to donate also 1,000 USD to make us 4 Paul Harris Society Members; 13 Multiple Paul Harris Fellows; 1 new Paul Harris Fellow, 33 service projects conducted. For our Annual Fund contributions, our goal is 3,500 USD but our achievement is 5,415 USD as of July 04, 2022. For Polio Fund Contributions, our goal is 1,500 USD and we attained 3,764 USD as of July 04, 2022.

And on this year, we were able to charter a new club which is ROTARY CLUB OF CENTRAL SAN FRANCISCO which made us 100 Rotary Clubs in the Roster. In addition, we applied a District Grant and was approved in the amount of ONE HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND PESOS (150,000.00), the first big project of our club and hopefully more are coming, the project is a study Park at San Vicente National High School, and it is ongoing.

I would like to thank our to be inducted Rotarian Jame Hermosada for heading the construction. WALA PA GANI NA INDUCT NAGSERBISYO NA. My salute to you, Sir. I believed this project could benefit the students, teachers and parents as well.

The times also tested us, comes the Typhoon Odette. All clubs of District 3860 including our club responded the call of service of the affected families and not only Rotary Club of Central Butuan in collaboration with LGU, DHSUD, TEDSA, and friends of Rotary constructed a Rotary Village, 4 were completely built. Unfortunately, it was not yet turned-over due to political issues. So, this is one of my pabaon to you incoming Pres. Anthony Madayag.

For our Service Projects, we have implemented 33 and conducted 35 lively regular meetings.

Among the 33-service project two of which, I considered as a project that changed lives. One is "BAG-ONG BALAY, BAG-ONG PAGLAUM". When a disastrous fire happened in Brgy. Ampayon in July 2021, we identified a family with most special needs. Their breadwinner a single mother, with a cleft palate disability, works day and night selling only vegetables to provide for her 3 children. With our project "BAG-ONG BALAY, BAG-ONG PAGLAUM" our club had provided a full-pledged stable, house to provide her family not only a new shelter, but also a new hopeful beginning of their new life.

Another project worth-sharing was for AHON COMMUNITY CARE CENTER. The care center had been struggling on the sustenance of the 23 children at their custody. Selling of baked goods is their prospective business, but they were massively lacking the raw materials. With our collective Rotarian effort to provide the startup for their business, we have given these children a learning opportunity for new skills, and moreover, a sustainable and systemic solution for their means of living.
